We have just concluded another successful football clinic at Battle Creek, with excellent attendance and more exhibitors than ever before. Our clinic staff is to be commended on their work!

At the regularly scheduled Board of Directors meeting which occurs in conjunction with the Battle Creek Clinic your Board of Directors voted unanimously to oppose the state's adopted calendar for football in 1987. We would like you to understand our opposition to the calendar and our original proposal to the MHSAA which inadvertently led to the adoption of the calendar. In an attempt to clarify potential misconceptions I would like to once more review the events that led to the changed football schedule.

In the Spring of 1986 the M.H.S.F.C.A. Board of Directors submitted to the Representative Council a proposal calling for a mandatory 3 days of shorts followed by 2 days of pads in the first week of summer practice. The Representative Council accepted this proposal, **BUT**, added an optional extra week in front of the mandatory week. (It is this optional week which we oppose.)

At this time we presume that the calendar adopted by the MHSAA last spring will be in effect for 1987. However, we intend to work for its removal from the calendar for 1988. We need your support and strongly encourage you to urge your principal, and/or athletic director to contact the Representative Council members in your area and request the rescinding of the optional week for 1988.

Get involved, be an **active** member, and let's make the M.H.S.F.C.A. a viable force in athletics in Michigan.

A Study of Michigan Varsity Football Coaches

Salary, Responsibility, and Employment Plans in Regard to School Classification and Region

Gerald W. Barchett, Watervliet

In May of 1986 a questionnaire was mailed out to head football coaches in every high school in the state of Michigan. The survey was conducted as a part of the requirements for my Specialists degree from Central Michigan University. 623 surveys were mailed. Three hundred nine coaches responded (49%) This is considered an excellent response. An Analysis of the data obtained revealed the following information:

The average football coaching salary for all classes in all regions was \$2,511.48. The highest salary (Class A, Region III) was \$3,082.22. The lowest salary (Class C, Region II) was \$1,843.07.

In the state of Michigan only six coaches reported that they had released teaching hours for coaching football.

The average number of hours spent on football during the season was thirty one per week. Off season hours averaged 10 per week.

The average total football budget for all classes, all regions was \$5,261.02. This does not include coaching salary. One hundred sixty eight of the three hundred nine coaches responding said that they used fund raising activities for a portion of their budget.

Only eighty one of the three hundred nine coaches reported that

they had either a full or part time athletic trainer. (36%)

The average number of paid varsity assistants in all classes, all regions was two, with a large number of coaches reporting only one.

The average number of years coaching at their present school was ten. The average number of years predicted remaining in coaching was also ten. Of the three hundred nine coaches responding the average number of years remaining before retirement was twelve.
