Tom Moshimer Crowley Award Winner

The Jim Crowley Award is dedicated to the memory of the late Jim Crowley, former coach at Jackson Lumen Christi High School, a great coach, and a dedicated family man. The award honors individuals who have made special contributions to the game of football and to the MHSFCA. It is the most prestigious award presented by our association.

Tom Moshimer, the 1989 recipient of the Crowley Award, was a 1959 graduate of Michigan State University. He be-

gan his coaching career in the fall of 1959 as the head coach at Dundee High School which had been 1-25-1 during the preceeding three seasons. Tom put together a 35 game winning streak from 1962-1966. Moshimer took over at Plymouth Salem in 1967 and turned a team which had been 1-15 the previous two years into a consistent winner. His overall coaching record is 161-95-6 and his teams have been 101-53 since he went to the wishbone 16 years ago. Tom is recognized as an expert on the wishbone offense, both "Bo" Schembechler and George Perles have referred to him as one of the most knowledgeable coaches on the wishbone in the country.

Tom has all of the qualities of a successful coach: athletic awareness, an insurmountable spirit, a great feeling for his athletes and fellow coaches, and the dedication to work until the job is done.

Tom Moshimer has been selected as a MHSFCA Regional Coach of the Year several times and has been selected Detroit News and Detroit Free Press Coach of the Year. Tom was inducted into the MHSFCA Hall of Fame in 1985.

Tom has been a dedicated member of our Board of Directors. He has been the All Star Game Chairman, since the first All Star Game in 1981. Without his direction, the All Star Game wouldn't be the success it has become.

We congratulate Tom Moshimer, the 1989 recipient of the Crowley Award, for his contribution to the association, and for his many contributions to the game of football, and to the lives of the many players he has coached.

The Hall of Fame banquet started in 1983 featuring Woody Hayes as guest speaker. Woody was followed by Ara Parseghian, Duffy Daugherty, Bud Wilkinson, Don Canham, and Alex Agase. 174 High school coaches have been inducted into the Hall of Fame since 1983.

Each year the speakers have been introduced by host "Bo" Schembechler. We all recognize that "Bo" is a legend in college coaching and has a long list of outstanding accomplishments (including ranking number one in victories for an active college coach with over 200 wins). Al Slammer, Battle Creek Central

1. Practice the kicking Game Live. Incorporate Game Situations.
2. Emphasize the Kicking Game...Sell it to your players!
3. Put Your Best Athletes on your Punt Teams. Select personnel carefully!
4. Begin Each Day's practice with a Least One Phase of Kicking Game
5. Set up Kicking Game Drills that act as conditioners (especially during the pre-season).
6. Prepare for possible injuries by practicing with different personnel.
7. Maintain a Teaching Progression which is both logical and Simple.
8. Commit your team to returning the Punt!
9. Teach one Return and Teach it well (offer variations).
10. Set up a Pre-Practice schedule that works on the Kicking Game
11. Follow the Seven Commandments of the Kicking Game:
 1. Thou shall not be offsides.
 2. Thou shall make sure the ball is kicked.
 3. Thou shall not rough the kicker.
 4. Thou shall not let the ball hit the ground on a kick.
 5. Thou shall not field a punt inside the 10 yard line.
 6. Thou shall not clip on a return.
 7. Thou shall not block below the waist.

"Class" Restructuring Basis for Playoff Proposal

At the January MHSFCA Board of Directors Meeting in conjunction with the Battle Creek Clinic a proposal for altering the "class" structure of Michigan High Schools to solve some inequities in the Football Playoff system was discussed. The proposal was the creation of the Macomb County Athletic Directors Association. It has been discussed widely in the Macomb area, and has been taken to the Playoff Committee of the MHSAA. Action may be taken by the MHSAA Representative Council at their fall '89 meeting with implementation possible for the 1990 football season.

The proposal cited four concerns with the current class system.

1. Scheduling strategies are sometimes used by schools to avoid football powers since one loss presents a serious threat to playoff qualification. This results in strong schools having inordinate difficulty scheduling games.

2. The tremendous span in enrollments in the current four classes: In class A (In 1988) the largest school - Detroit Redford had an enrollment of 3,192 - the smallest, Warren Mott had 916 a difference of 2,276 students, this was nearly four times the span in class B (614), six times that in class C (379), and eleven times the span in class D (206).

In class A no school smaller than the 68th in enrollment has reached the finals in the last 5 years. Seventy percent of the finalists in class A over the last five years have come from the largest 29 schools: 1984 Pioneer #25 vs Fordson #45, 1985 Traverse City #4 vs Troy #60, 1986 Muskegon #68 vs Stevenson #22, 1987 Redford Catholic Central #29 vs Pioneer #25, 1988 Redford Catho-

lic Central #29 vs Traverse City #4.

3. In 1988 174 class A, 172 class B, 173 class C, and 105 class D high schools competed for 16 playoff berths in each class. What this amounts to is that a class A, B, or C school has a one in 11 (approx.) chance of making the playoffs, while a class D school has a one in 6.5 chance of making the tournament.

4. Teams with good records are sometimes left out of the playoffs. While most other team sports in Michigan place 100% of participating schools' teams in the state's championship tournaments, only 10% of the schools sponsoring football make the playoffs.

Following are the key elements of the proposed changes in Michigan's football playoff structure:

1. Expand the present football*

Saturday for Finals competition.

3. Adjust the point system to award equal points for the competition among the following groupings: Classes AAA and AA, Classes A and B, Classes C and D.

Positive points of this restructuring included:

1. There would be 32 more teams qualify for the playoffs.

2. It reduces the enrollment span in each class. The largest span would be reduced by 439 (using 1988 enrollment figures). Other classes enrollment spans would be reduced as well.

3. Schools would be arranged in groups of 208 for purposes of playoff point calculations. This should ease the playoff point pressure on multi-class leagues.

Rick Repicky, President of the Macomb County Athletic Directors Association, submitted the report of his association's proposal. John Dea-

class system to six classes — five classes with 104 schools each and one class of 103 schools. (Currently there will be 623 schools sponsoring football in 1989.)

*The proposal would only effect the "class" structure for Michigan's high schools for purposes of the football playoffs.

2. Make use of both Friday and
