

RON HOLLAND WINS "JIM CROWLEY AWARD"



RON HOLLAND North Farmington Past President

The winner of the "Jim Crowley Award" for the 1982-83 school year is Ron Holland of North Farmington High School. Ron is one of the most respected coaches in the state of Michigan and he has been a head coach for 24 years with the last 21 years at N. Farmington. His coaching record is an impressive 153 wins, 61 losses. His teams have won 7 league titles and in 1978, he coached the state finalists. He has been selected as the Detroit News Coach of The Year in 1970 and 78. Ron is also the head track coach at N. Farmington.

Ron has promoted the FCA at his high school and he is very active with the Goodfellows in his community. He has always been known as a very dedicated coach who has worked very hard to help his football players. Ron has been very active in the MHSFCA service as a Director, Public Relations Chairman, and President in 1976. Our Association made great advances while Ron was President and he has worked many hours to establish the MHSFCA Hall of Fame at the University of Michigan. Without Ron's diligent work, we would not have the Hall of Fame as it is today.

Without a doubt Ron is one of the most respected men to ever coach high school football in the state of Michigan. He has done so much for our Association in its 10 year existence and we are very thankful for having a man of his quality as a leader of the MHSFCA.

Ron is a most worthy person to receive the "Jim Crowley Award" and we congratulate him for this tremendous honor.

MHSFCA COACHES OF THE YEAR

CLASS D - ROGER SMITH

Roger Smith of Mendon High School led his team to a perfect 12-0 season in '82. Rog has been a head coach for 3 years and his overall record is a very respectful 26-2-1. Besides coaching football, he is also the basketball coach and he has been the guiding force in leading Mendon to the top of the Class D ratings.

CLASS A - JOHN HERRINGTON

John Herrington of Farmington Harrison H. S. is one of the most successful coaches in Michigan playoff history. In 1981, he guided his forces to a Class B State Championship with a 6-0 upset win over Muskegon C. C. and in 1982, his team won an impressive championship game over a very good Dearborn Fordson team. John's 13 year coaching record is an outstanding 93-21-1 and he is regarded as one of the finest gentlemen to ever coach. His number one fan is his wife Fran who is the leader of the Hawk cheering section.

CLASS C - BILL MASKILL

The winningest coach in the state of Michigan at the present time is Bill Maskill of Galesburg-Augusta. Bill has been coaching for 33 years and his teams won 216 games. Only 3 coaches in Michigan high school history have won over 200 games and Bill is one of the three. He has won 4 State Championships in '62, '66, '67, and '70, and his teams have participated in State Playoffs in '67 and '70. Bill is a graduate of M.S.U. and he has been selected to coach in the 1983 All Star Football Game.

CLASS B - PETE KUTCHES

If you watched the Class B State Championship, you saw one of the finest Class B teams of all time coached by Pete Kutches of Muskegon C. C. Pete was an assistant coach for 21 years and for the last 3 years he has led the Crusaders to a phenominal 32-2 record. His '82 team was ranked #1 by the AP, Detroit News, and Detroit Free Press. Pete has also coached basketball and baseball, and he has his B.S.Degree from the University of Wyoming and a M.S. from the University of Michigan.
