Interested In Becoming A Member Of The MHSFCA Board Of Directors?

Read the following sections of the MHSFCA Bylaws (Revised January, 2001)

ARTICLE 5

Directors

- 5.1 Powers: Subject to any limitations of the Articles of incorporation or the Michigan Nonprofit Association Act as to actions to be authorized or approved by the members, and subject to the duties of Directors as described by these Bylaws, all corporate powers shall be exercised by, or under the authority of, and the business and affairs of the Corporation shall be controlled by the Board of Directors. Without prejudice to such general powers, but subject to the same limitations, it is hereby expressly declared that the Directors shall have the following powers.
 - (a) The management of the affairs of the Association shall be vested in the Board of Directors which shall consist of the two (2) Regional Directors from each of the sixteen (16) Regions, the President, two (2) Vice Presidents, an Executive Director, a Historian, a Chaplain, a Public Relations Chairman, Past Presidents, Committee Chairmen, and Active Committee Members.
 - (b) To designate any place for the holding of any membership meeting or Board of Directors meeting, to change the principle office of the Association for the transaction of its business from one location to another; to adopt, make and use a corporate seal and to alter the form of such seal from time to time, as, in their judgement, they may deem best, provided such seal shall at all times comply with the provisions of law.
 - (c) To borrow money and incur indebtedness for the purpose of the Association and to cause to be executed and delivered therefor, in the Association's name, promissory notes, bonds, debentures, deeds of trust, mortgages, pledges, hypothecations of other evidence of debt, and securities thereof.
 - (d) To manage in such manner as they may deem best, all funds and property, real and personal, received and acquired by the Association, and to distribute, loan or dispense the same for the income and profits therefrom.
 - (a) To create such trusts, foundations, and subsidiaries, as the Board of Directors shall deem necessary and to appoint the trustees, directors, or other governing officials of such legal entities.
- 5.2 Numbers of Directors: The number of directors constituting the entire Board shall consist of thirty-two (32) regional directors. Two (2) regional directors shall be selected from each of regions 1 through 15 of the organization plan of the Michigan Education Association, and two (2) regional directors shall be selected from combined Regions 16 through 18 of the organization plan of the Michigan Education Association.
- 5.3 Qualifications for office: Each director shall be at least 18 years of age and an active member in good standing of this Association. Directors should have those qualities necessary for holding a position of trust in the Association, and manifest a vital interest in promoting the best interests of the Association.
- 5.4 Term of office: The term of office for each regional director shall be two (2) years, unless sooner terminated by death, incapacity, resignation or removal. In order to stagger the terms of directors, all regional directors from odd-numbered regions shall be elected in odd-numbered years, and all regional directors from even numbered regions shall be elected in even-numbered years. For this purpose, combined Regions 16-18 shall be considered as an even-numbered region. All directors shall hold office until the expiration of the term for which each was elected, until a successor has been duly elected and qualified, or until the director's prior resignation or removal as hereinafter provided. Directors may be elected or appointed to successive terms.
- 5.5 Nomination and Election of Regional Directors: To be nominated as regional director, interested members must send a letter to the Executive Director asking that their name be placed on their region's ballot. Each regional director

- shall be voted for only by the voting members in that region. The two nominees receiving the highest number of votes from each region's voting members shall be elected to office.
- 5.6 Resignation: Any director may resign from office at any time by giving written notice thereof to the Executive Director of the Association. If a regional director leaves the coaching profession or moves to a school in a region other than the one the director was elected from, such director will be deemed to have resigned from office.
- 5.7 Removal: Any director may be removed for cause by a two-thirds (2/3) vote of all the other directors then in office. Cause for removal exists (without limiting other causes for removal) whenever a director:
 - (a) Fails to attend three (3) consecutive regular meetings of the Board of Directors, notwithstanding that the director otherwise qualifies for office; or
 - (b) Is convicted of a felony.
- 5.8 Existence of Vacancies: A vacancy in the Board of directors exists in the case of the happening of any of the following events:
 - (a) The death, incapacity, resignation, or removal of any director.
 - (b) The authorized number of directorsisincreased.
- 5.9 Filling of Vacancies: Any vacancy occurring on the Board of Directors may be filled by a vote of the majority of the remaining directors. In the event that less• than a quorum of the Board remains, then, in that event, a vote of one hundred percent of the remaining Directors shall be required to fill any vacancy. A director so chosen shall serve for the balance of the not expired term of the vacant office. If the Board of Directors accepts the resignation of a director tendered to take effect at a future time, the Board may elect a successor to take office when the resignation becomes effective for the balance of the not expired term of the resigning Director.

However, the Board has the power to fill or leave unfilled, until the next election, all vacancies occurring on the Board, including those created by an authorized increase in the number of directors. In the event that the Board decides not to fill a vacancy for a director whose office is subject to election by the membership, the President may call a special meeting of the voting members to elect such director.

