"Wildcat Den" a safe haven for learning

im Lamb probably never stood taller than when he entered the "Wildcat Den."

The Wildcat Den is a reading program that Mattawan football coach Dave Lawrence instituted a few years ago, and it has turned out to be one of his best play calls as the Wildcats' coach.

Players like Lamb read to student at Mattawan's Early Elementary School on each Friday of the fall football campaign. The players wear their game jerseys, and visit six or eight classrooms in the afternoon.

"When I first heard about it I thought it was a really neat program," Lawrence said. "The Wildcat Den has been hugely successful here, and it's a real treat for the younger kids."

"And it's like a community service for the players. It's an opportunity for them to give of themselves, and the young kids really appreciate it."

Lamb, a Wildcat wide receiver, read "Curious George Goes to the Costume Party" to Tracy Cobb's first-grade class.

"It's fun for us, and it's fun for them, too, because they look up to us," said Lamb, wearing his number 84 jersey. "It's the first time they really get to be close to us. Usually they're just watching from the stands, so they get to know us."

Facing a classroom-full of 5-year-olds can cause some jitters and a desert dry

Clinic Survey: Spring Football Practice

From Jim Ahern, Ithaca

Would you be interested in having five days for spring football practice?

Many states allow their high school teams to practice in the spring... some as long as 20 days. The way that it could be done would be to move the start date for spring sports to the first week in April. (Many of the spring sports in early April have to cancel events because of weather and reschedule them in May as it is today.) With the start of spring sports in May, practice couldn't start until the second week of April. This would leave the first week of April open for spring football practice. This would be a non-contact practice with helmets only. The weather wouldn't always be that great, but it would give you a chance to experiment with new things that you want to put in for the upcoming year, and have a chance to see what the underclassmen can do.

Talk it over with your staff and see how everyone feels about the idea. There will be a chance to vote on the idea at the clinic in Battle Creek on whether you favor the idea or not.

Clinic Survey: Football Playoff - Proposal 16

Proposal 16 would: Expand the playoffs to 16 qualifying teams per Region by adding a fourteam, two-game District competition. The two additional dates would derive from elimination of the second pre-season scrimmage and dropping the 9th game of the regular season. Districts would be paired geographically, creating local interest and minimal travel. Schools not qualifying for the playoffs would have the option of scheduling a 9th date with another non-qualifier.

The Divisions:

 Divide the top 480 schools by enrollment into 6 equal Divisions (I-VI) of 80 schools. Divide each Division into 4 equal Regions of 20 schools. Divide each Region into 4 Districts of 5 schools each. The top FOUR schools in each District make the playoffs.

2. Divide the remaining 137 schools into 2 Divisions. Division VII would have Regions of 17, 17, 17 & 18 schools and Division VIII would have 17 schools in each region. Divide each Division into 4 equal Regions of 20 schools. Divide each Region into 4 Districts of 5 schools each. The top FOUR schools in each District make the playoffs.

Revamp Points: For defeating a Division I: 88, Div II: 80, Div III: 72, Div IV: 64, Div V: 56, Div VI: 48, Div VII: 40, Div VIII: 32. The bonus point system for wins and ties would remain the same.

1997 Academic All State Players – 1st Team

he Academic All State Committee Takes Great Pride in Announcing the Twelfth MHSFCA Academic All State Football Team.

Of the 36 students selected to the 1997 team, 26 are ranked first in their class and two are ranked number two. 22 of the 36 had a four point or better, and 11 had grade points between 3.99 and 3.966. The 36 first team members also mastered the ACT: one scored a 34, three scored 33, two 33, four scored 32, ten scored 31, three scored 30. ten scored 29 and five scored 28. 1997 Academic All State Teams

n the third naming of Academic All State *Teams* there were 165 nominations, up from 126 in 1996. Nominations came from: 30 AA teams (23 in '96), 28 A teams (27 in '96), 28 BB teams (16 in '96), 20 B teams (15 in '96), 24 CC teams (15 in '96), 18 C teams (17 in '96), 9 DD teams (6 in '96) and 8 D teams (7 in '96). 36 (30 in '96) of the 165 nominated teams averaged between 4.0 and 3.7. 67 (48 in '96) teams averaged between 3.69 and 3.5.

