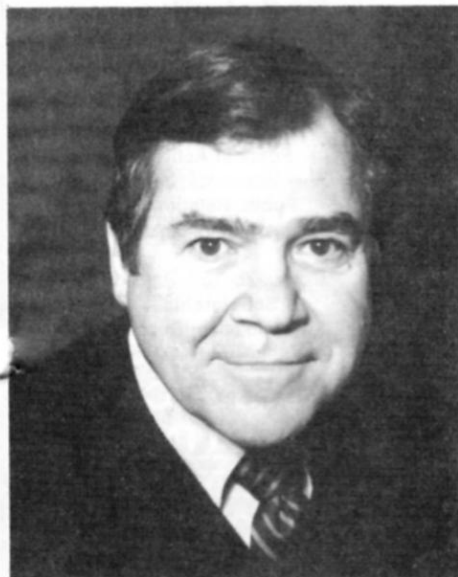

Kalamazoo Area's Bob Wyman is Crowley Award Winner

The Jim Crowley Award is dedicated to the memory of the late Jim Crowley, former coach at Jackson Lumen Christi H.S. Jim was a great coach and dedicated family man who was tragically killed at the height of his career in 1984 at age 45.

Bob Wyman, this year's recipient of the Crowley Award, is a 1944 graduate of Detroit Redford H.S. After spending 2 1/2 years in the Navy, Bob attended Wayne State where he started as a guard/linebacker for four years, and served as captain of the 1950

team. After his graduation in 1951 he coached football for 37 years at the high school and college levels; Bob's collegiate stops included Wayne State University, Ball State, Western Michigan, and Kalamazoo College. Coach Wyman was the head coach at Kalamazoo Christian H.S., Detroit Henry Ford H.S., and Detroit Chadsey H.S. He has been an assistant at Detroit Northeastern, Portage Central, and Mattawan high schools. Bob is widely known for his expertise in the veer offense and is an extremely accomplished offensive line coach.

Coach Bob Wyman has lectured at our annual clinic and served on the MHSFCA Board of Directors for several years where he acted as chair of our placement committee. Bob was inducted into the MHSFCA Hall of Fame in 1987.

Our 1990 recipient is, like Jim Crowley, a dedicated family man and an elder in his church. From his work as a coach at Division I schools through his work as a high school assistant Bob's humility and dedication to football and the young men who play it is obvious.

Perhaps the most compelling reason for Bob Wyman's selection as the Crowley Award winner for 1990 is that he has helped so many young coaches, and in the process many high school football programs, by getting them started in their careers. As an associate professor of physical education at Western Michigan University since 1974, and through his

Coaching Football class, Bob has identified, recommended and placed many young men in local schools, thus aiding their development and helping Kalamazoo area schools fill their coaching needs. Four of Bob's former assistants at Kalamazoo Christian, who got their first coaching jobs under Bob, are now coaching at the University of Miami (Florida), the University of Cincinnati, Albion College, and Kalamazoo College.

Our recipient is a coaches' coach, he has long been a credit to the game of football. It is with great pleasure that we honor Bob Wyman as this year's Jim Crowley Award winner.

Player Safety a National Concern

State Association officials have been made aware of a growing number of catastrophic injuries nationally in high school sports since 1987. Gathering in Tucson, Arizona for the National Federation winter meetings and national high school football rules meetings early in January, state officers were informed of statistical evidence that indicated doubling of catastrophic injuries in one year. Accompanying this report was the news that indicated a probable rise in insurance premiums. Most of the life-threatening injuries occurred during competition in football.

It is encouraging to note that none of the reported cases occurred in Michigan high school athletic competition, but the fear that persists for coaches, players, educators and parents alike is: *Is the game of football as safe as it can be?*

The National Federation is concerned enough that it will form a national task force to study, investigate, and make recommendations regarding the safety of our young athletes. Everyone associated with high school athletics is aware of the criticism we receive when statistics of this nature are published. Some criticism is unjustified, but at all times criticism about player safety and coaching technique is worth reviewing. The task force will concentrate on the game of football as it is being taught to high school students rather than on safer player equipment. Equipment, particularly the football helmet, has been modified and improved to the extent that some feel the helmet has become a weapon that has caused injuries as much as it has prevented them.

The Michigan High School Athletic Association Football Coaches Committee met in Lansing on Monday, January 29, to review recent changes in the rules and the status of

football in Michigan schools. Twelve active coaches representing all classes and geographic areas of the state were in attendance. Discussion on all subjects was compelling and insightful, particularly so on the concerns of player safety and the future of football. Several suggestions addressing these concerns were discussed including the following recommendations:

a) Publishing editorial features in *Mentor* and the *Michigan High School Football Coaches Association Newsletter* informing our coaches of national concerns and ways that coaches can help.

b) Publishing joint statements by the MHSAA and MHSFCA stressing player safety, adherence to rules and use of proper coaching techniques.

c) Endorsing an active coach of high school football to read a prepared statement at all August rules meetings. The statement would be a collaborative effort of the MHSAA and MHSFCA stressing player safety and proper coaching technique.

d) That an effort be made at football clinics to include a session on safety, legal responsibilities of coaches, and the teaching of proper high school football techniques.

