1991 Jim Crowley Award Presented to — Roger Chiaverini

The Jim Crowley Award is presented in the memory of the late Jim Crowley, a great coach and dedicated family man who stressed having fun, playing hard, and being dedicated to doing their best to the many young men he coached in 17 seasons at Jackson St. John's and Lumen Christi High Schools.

Our 1991 recipient, Roger Chiaverini, is a 1944 graduate of Detroit Western High School. That fall he enrolled and played football at the University of Michigan, playing on a team which featured many players much older than he, who had returned from service in World War II. After a year out of

school he enrolled at Western Michigan University and played guard for the Broncos during the early part of the Korean War. He returned to W.M.U. on the G.I. Bill and served as a graduate assistant in 1952 and 1953.

Coach Chiaverini's first head job was at Adrian High School in 1954-'55. Following two years as line coach at W.M.U. in '56-'57, he returned to high school coaching at Monroe High School. Successful programs were later developed at Muskegon High School, Muskegon Catholic Central (where his 1974 team won the "mythical" state title), and Holland West Ottawa. He resigned his position at West Ottawa in 1986 and has been an assistant at Muskegon Reeths-Puffer for his longtime former assistant, Pete Kutches the past four years.

Other former assistants of Coach Chiaverini, besides Pete Kutches, that

have gone on to head coaching jobs include: Bob Knight, Portage Central; Brent Englewright, coaching in Wisconsin; Tony Annesse, Montrose; Ken Diamond, Montague; Dean Jewett, Muskegon Catholic Central; Larry Sellers, Traverse City St. Francis; Rich Jeric, Monroe; and Charles Jestice, Dearborn Fordson.

Roger Chiaverini has been coaching for 41 years, 31 as a head coach. He is always willing to share his knowledge of the game and his philosophy of offense and defense. He truly loves the game and loves sharing with others. He has been honored as a Regional Coach of the Year by our association on several occasions, was AP Coach of the Year in 1974, coached the All Star Game in 1983, and was inducted into the MHSFCA Hall of Fame in 1983. Roger lists as his best achievement the fact that he has hired good assistants.

Like Jim Crowley, this year's recipient is a leader of young men, a tremendous example to those he coached, and a dedicated father and husband to Mark, Susan, and wife Dot. Our sincere congratulations to Roger Chiaverini, a most deserving recipient of the 1991 Jim Crowley Award.

Leadership Workshop Works

Mike, captain of a Michigan high school football team, was talking with one of his teammates after practice. John had been late to practice several times and didn't pay attention during drills. They discussed John's behavior and how it was affecting the team. Eventually, the conversation turned to what Mike already suspected — John had been experimenting with drugs.

A year ago, Mike would have confronted his teammate. He would have felt like a "goody-goody" or worse, a "narc." But this summer Mike attended the MHSFCA Leadership workshop. He learned how to set an example for his teammates, encourage team unity, make decisions about chemical use, and talk with his teammates about drugs without losing their friendship.

The MHSFCA Leadership Workshop is run in the summer in conjunction with the MHSFCA All Star Football Game. Started in July, 1990, the program has drawn praise from high school administrators, counselors, and coaches across the state.

Bill Tucker, Luke M. Powers Catholic High School, was very impressed with the enthusiasm and knowledge his ten attendees brought back from the Leadership Workshop. Powers has set-up a Leadership Forum based on the information his players garnered.

The workshop is especially appealing because, rather than identifying and punishing users, it promotes good referral skills, the development of self-esteem, good peers support, and leadership

qualities. Encouraging positive behavior has become (and rightly so) an integral part of a student leader's role. Today's student leaders need to be more than just the "star" of the team or the best academic student in school. They need to know how to deal with peer problems, both in and out-side of school. Being selected as a team captain or activity leader can no longer be an "empty" honor.

The MHSFCA Leadership Workshop is a two day program involving students, coaches, sponsors, administrators, counselors, boosters, and community leaders. Those attending receive instruction in alcohol/drug awareness, decision making skills, communications skills, setting goals, coping with peer pressure, and developing a positive self-image. Each subject is addressed in a large group session and then in small groups.

Those attending the workshop receive room and board on campus at Michigan State and a ticket to the All Star Game with their registration.

Plan on attending this year's Leadership Workshop. For every five students from one school one adult registration will be free. Get involved, make it a team project. It's a decision you won't regret.

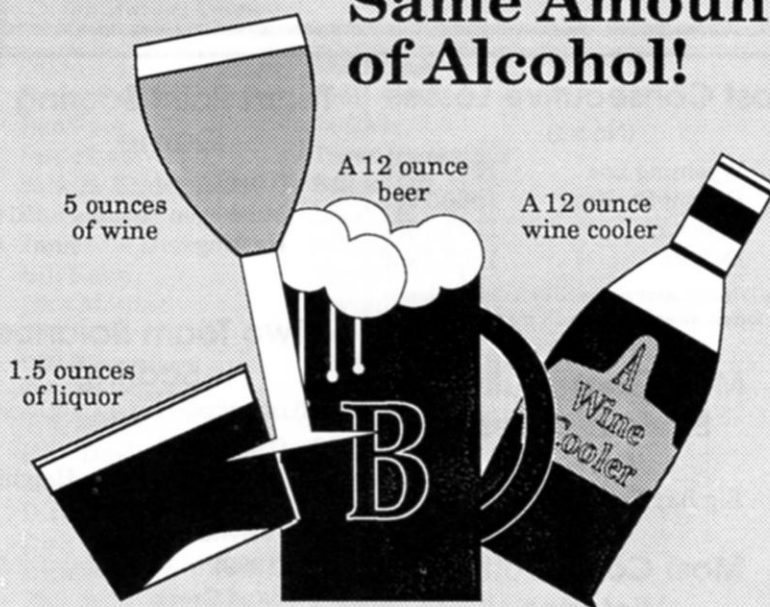

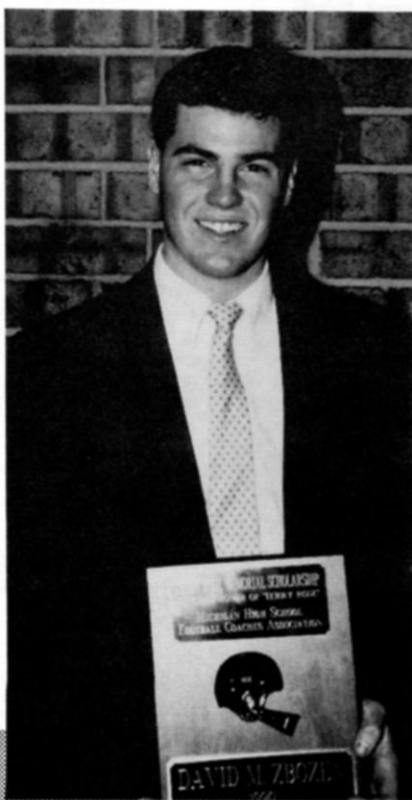
