The Art of Sideline Tackling

Picture this: An opposing runner bursts off-tackle and breaks to your sideline. As you feel the lump on your throat swell, you suddenly see your All Conference safety closing on the ball carrier with his proper "inside-out" relationship. Warily looking away from the imminent collision; a great feeling of confidence envelopes you and subconsciously your mind switches to the defensive call for the upcoming 3rd and short play. You tingle with excitement anticipating the collision, when suddenly the ball carrier cuts back hard and your All Conference safety completes his "fly-by" You cringe and shift your thoughts in preparation for the upcoming kickoff.

This ugly defensive scenario mars football. We see it Friday night in person and then have to suffer through numerous replays of it in college and professional stadiums throughout the weekend, every weekend of the footballs season. Can it be stopped? No, but the frequency of this scene can be drastically cut with just a few minutes of practice each week. Coaches must understand that defensive success in this situation is minimal, therefore this drill must be approached with great patience. Your players will miss! However, with repetition they can be great "sideline" tacklers.

Split your players (usually DB's) into two groups and find an area with a sideline. Designate one group RB's and the other DB's. Have the RB's line up 10 - 12 yards upfield, splitting the difference between the sideline and the numbers. Place a cone on the numbers and have the DB's line up one yard downfield of it (Figure A). On the command, R runs downfield with the intention to cut-back or burst up the sideline. D must focus on and attack the inside hip of R always closing down the vertical distance between he and R and pushing him to the sideline (Figure B). At the point of contact we stress the "swing and lock" technique. Since DB's so often tackle in open space, rarely do they get a chance to drop their hips and explode. Through the use of the "swing and lock," we can guarantee some gather and explosion into R.

Some points of emphasis to players: 1.) never allow D to get "face-up" to R. In this situation, even a mediocre back has an advantage over a good DB. 2.) Stress the idea of closing vertically, as this cuts down the cut-back lane drastically and can result in a vicious tackle for the DB. 3.) Do not allow D to complete a total "break down," any time you stop your feet you will "lose the race." 4.) D must, at least, force R out of bounds, which against a speedy back is often the case (not a great tackle, but it sure beats the alternative). 5.) Your players will miss a majority of the time when beginning this drill. We emphasize that even the best college and professional DB's often fail in this situation, but the one or few times that we are successful will change the outcome of the game.

How important is sideline tackling, especially in an open field situation? It is often overlooked and many times dismissed as a poor or lucky tackle, however, if it is missed, the result is a prime spot on your opponent's highlight film. Remember, you can not do what you do not practice.

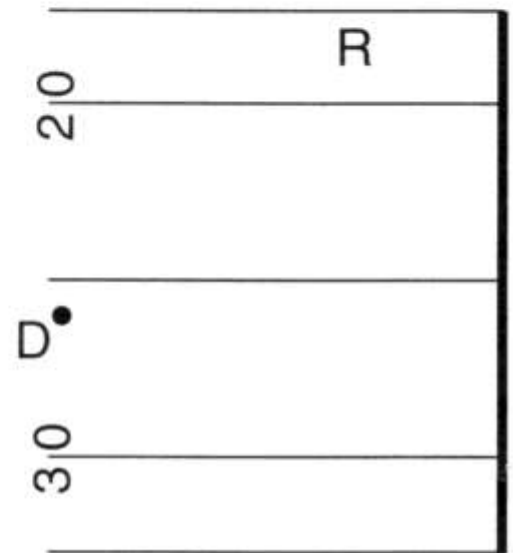
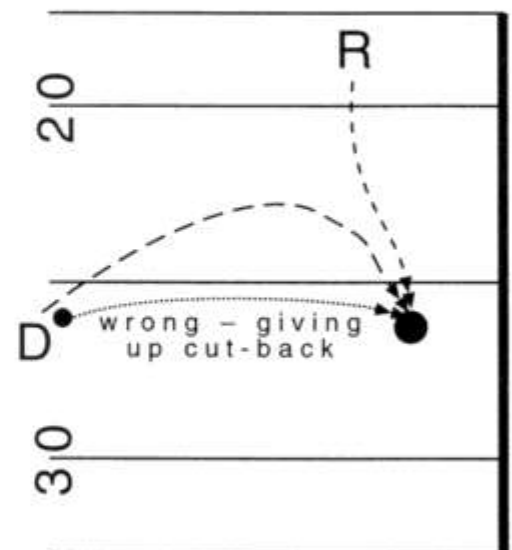

Detroit Lions & Bobby Ross CONTINUE COACH OF THE WEEK/YEAR PROGRAM

For the third consecutive season, the Detroit Lions and head coach Bobby Ross, in association with NFL Charities, presented the Detroit Lions High School Coach of the Week program. To conclude the 1999 Coach of the Week program, the Lions announced Don Durrett of Saginaw High School as this season's High School Coach of the Year.

Durrett and this year's Coach of the Week winners were hosted by the Lions at a brunch Sunday, December 5 and were honored during special half-time ceremonies of the Lions-Redskins Game.

