



BUD WILKINSON GUEST SPEAKER FOR ANNUAL MHSFCA HALL OF FAME BANQUET

Bud Wilkinson, all time great Oklahoma coach and noted banquet speaker, will be the feature speaker at the Michigan High School Football Coaches Association Hall of Fame Banquet to be held at Crisler Arena April 12, 1986.

The banquet, once again, will be held in conjunction with the University of Michigan football clinic. Bo Schembechler will introduce Bud Wilkinson and will also be a featured speaker.

The banquet will recognize and honor 26 outstanding high school coaches who will join the 100 inducted into the Hall of Fame since its inception in 1982. This is the fourth annual banquet all of which have been held at the University of Michigan which also houses the Hall of Fame. The annual banquet has become one of the major events of the MHSFCA. Attendance last Spring very nearly topped the 1000 mark.

The banquet is a chance to honor our own and to be entertained both by nationally recognized football coaches and by the inductees themselves. Each of the inductees has just 60 seconds to make selected comments. These 60 second intervals compress the knowledge, wisdom and humor garnered over years of coaching into very entertaining, memorable episodes.

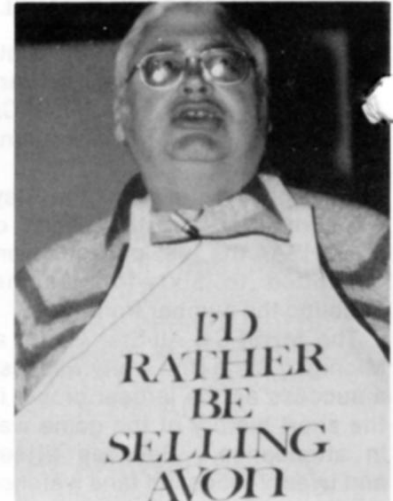