Selection of All Star Players

Forty Four (44) players will be selected for each team.

On each team there will be 8 players from Class A schools, 6 players from Class B, 4 from Class C, 2 from Class D, and 20 players selected at large.

Two platoon football will be played.

4. A player can play a different position than he was selected to play. The coaching staff may switch players to different positions and they may also switch players from offense to defense and vice-versa!

5. No player may play both ways, but a player can be used on offense and then used on defense. The player must sit out the next series of downs if this switch has been made. You may need to use players on specialty teams and in short yardage situations.

6. Every player must play at least HALF of the game with the exception of the kickers. It is the responsibility of the coaching staffs to see that every player plays one half of the game. Remember, all of these players are All Stars and the game is for the players, not the coaches.

 The selection for the Offense will be as follows: (2 centers, 3 guards, 3 tackles, 2 tight ends, 3 wide receivers, 2 quarterbacks, 2 fullbacks, 2 halfbacks, 1 punter, & 1 place kicker).

 The selection for the Defense will be as follows: (3 ends, 5 down linemen, 3 linebackers, & 6 defensive backs)

 The coaching staff may select six players at large to complete their teams. The six players selected may be picked at random from the All Star nominations in order to fill out the positions as deemed necessary.
 Star nominations staff.

 No player will be selected to the All Star team if his coach is not a member of the MHSFCA.

 Only ONE player from a school may be selected to play in the All Star Game.

12. A coach who is an MHSFCA member may nominate HIS player(s) for the All Star Game. A coach from a Class A high school may nominate three of his players, two players may be nominated from a Class B high school, and one player from a Class C or D high school. All nominations must be made by December 1 and sent to: Mr. Larry Rueger, MHSFCA All Star Chairman, 227 W. Byron, Muskegon, MI 49441. The Nomination Form should include the following information: Player's name, address, telephone number, Parent's name, Coach's name, address, telephone number, name of school, school class, address, telephone number, county, player's height, weight, 40 time, best position, alternate position, and statistics.

13. The All Star Selection Committee will consist of (1) the six All Star Coaches, (2) the members of the All Star Committee, and (3) the MHSFCA Officers. The All Star Chairman may also select MHSFCA members from particular areas of the state to help with the voting to make sure that all areas of the state are well represented. The three above groups will select the first 38 players by positions by vote and the All Star Coaching Staffs will then complete their squads by select-

ing six players at random.

14. The Selection Committee will select twice the number of players as needed for each position. In case one of the 38 players decides not to play in the All Star Game, the next player at that position will be taken in order of the voting. In case any of the six players selected at large after the original thirty-eight selections declines to play, the coaching staff may select any player who was nominated to fill the open position.

15. The East & West All Star Teams will be selected on Saturday, January 10, 1998 at 9:30 a.m. There will be a meeting of both All Star Coaching Staffs starting at 9:00 a.m. on January 10, 1998 at Holden Hall on the

Michigan State Campus.

16. Each of the six All Star Coaches will be responsible for seven All Star players with the exception of two coaches on each staff who will have the responsibility for an extra player. This includes checking to see if (1) their players are going to participate, (2) they have all ads and program information into Larry Merx of Ann Arbor Huron High School, (3) they know when to report to M.S.U. and what to bring, and (4) for their supervision for the seven days a M.S.U. The Coaching Staffs are responsible for the supervision of the All Star Players from the time they report to M.S.U. until they leave after the All Star Game.

17. If a player does not show up for the All Star camp, the All Star Committee, after conferring with the Head Coach for the All Star Team, will make the decision as to which player will be called as a replacement.

18. If a player is injured and unable to play in the All Star Game after he has reported to the All Star practices, he will NOT be replaced.

 The All Star player must be a senior graduating in June and have not yet matriculated in college at that time.
