Second Annual Clinic Slated For January 25-26

The Michigan High School Football Coaches Association's Second Annual Clinic will be January 25 and 26, 1974 at Portage Northern High School in Kalamazoo. The first clinic in 1973 was a huge success with over 800 coaches in attendance. It is hoped the second clinic in 1974 will be even larger.

Clinic Director Jeff Smith of East
Lansing reported the highlights of the
1974 clinic. Again the agenda of
speakers will be primarily composed
of High School coaches. Many of these
speakers are drawn from the ranks of
the "Regional Coaches of The Year."
The feeling is that high school coaches
tend to present material more

All the "Regional Coach of The Year" winners will be awarded beautiful framed foil certificates before noon at an awards ceremony on Saturday. The Class A, B, C, and D State "Coaches Of The Year" will be honored and awarded their trophies at the Saturday noon luncheon. Free luncheon tickets are given to the first 500 clinic registrants.

Pre-registration is \$6.00 which entitles one to the clinic sessions, with the first one starting at 6:30 - 10:15 p.m. on Friday, January 25. At the door registration will be \$8.00. There will be door prizes and a free hospitality and snack session Friday night.

A general business meeting will be held where several constitutional amendments will be presented and voted on.

There will be an election of Directors and a Second Vice-President.

The last clinic session will end at 3:30 p.m. Saturday afternoon. Some of you may be concerned with the gas stations closing at 9:00 p.m. Saturday. Vice-President, Directors To Be Elected

There will be an election held at the Second Annual Michigan High School Football Coaches Associations' Football Clinic, January 25 and 26, 1974. The association will be electing a Vice-President and Regional Directors. Dave Driscoll of Jackson Parkside High has served as the MHSFCA President for 2 years. The normal term of office is one year. President Driscoll served a second term, as did the rest of the Executive Board, by a Board of Directors amendment. The MHSFCA was only one year old and it was felt the association should continue for a second year with the same executive leadership to insure the progress and successful development of the association.

A Second Vice-President will be elected from the eastern half of the state. M-127 divides the eastern and western half of the state. The 1st Vice-President Dutch Schrotenboer of Alpena High School will move up to President of the Michigan High

Business Meeting Notes

(1) The next Board of Directors meeting will be January 25, 1974 at 4:00 p.m.

(2) Ken Foust of Albion was named MHSFCA Chaplin by President Driscoll.

(3) This issue of Newsletter is only being sent to MHSFCA members.

(4) Look for MHSFCA clinic flyers around December 10 and January 9, 1974.

(5) The Finance Committee reports that all committees are staying within their budgets.

(6) The MHSFCA has received approval for a bulk rate postal stamp — reducing mailing cost by about one half. School Football Coaches Association as of January 26, 1974. Bud Breed of Portage Northern High School who is presently the Second Vice-President will become the First Vice President. Thus, the office of Second Vice-President will be open.

Nominations will be offered by the Nominating Committee and from the floor at the Annual Clinic General Meeting. In order to be eligible for election to an executive office the candidate must have served one year as a director.

There will also be an election of Regional Directors at the MHSFCA Clinic January 1974 from the even numbered regions 2, 4, 6, 8, etc. The MHSFCA regions are the same as

MEA regions.

Each region has a Director and one Alternate Director. Both positions are open in the coming election. The candidate receiving the highest number of votes in each region becomes the Director. The candidate receiving the 2nd highest number of votes becomes the Alternate Director.

If you are interested in running for office, you must submit your name and region to Secretary Steve Sonog of Jackson High School by January 1, 1974 so your name can be placed or the ballot.

The Coach Of The Year

The Michigan High School Football Coaches Associations Board of Directors elected the Coach of the Year for the 4 classes of Michigan High Schools. In early November the regional directors sent out ballots for an election of Regional Coaches of the Year. On November 30, 1973 the MHSFCA Regional Directors met in

The career credentials of the Regional Coach Of The Year winners were presented to determine the State "Coaches Of The Year" for each class A, B, C, & D. The balloting resulted in some very close races, as all classes had several very impressive coaches represented. Nevertheless, when the final ballots were counted the winners were Class A George Ihler, Saginaw Arthur Hill; Class B -Striedl, Plainwell; Class C — John Srholec, Onaway; Class D — Tom Seroczynski, North Muskegon.

George Ihler, of Saginaw Arthur Hill coached the Saginaw Valley Champions to a 9-0 record. Arthur Hill accomplished a feat unprecedented in Michigan Class A High School Football by going undefeated and unscored on. (ARTHUR HILL — 443 OPPONENTS - 0.) George has been a head coach 6 years, 3 at Owosso, 3 at Arthur Hill. In 6 years, George has had 4 championships. His record is 41-

Jack Streidl, Plainwell, champion of the Wolverine Conference with a 9-0 record. Plainwell was also the League Champions in 1972 and Co-Champions in 1971. Jack has been Head Coach at Plainwell for 27 years. His total record — he doesn't know he hasn't kept track. But, we know it has been good. Jack is a true example of a High School Football Coach being most interested in the students. It's said players, past and present, enter and leave his home like Grand Central Station.

CLASS C John Srholec's Onaway team won the Northern Lower Michigan Conference with a 9-0 record. A school which has been a football doormat for its near 50 years, John has made a winner. Before John came to Onaway three years ago, it had won three games in seven years and had never won a conference championship. Srholec's

record is 50-21-3. CLASS D

Seroczynski of North Tom Muskegon was Champion of the West Michigan Conference with a 9-0 record. Every School played by North Muskegon was larger. A class D team, they beat two class B teams and I class C team. Tom has coached 5 All State Quarterbacks and won two Championships. North Muskegon has been ranked in the top six, eight of the last 9 years, Tom's record is 71-10.

Rules Report

The MHSFCA has prepared some recommendations to be presented to the MHSAA.

(1) That a member of the MHSFCA Rules Committee be a member of the MHSAA Rules Committee.

(2) That members of the State Rules Committee be on the committee for 2 years, as the first year is a learning year then the member is out and the continuity and follow through is lost.

(3) That the MHSAA recommend officials to use a penalty summary form containing the kind of penalties called, the number of the player the penalty was on, and the official who called the penalty.

Look for another rules questionnaire in the February issue of Newsletter. The return of questionnaires from the August Newsletter was not very responsive.
