DETROIT LIONS

Coach of the Week/Year Program

Press release from the Detroit Lions, November 28,2000

he Detroit Lions have named Herb Brogan of Jackson Lumen Christi High School as the winner of the High School Coach of the Year Award. Lumen Christi defeated Spring Lake 42-15 to claim the Division 5 State Championship title with a perfect 14-0 season.

Coach Brogan, a graduate of Kalamazoo College, has been the head coach at Lumen Christi since 1980 with a career record of 165-46, including a state title in 1996. Prior to starting his head coaching tenure, Brogan was an assistant coach under Jim Crowley at Lumen Christi for eight seasons winning state titles in 1977 and 1979.

"We had a great group of kids," said Brogan about this year's team. "I have a kid on the team so that made it extra nice too," he said, referring to starting quarterback Shane Brogan.

Only a few days removed from winning a state championship, Brogan has already begun to look at the rebuilding process for next year showing one of the reasons why he has been named the Coach of the Year. "This year our best players are probably juniors but we had 15 seniors starting, so we have

ne holes to fill."

Each week throughout the 2000 season, Brogan has developed his players' character, discipline and football skill. The Lions are honored to recognize him for his commitment to the team, school and community. Brogan was selected by a panel of three sports writers—Mick McCabe of the Detroit Free Press, Jane Boss of the Grand Rapids Press and Hugh Bernreuter of the Saginaw News.

This season's program has awarded \$37,500 to aid in the development and promotion of high school football thanks to contributions from former head coach Bobby Ross, coach Gary Moeller, the National Football League, and the Detroit Lions. Each winning coach throughout the regular season received a \$3500 donation to his school's football program.

All weekly winners will be honored at an awards ceremony during halftime of the Lions-Bears game in the Pontiac Silverdome on December 24. During the ceremony, the Lions will also honor the High School Coach of the Year, Herb Brogan. Brogan will receive a \$6000 donation to his football program. In addition to the monetary award, all winners will receive a framed certificate signed by Lions' head coach Gary Moeller, National Football League Commissioner Paul Tagliabue, as well as former Detroit Lion and current NFL Director of Football Development, Gene Washington. Winning coaches also receive a personalized game ball, a Detroit Lions "Coach of the Week" hat, and T-shirts for the entire team.

Michigan High School Football Coaches Association Competitive Scholarship

All candidates need to fill out a scholarship form and return it according to the directions. These awards are based on class rank, ACT score, GPA, references, and a student biography. Successful candidates in the past have generally had a GPA of 3.5 or higher and an ACT score of 25 or higher.

If you have such a student please give the application to them to complete. This application form will be included in the "school edition" of the newsletter.

Terry Rose Memorial Scholarship

This \$1000 scholarship is available to the children of MHSFCA members. The only requirements are that the son or daughter is planning to attend an institution of higher learning next year and that their parent is a member of the Michigan High School Football Coaches Association. These forms should be found in this newsletter. You should send one form for each child that is eligible. This scholarship is drawn at the Hall of Fame banquet in Ann Arbor in the spring.