5.10Place and Number of Meetings:

Meetings of the Board of Directors shall be held at any place which has been designated from time to time by resolution of the Board or by written consent of all directors. The Board shall hold at least four (4) regular meetings each calendar year, as follows:

- (a) The spring meeting will be held the Friday of the weekend of the Hall of Fame.
- (b) The summer meeting will be held coincident with the All-Star Came.
- (c) The Fall meeting will be held the first Friday after the football Play Offs in a centrally located city of the state, unless stipulated differently by the Board of directors.
- (d) The Winter meeting will be held on the afternoon preceding the annual Coaches Clinic.

- 5.11 Annual and Special Meetings: The Winter meeting is designated as the annual meeting of the directors. Any business may be transacted at the annual meeting If proper notice thereof is given. Special meetings of the Board of Directors for any purpose(s) may be called at any time by the President or by one-third (1 /3) of the directors then in office.
- 5.12Notice of Meetings: A regular meeting of the directors may be held without prior notice. Notice of the time and place of special meetings of the Board shall be given personally to the directors or sent by mail or other form of communication, charges prepaid, addressed to the director at their address as shown upon the records of the Association at least three (3) days in advance of such meeting. Such notice shall state the general nature of the business to be considered at the special meeting.
- 5.13Quorum and Voting: A quorum will consist of at least one-third (1/3) of the total number of directors. Every act or decision done or made by a majority of the Directors present at a meeting duly held, at which a quorum was present, shall be regarded as the act of the Board of Directors, unless a greater number is required by law or by the Articles of Incorporation or by these Bylaws. Each director present shall be entitled to one (1) vote. Voting by proxy shall be permitted.

A director may participate in any meeting of the directors by means of conference telephone or similar communications equipment by means of which all persons participating in the meeting can hear each other. Participation in a meeting pursuant to this paragraph constitutes presence in person at the meeting.

The transactions of any meeting of the Board of directors, however called and noticed, or wherever held, shall be as valid as though they had called a meeting duly held after regular call and notice, if a quorum be present and if, either before or after the meeting, each of the directors not present signs a written waiver of notice or a consent to holding such meeting or an approval of the minutes thereof. All such waivers, consents, or approvals shall be filled with corporate records or made a part of the minutes of the meeting.

- 5.14Action By Unanimous Consent: Any action required or permitted to be taken by the Board of Directors may be taken without a meeting and with the same force and effect as if taken by a unanimous vote of directors, if authorized by writing signed individually or collectively by all directors. Such consent shall be filled with the regular minutes of the Board.
- 5.15Notice of Adjournment: Notice of the time and place holding an adjourned meeting need not be given to absent Directors if the time and place he fixed at the meeting adjourned.

Mike Boyd of Waterford Our Lady of the Lakes Named Lions HS Coach of the Year

This season's program awarded \$12,000 to aid the development

ALLEN PARK, Mich. The Detroit Lions have named Mike Boyd of Waterford Our Lady of the Lakes High School this year's Detroit Lions High School Coach of the Year.

Boyd and the Lakers captured the Division 8 Michigan State Championship this past weekend with an exciting 13-10 overtime win over Gaylord St. Mary.

"Because we went into overtime," said Coach Boyd, "the people coming for the (Birmingham) Brother Rice – Lowell game got treated to an exciting finish to our game before their game started."

Gaylord St. Mary started off with the ball in overtime and the Lakers managed to hold them to a field goal. The Lakers then decided against going for the game-tying field goal on forth-and-one, which would have forced another overtime, and punched it in the end zone for the state title.

"It has been really exciting. Unbelievable," said Boyd. "We just had a pep rally and it is just starting to dawn on the kids how much they have achieved."

The championship marks the schools first football state title in three tries, claiming runner-up honors in 1990 and 1994. Boyd has amassed a career record of 269-91-1 in 37 years of coaching at Waterford Our Lady of the Lakes. During that span, Boyd has won 10 prep bowls. Boyd has also served as the softball coach for the last 21 years, earning six state championship titles.

Each week throughout the 2002 nine-week regular season, one oach that best developed his players' character, discipline and football skill was recognized for his commitment to the team, school and community. The winners were selected by a panel of three newspaper writers: Mick McCabe (Detroit Free Press), Jane Bos (Grand Rapids Press), and Hugh Bernreuter (Saginaw News).

This season's program awarded \$12,000 to aid the development and promotion of high school football thanks to contributions from the National Football League and the Detroit Lions.

Each winning coach throughout the regular season received a \$1,000 donation to his school's football program. All weekly winners will be honored at an awards ceremony during the Lions-Buccaneers game on December 15. During the ceremony, the Lions will also honor Boyd, the Detroit Lions High School Coach of the Year. Boyd will receive a \$3,000 donation to his team's football program.

In addition to the monetary award, all winners receive a framed certificate signed by Lions' head coach Marty Mornhinweg, National Football League (NFL) Commissioner Paul Tagliabue, as well as former Detroit Lion and current NFL Director of Football Development, Gene Washington. Winning coaches also receive a personalized game ball and a Detroit Lions "Coach of the Week" hat.
