

20th Anniversary Honors Founding Fathers

at Coaches Hall of Fame Banquet

Past President of the MHSFCA, Tom Fagan, has chaired the Hall of Fame Committee and put on the Hall of Fame Banquet since its humble beginings in 1982.

The original Board of Directors (Founding Fathers), responsible for the formation of our association will be honored at the Hall of Fame Banquet on April 4, 1992 at Crisler Arena. The founders were informally inducted into the Hall of Fame in a brief ceremony during Michigan's Football Clinic in 1982. The next year, a formal banquet was initiated with Bo Schembechler and Woody Hayes as the first speakers. In following years, speakers have included: Ara Parsegian, Duffy Daugherty, Bud Wilkenson, Don Canham, Alex Agase, George Perles and Jerry Hanlon. This year our featured speaker will be Gary Moeller, head coach of the Rose Bowl bound Wolverines.

The banquet has been a huge success since its inception and has grown into one of the main functions of our association. Each year we induct 25-30 coaches and have inducted 221 of the most outstanding high school football coaches in Michigan to date. Many of the coaches have stated that this is not only the highlight of their coaching career, but the highlight of their life as well.

Tenth Anniversary of Hall of Fame Banquet also a Grand Reunion for Hall of Famers



American Football — Guernsey Style

In March of 1990, I received a letter postmarked Guernsey, England. The letter was of an inquisitive nature requesting how much I would charge to go to England and coach football. I responded stating that if my expenses were covered, I would be happy to make the trip. Upon receiving my letter, the team called, and

the trip was on. How they came upon my name is somewhat of a mystery. The player that made the initial contact was later in a motorcycle accident, hospitalized, and unavailable. The rest of the players were unsure as to how it all came about. Guernsey, is a member of the Channel Islands, located about 20 miles off the coast of France. After landing in London we again took a commuter plane to the island. We were met by members of the team and taken to a wonderful home that was being cared for by one of the players. We used this home as our own for the next ten days. The Guernsey Gladiators were entering their 4th year of organized football. They are among 150 teams throughout England. According to ability, these teams are placed in one of four brackets. Guernseys placement was one step up from the bottom. They had a roster of 30 players, 15-18 of which might show up at their practices. Players, aged from 18-40 years old. They play games once every 2-3 weeks, and practice twice a week. The season begins in March and the playoffs end in August. These people love to play the game. Most, however, do not make a commitment between games. It is purely recreational. They are very knowledgeable of the NFL and major college teams. The London Monarchs have bonded the football enthusiasm in the country. They love being recognized as "American Football" players. As you know football in England is soccer, but 'American Football" is the game they want to be associated with. Contrary to here, in England "American Football" is pushing soccer off the fields in many areas.

The players on Guernsey have to make more of a financial commitment than those of the other teams in England. An away game may cost as much as \$2,500. Their very location dictates that they must take a ferry 70 miles across the English Channel to

play away games. Imagine having to plan this scenario: Get on the ferry at

This presents an interesting scenario prior to the coin flip. Kick or receive? Is the sun a factor? Wind direction? Uphill or downhill?

4:00 p.m. on Saturday. Arrival at 6:00 am on Sunday. Get on a charted bus and find a place to eat. Drive two hours to your game location. Kick-off at 11:00 am. Play your game, reverse the process, and return to Guernsey at 6:00 am Monday morning. Just in time to go to work. Even though it's unusual to play two games in a row, I made this trip twice with the team. It was very tiring to me, but the team seemed to adjust easily. These players obviously love to play the game to make this kind of commitment.

Some of the hurdles these teams must face include having to pay \$300 for a helmet, or pair of shoulder pads. To us, this is ridiculous, but it boils down to supply and demand It's expensive, but they pay it because they want to play.

There were terminology differences that I had to adjust to. A, guard" is a mouthguard. A "kit" is a bag of football equipment And "the pitch", is where the game was played. I assume this comes from the term "Pitched battle".

I had a new experience on an away game at Eastleigh. The playing field was on a slope. This presents an interesting scenario prior to the coin flip. Kick or receive? Is the sun a factor? Wind direction? Uphill or downhill?

Early in the game at Eastleigh, I found out that the officials were U.S. Air Force personnel. Being prior Air Force, I though this was great. I ran to my bag, pulled out my Air Force Academy sweatshirt, and strutted about in hopes of getting some favorable calls. I was flagged twice for going on the field during time-outs (illegal in England), and we lost 14-6. Obviously, they were enlisted men.

The trip was not only exciting, but very educational for me. The people were wonderful. Even though I was lucky to go, I feel good knowing that I helped in a little way to promote the growth of "American Football".
