NAMED MHSFCA "COACHES OF THE YEAR"

At the November 30 meeting of the MHSFCA Board of Directors, the "Coaches of the Year" were selected for Classes A, B, C, and D. Every fall each head football coach in the state is sent a ballot where he may vote for four coaches in the region and class. Four coaches are selected from each class and in each of the four regions. The Board of Directors then select a "State Coach of the Year" from the sixteen "Regional Coaches". The four selected this year are:

Class A — Jim Ooley (Traverse City)
Jim is one of the most respected
coaches in the state of Michigan and
his won-lost record of 87-22-3 speaks
for itself. He has been at Traverse City
for the last 25 years serving the last 14
years as head coach. His team have
won league championships in 67, 68,
69, 72, 75, 77, and 78, and most of the
time his teams are ranked in the Top 10
in the Class A ratings. Jim has a
Bachelor's and a Master's Degree from
the University of Wisconsin at Stout

where he was also an outstanding football player. He has been named a Regional Coach of the Year six times and Jim is respected throughout the state for the outstanding job that he has done with the football program at Traverse City High School.

Class B — Dennis Zbozen (Warren Woods). For the last two years Warren Woods has dominated the Warren Conference and much of this is due to the fine coaching of Dennis Zbozen. Last year his team was 10-1 and this past fall Warren Woods was 12-0 winning the "State Championship" in Class B. His overall record as a head coach is 28-11 and he has been named a Regional Coach for the last two years. Dennis graduated from Hillsdale College and has his Master's Degree from Eastern Michigan University.

Class C — John Blackstock (Bad Axe). John Blackstock has just retired as the head football coach at Bad Axe High School and his 1978 team posted a 11-1 record losing in the state finals.

His overall record for 12 years as a head coach is a very creditable 73-35-1. John graduated from Central Michigan with a Bachelor's and Master's Degree and he has been the Secretary-Treasurer for the MHSFCA for the last three years. His 1978 football team was ranked number two in the AP, UPI, Detroit News, and Detroit Free Press.

Class D — Ron Thompson (DePorres)
DePorres has always been noted as a
basketball power and through the
efforts of Ron Thompson they are now
known as a football power. Most of
their opponents throughout the year
have been Class A and B opponents
and they posted an outstanding 11-1
record this year winning the Class D
Championship. Coach Thompson has
an overall 25-12-1 record in the 4 years
that he has been the head coach and he
has coached teams to league championship and one state title in the eight
years that he has coached.

COMMENTS FROM WINNING COACHES

The four coaches whose teams won state championships in the fall of 1978 were contacted and asked to give their response to winning a state title. Coaches Ooley and Zbozen responded to the request.

Coach Jim Ooley — Traverse City, Class A State Champs

"Our total experience with the 1978 playoffs was fabulous. After losing our fourth game 15-12 to Muskegon Catholic there was not much talk of the playoffs. We played each game at a time and wow...a state championship.

The thrill of being in the playoffs was only topped by being able to win 3 games against the best teams in the state. I only wish that each team and coach could feel the joy of the playoffs. When our team entered the dome to wait our turn, our fans and band stood up and cheered...it was enough to run a chill up my spine.

When we got home that evening there was a 1000 car motorcade that followed us into town for the last 20 miles. It was about 11:00 p.m. and people were lined up along our route. One elderly lady was in a wheel chair waving a sparkler. There was a pep

rally in the gym at midnight with over 3000 people.

Like I said, it really was an unbelievable experience. Thank God for giving us the opportunity."

Coach Dennis Zbozen — Warren Woods, Class B State Champs

"Winning the state championship is really a dream. Many of us at Warren Woods still can't believe it. I think it's something you think about but having it actually happen is unbelievable. When the season began there was talk amongst the players about getting to the Silverdome. I really feel that the players had it in their minds that they could go all the way. As the season progressed their confidence also grew. Being in the playoffs in 1977 also helped us this year.

The support of the administrators, faculty, and student body was fantastic. The excitement of the 1977 playoffs grew as the season progressed. As we entered the 1978 playoffs our school enthusiasm was at an all time high. The school was decorated from the floor to the ceiling. The cheerleaders were the leaders of keeping the student

body at a frenzied pitch. The week of the finals the whole community was 10 feet off the ground. All the billboards in town wished us well. We had signs all along I-75 toward the Silverdome encouraging us. Then the big house... 20,000 people, bands playing, people cheering, and us on the field. What excitement!

Since our overtime victory was over a very good Grand Rapids team we have not touched ground yet. Our community and school are still reaping the benefits of the championship. The local newspaper honored our team at a county banquet as did the booster club. Our state representatives took the team out to lunch. Letters and well wishes are still coming in congratulating the team. Our local government is planning to dub the high school street as Warren Woods Boulevard. Signs will be posted at the city limits honoring our state championship. I think we wake up every morning wondering if the dream is over.

It is truly a great experience having participated in a state championship game...having been fortunate to win is the ultimate. I only wish all of those involved in high school athletics could experience the same thrill as we have!"
