REPRESENTATIVE COUNCIL SHOOTS DOWN ALL-STAR FOOTBALL GAME

For the last two years the MHSFCA has done extensive investigation on the possibilities of having an All-Star Football Game. About one-third of the states in our nation have All-Star Football Games and every state was contacted. Questionnaires were sent to the states that had the All-Star Game and a great deal of information was sent to

our Association.

At our Football Clinic in February of 1977, our membership voted in favor of having the game and the MHSFCA All-Star Committee contacted Northern Michigan University about the possibilities of hosting the Game. Mr. Gil Canale, Athletic Director at NMU, contacted our Association and stated that they would be in favor of hosting the game.

At the MHSFCA Summer Meeting, the Board of Directors voted unanimously to implement an All-Star Game. A letter was given to Mr. Bush in August asking that he take our suggestion to have the All-Star Game to the Representative Council for approval in their November meeting.

All of the Directors and Alternates for the MHSFCA were asked to give reasons why we should have an All-Star Game and what educational value it might have. On November 11, a five page letter was sent to Mr. Allen W. Bush, Executive Director of the Michigan High School Athletic Association 19 reasons why we felt that we should have an All-Star Football Game. On November 15 Mr. Bush con--tacted our Association and stated that he information would be presented to - the Representative Council.

At the November meeting of the Representative Council, Mr. Bush read the statement from the National Association of High School Principals stating that this Association was "not in favor of All-Star Games". A motion was then made and by a 19-0 vote, the Council voted against having All-Star Games

Mr. Bush then notified our Association on December 2, "It was the decision of the Representative Council to continue to endorse the philosophy expressed by the National Association of Secondary Principals in which they are in opposition to All-Star contests for high school individuals. As a result, no action was taken to modify the existing All-Star Regulation.

Our Association asked the MHSAA to have the All-Star Game even if on a trial basis. Our officers volunteered their time to go to the meeting of the Rep Council, but were not asked to attend. There was no discussion by the Rep Council to have the game, just a

'Coach Of The Year' Selections

At the December 1, 1977, meeting of the MHSFCA Board of Directors, the "Coaches of the Year" were selected in the four classes. Last November each high school football coach was sent a ballot to vote for four coaches in this region. Four coaches were selected from each of the four regions which gives sixteen Regional Coaches and a total of sixty-four coaches for all of the classifications. From the list of sixty-four coaches, four were selected as "State Coaches of the Year". They were:

Class A Al Fracassa Birmingham Brother Rice

Al Fracassa is one of the most respected coaches in the state and his record of 113-30-7 is verification of the outstanding job that he has done over a period of 18 years as a head coach. This year Brother Rice was 12-0 winning the Catholic League and being State Champs for the second time in the last five years. Coach Fracassa is a MSU graduate and also is the Varsity Baseball Coach at Brother Rice.

Class B Mel Skillman Saginaw Douglas MacArthur

One of the best high school coaches in the state of Michigan is Mel Skill-

man. Over a period of 21 years he has posted a record of 104-60-3 and this past year his team lost a hard fought game with Jackson Lumen Christi for the Class B Championship by a 17-16 score. Coach Skillman is a graduate of Central Michigan.

Class C Art Paddy Orchard Lake St. Mary's

For 32 years Art Paddy has been considered to be one of the finest high school football and basketball coaches in the state of Michigan. As a head football coach his teams have posted a 156-56-8 record. Last November Orchard Lake St. Mary's easily won the Class C State Championship by a 48-12 score. Art has also coached at Cass City, Bay City, and West Bloomfield.

Class D Bill Herrmann Flint Holy Rosary

One of the best young coaches in the state is Bill Herrmann whose 1977 Flint Holy Rosary team beat a number one rated Crystal Falls Forest Park by a score of 21-20. Bill's two year record is a very respectable 19-3 and he is a graduate of Michigan State with a Bachelor's and Master's Degree. In 1976 his team was runners up for the State Championship and in 1977 they won the State Title.

19-0 vote. It would seem that the players in our state should have the same opportunity to have All-Star contests just like in other states. The Rep Council could have tabled the motion and checked with the individual school districts as to their opinion like they did with the Playoff Questionnaire.

Little or no consideration was given to the unanimous recommendation of the MHSFCA. It appears that the men who coach football in the state have little to say about the rules and regulations of the game that they work so closely with. Another example is the ridiculous three man rule adopted by the MHSAA for another year. It would be nice if the MHSAA would at least listen to our Association.

HONORARY MEMBERSHIP

At the annual luncheon held at the Battle Creek Lakeview on Feb. 25, the following will be inducted as Honorary Members of the MHSFCA:

- 1. ELMER ENGLE-former coach at Bay City Central who was the head coach for 27 years. His overall record was 181 wins, 38 ties, and 11 ties which includes 10 Saginaw Valley Championships, and 5 State Class A Championships.
- 2. DICK KISHPAUGH-sports writer and statistician for the Kalamazoo Gazette located in Parchment, Michigan.
- 3. RAY C. RYNBERG-coach at Grant High School for 33 years. His record was 189 wins, 64 losses, and 9 ties including 12 League Championships and 7 undefeated seasons.

4. MARVIN MITTLESTAT - outstanding football, basketball, and baseball coach at Flat Rock High School for over a 35 year period.
