TOM MILANOV OF WARREN MOTT HIGH SCHOOL NAMED DETROIT LIONS/FARM BUREAU INSURANCE OF MICHIGAN HIGH SCHOOL FOOTBALL COACH OF THE WEEK FOR WEEK #6

Farm Bureau Insurance of Michigan to Present Detroit Lions High School Football Coach of the Week Program in 2016

Detroit, MI—The Detroit Lions have named Tom Milanov of Warren Mott High School the week six recipient of the 2016 Farm Bureau Insurance of Michigan High School Football Coach of the Week Program.

Milanov led his Marauders to a 40-6 victory over Fraser to run their record to 6-0 on the season and clinch a berth in the 2016 Michigan High School Football playoffs, their 11th playoff appearance in school history. Currently in his 20th year in coaching and 17th season as the head coach at Warren Mott, Milanov has a career record of 89-74. Warren Mott is ranked No. 6 in Division 1 and host the defending Division 1 state champion Romeo Bulldogs on Friday, October 7 in a Macomb Area Conference-Red Division battle.

Regarding player health & safety, the Mott Athletic Department works with St. John Health System, who provides IMPACT (Immediate Post-Concussion Assessment and Cognitive Testing) testing for Mott student-athletes. IMPACT testing is provided for student-athletes of contact sports such as football, hockey, lacrosse, soccer, and cheerleading. Mott also employs a full-time certified athletic trainer to provide preventative services, emergency care, therapeutic intervention and rehabilitation of injuries.

High School Football Coach of the Week Program

Each week throughout the 2016 nine-week high school football regular season, one coach that best develops his players' character, discipline, and football skill in addition to emphasizing player health and safety in their program, will be recognized for his commitment to the team, school, and community. The winner is selected by a panel of high school football media members—**Mick McCabe (Detroit Free Press)**, **Hugh Bernreuter (Saginaw News)**, **Bret Bakita (WOOD Radio-106.9 FM, ESPN 96.1 FM-Fox 17/Grand Rapids)**, and **James Cook (Traverse City Record-Eagle)**.

This season's program will award \$22,000 to aid in the development and promotion of high school football in the state of Michigan, thanks to contributions from the Detroit Lions, the NFL Foundation and presenting partner, Farm Bureau Insurance of Michigan.



Each winning coach during the regular season will receive a \$2,000 donation to his school's football program. At the conclusion of the 2016 Michigan High School Football season, the Lions will also select the High School Football Coach of the Year. This season's Coach of the Year will receive a \$4,000 donation to his school's football program. All winners will receive a certificate signed by Lions' head coach **Jim Caldwell** and National Football League (NFL) commissioner **Roger Goodell**, a personalized game ball as well as acknowledgement at an upcoming Lions home game.

Currently in its' 20th year, the Detroit Lions High School Coach of the Week program has awarded \$367,000 to high school football programs throughout the state of Michigan.