Player safety is a primary concern for coaches in all sports and at all levels of competition. The coach is most important in creating the environment and shaping the attitudes and playing techniques of the young men and women who are placed in his/her trust. We should all remind ourselves of the tremendous responsibility we have and strive to keep competition in high school contact and non-contact sports alike ethical, sportsmanlike, fun and safe.

MHSFCA Leadership Workshop

The role of the student athlete today is becoming more complex than ever. Drug and alcohol usage and peer pressure are problems that must be dealt with every day in our schools. It is important that our student athletes know what is expected of them. They need to know how to deal with the problems of others both on and off the playing field. Therefore being selected as a captain or a leader in any activity is no longer just a popularity contest or an empty honor. Student leaders are being asked to take a more active role in our schools. It is our job as coaches and teachers to provide them with guidance on how to assume these leadership roles in a positive way.

Many of the problems that result from peer pressure happen during

non-school hours. Captains and student leaders need to be educated on different situations that could arise and how to deal with them. Helping our student leaders develop coping skills is the most effective way we can help them deal with the problems in our society today.

The MHSFCA has decided to offer a workshop to develop student leaders who will influence their peers to lead healthy responsible lives. The Leadership Workshop will be a two day program and will involve students, coaches, sponsors, and administrators. The leaders attending will receive instruction in alcohol/drug awareness, decision-making skills, communications skills, setting goals, coping with peer pressure, peer pres-

sure reversal, and developing a positive self-image. Each subject will be addressed in a large group and a small group session.

The two day workshop was conceived by the substance abuse committee in co-operation with the workshop staff of Mike Marek, Greg Harden, Tim Fagan and Al Dicken.

It is our hope that the leaders attending the workshop will implement their newly developed skills by conducting leadership workshops in their own schools and conferences. The MHSFCA feels our future lies in the hands of our youth, and the more positive experiences we can contribute to their lives, the more positive and constructive all our futures will be.

Battle Creek Named Permanent Clinic Site

The past nine years have seen a steady increase in the participation in our annual MHSFCA clinic. The hard work of many people has made this possible, but a big part of that success has been due to the cooperation given to our association by the City of Battle Creek and the Management of Stouffer's Hotel. It is fitting that as we

approach our tenth clinic at Battle Creek in 1991 that we name the City of Battle Creek and Stouffer's Hotel as our permanent site for the clinic. Our Association thanks the people of Battle Creek and the truly outstanding people at Stouffer's Hotel who have helped make our clinic such a success.

New Camp Funding Regulations from MHSAA

After more than two years of study and discussion and a review at all ten 1989 Update Meetings, a 180-degree change is occurring in MHSAA regulations and interpretations regarding the funding of students' participation in athletic camps out-of-season.

At its fall meeting in Detroit the MHSAA Representative Council placed schools in control of the funds used to send students to out-of-season camps. The following changes have been made and are effective immediately:

1. Interpretation #83 of amateur regulations has been revised to read:

"A camp may not reduce or waive fees for any individual or team. Full or partial scholarships to athletic camps may be accepted by students without violating the amateur regulation, provided the funds are paid by:

"(1) the student's parents, grandparents or siblings; or

"(2) the school district, not with general funds, but with funds generated through school approved fund raising activities of booster clubs, school teams, student groups, and community, civic or service groups and are not provided to students on the basis of athletic ability or potential."

2. Item 1(C) of regulation II, Section 11 (G) has been revised to read (bold type is new):

"No payment with school district funds of entry fees for teams or individuals to camps or competition **unless those funds were generated through school approved activities of booster clubs, school teams, student groups, and community, civic, or service groups and are not provided to students on the basis of athletic ability or potential.**"

3. A maximum limit on the amount of money that may be paid with approved school funds on behalf of any one student to participate in out-of-season camps, clinics or competition has been established: \$200 per sport — per year (September through August).

This changes previous regulations which have prohibited any funds from any school account to be used for the payment of entry fees for teams or individuals to camps or competition out-of-season.

A recent group of television programs have featured football coaches in a very negative manner. Our profession has been portrayed as a group of wild fanatics who always put winning above the safety of our athletes and the desires of school and family.

Many of us simply write-off this kind of negative publicity as Hollywood hype and go about our business. Unfortunately, the negative publicity generated from the few serious inju-

ries, along with the problems of steroid abuse in our sport, have given the anti-football people ammunition for undermining football.

How many of us have had young men say they would love to play football, but... "Mom, won't let me"? Have you had faculty and parents keep their children away from the weight room because "they're all steroid freaks"?

I feel it is time for all of us to pull together and do two things. First, let the media know that all football coaches are not abusive, "win at all