Coach Durrett led his team to a 14-7 victory over Birmingham Brother Rice for the Division 2 State Championship. Durrett has been head coach since 1991 after coming to Saginaw in 1984 as an assistant. This was the fifth straight year that Saginaw has made the playoffs. When Durrett took over, there were only 13 young men in the program. Durrett is a graduate of Flint Northern and an alumnus of Albion College where he played football.

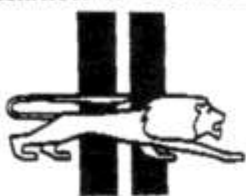
Coach Durrett will receive a \$6000 donation to his football program.

Each week throughout the regular season, one coach that the Lions deemed best developed his players' character, discipline and football skill was recognized for his commitment to the team, school and community. Each winning coach throughout the regular season received a \$500 donation to his school's football program. The

winner's were selected by a panel of three newspaper writers: Mick McCabe of the *Detroit Free Press*, Jane Boss of the *Grand Rapids Press* and Hugh Bernreuter of the *Saginaw News*.

This season's program awarded \$2,500 to aid the development and promotion of high school football, thanks to Coach Ross and the Lions. The Michigan High School Football Coaches Association will receive a \$5000 donation, with the remaining \$37,500 going to the actual winning programs.

In addition to the monetary award, all winners will receive a framed certificate signed by Lions' head coach Bobby Ross, National Football League Commissioner Paul Tagliabue, as well as former Detroit Lion and current NFL Director of Football Development, Gene Washington. Winning coaches also receive a personalized game ball, Detroit Lions "Coach of the Week" hat, and T-shirts for the entire team. Each winning coach is featured on "Lions Weekly," a television show dedicated to Lions football, which airs on Fox Sports Detroit.

Youth football will bring enthusiasm to your entire program.

The recent change in the football playoff system offers increased team participation resulting with a rise in local interest. The excitement may save some small programs by creating enough interest to keep the support and numbers up. It may even increase participation in larger programs. The fact of the matter is that at the end of the regular season, more communities are enthused about high school football than ever before. This is good, but if increased participation is a goal, then we must embellish the end of the football experience that will do the most good. The beginning!

Today's young athletes have more options for participation than ever before. Little league, AAU sports, independent soccer, hockey, tennis, skiing, gymnastics, golf, etc. Also, let us not forget capitalism and the owner of the local facility (hockey, soccer, tennis, etc.) begging for memberships so his own monthly payments can be made. With these choices, how do we intend to be competitive for the interests of the local youth – hope they like what they see while watching the NFL? I doubt it!

The high school coach must be proactive and create opportunities at the local level. As an example, in the spring of 1995 a group of high school football coaches in northwest Michigan gathered to discuss options for creating renewed interest in the game we love. The biggest concern was that most local youth seemed to develop other interests before football became an option. At that time the earliest opportunity for participation in tackle football was in junior high, and in many areas, not until high school. It became imperative to "cut into the market" at an earlier age. Therefore, we decided to initiate a youth football league.

Following many phone calls and much investigation it was decided to work directly with the national Pop Warner association. Their expertise and organization gave us the perfect blueprint to go ahead with our plan. We then affiliated ourselves with the local YMCA making them our administrative agent. The YMCA organizational structure fit nicely with the requirements set by the Pop Warner Association. This was followed by establishing local

associations responsible for their own organizational structure, fund raising, recruiting and so on.

In the fall of 1995 we had ten teams participate. This fall, with 46 teams, Pop Warner informed us that we are the largest organization in the midwest outside of Chicago. A welcomed but unexpected surprise. has been the implementation of junior high programs by many local schools. Players and parents had "just too much fun" and enthusiastically helped these school systems fill the void between Pop Warner and high school.

Initial concerns regarding funding have not been a problem. Normally several contests are held at a single site allowing one set of officials to do all games. When local shop owners see a large increase in business during Pop Warner home games, fundraising becomes easier. Gate and concession sales also help add funds to the local association coffers.

The message is loud and clear, "If you want them to play, give them a chance." Youth football will bring enthusiasm to your entire program. Get it going, back it, and let the fun begin!

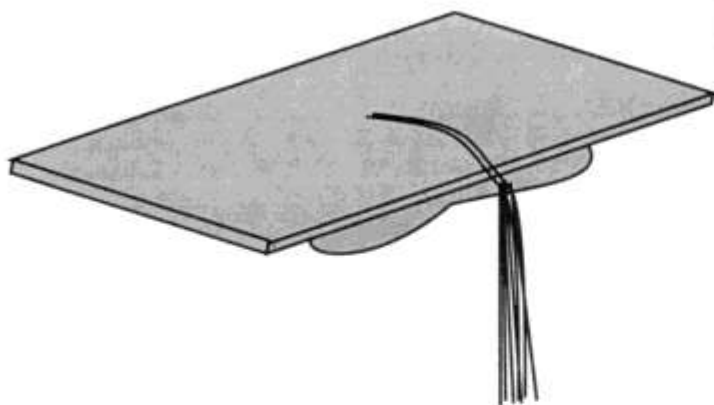
