

Ethics Committee Activities

The 1993 football season is now complete. The list of possible ethics violations submitted to the committee was very small. Presently

(Dec 3), the association is looking into a report of illegal filming of a

regular season game.

The majority of conversations held by committee members with coaches from across the state involved violations of the "7 - man rule" and coaches not being able to coach at summer passing camps. This subject is cur-

rently on the May agenda of the MHSAA's Representative Council. Many of our football concerns will be addressed with the passage of these proposals.

About the Seven Man Limitation.

In response to a letter from Pete Coll, MHSFCA Rules Committee Chair, Mr. Jack Roberts, Executive Director MHSAA had this to say:

"It is our (MHSAA) interpretation that the seven-player limitation precludes the possibility of a coach attending a football camp with more than seven students in grades 7 through 12 in a school where he coaches. Just as it is a violation during the school year for a basketball coach to work with three players at one end of the court while a fourth or fifth player is engaged at the other end of the court, it is a violation during the summer for a football coach to work with seven players at one end of a field while an eighth or ninth student is at the other end. A violation occurs whenever the campers are collected in one place for demonstration clinics."

Experience teaches that it is virtually impossible to avoid violations in the summer camp setting if more than seven students attend a camp where their coach is in attendance in a coaching capacity."

MHSAA Director, Mr. Jack Roberts, spent a good share of the afternoon at the Fall Meeting of the MHSFCA Board of Directors explaining the "Out-of-Season Competition" proposals, excerpts of which appear below.

REMEMBER THESE PROPOSALS ARE NOT IN FINAL FORM!

They are to be revised before presentation to the Representative Council of the MHSAA.

Proposals Hold Potential for Long Sought Equality

Proposal A That the "3 player rule" limiting coaches to working with 3 students in grades 7-12 outside the MHSAA season during the school year, be in effect on August 1 be adopted in May, 1994 and take effect on August 1, 1995.


Proposal B That the number of days of competition during the summer for players and their coaches (when the number of players involved is more than 3 or 50% of the team) be limited to 15 days of organized competition be adopted in May, 1994 and take effect with the summer of 1995.

*Note: This would allow coaches to actively coach in 7-on-7 passing leagues for up to 15 days in the summer prior to August 1.

Proposal C

That if A and B are adopted, then Proposal C also be adopted in May, 1994, to take effect immediately. Proposal C: That football coaches be allowed to participate in bona fide summer football skills camps where more than 7 students from their school district in grades 7-12 are participating, but that they may not work with more than 7 from their district at any one time. ("Bona fide camps would be sponsored by institutions or business enterprises, including: colleges, individual schools or intermediate school districts, community school programs, etc. The camps must be open to students from any school district, and would be subject to equipment limitations of shoes and helmets.")

*Note: The contacts that would occur at individual football skills camps would not count toward the limit of 15 days, even if there were 7 or more students from the same school in attendance.

Important Meeting for Coaches of '94 All Star Players
