MHSFCA leader, Larry Rueger

Have fun, play hard, be dedicated to doing your best." These were the challenges put forth to his athletes by the late Jim Crowley, in whose memory the MHSFCA presents the "Jim Crowley Award." Coach Crowley guided the football fortunes of Jackson St. John and Jackson Lumen Christi High Schools for 17 years, including two state championship teams in 1977 and 1979, until his tragic death in early 1980 at

the age of 45. As is our 1995 recipient, Coach Crowley was a fine coach who was active in our organization, a dedicated family man, and committed not only to his family, team and school, but also to making his community a better place in which to live.

Our 1995 recipient of the Jim Crowley Award, Larry Rueger, graduated from Francis J. Reitz High School in Evansville, Indiana and attended Murray State University, graduating in 1966 with a Bachelor's Degree in Music Education.

Bloopers & Bright Spots

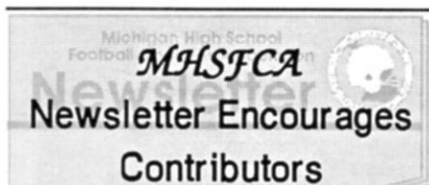

Our recipient's 28 year coaching career includes two years at Muskegon Heights, 17 at Mona Shores (including nine seasons as head coach), one year as a varsity assistant in the highly successful Muskegon High School Big Red program and at Fruitport High School for the past six seasons.

Coach Rueger has been very active in our organization, serving as a Regional Director from 1976-90, All Star Game Day Director from the inception of the All Star Game, All Star Chairman since 1990, Head Coach of the West All Star Team in 1990, and currently is the 1st Vice President of the MHSFCA. He was recognized for his work as a coach with an Assistant Coach of the Year Award in 1993.

From the MHSFCA Playoff Committee:

Playoff Change Suggestions — Revision of Point System

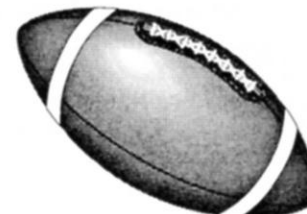
The MHSFCA Board of Directors submitted a suggestion that the Playoff Committee review changing the procedure of awarding Play-Off points for team victories. Currently, points are awarded in four classifications:

80 points for a victory over a Class AA or A team
64 points for a victory over a Class BB or B team
48 points for a victory over a Class CC or C team
32 points for a victory over a Class DD or D team

There are no additional points for a single digit team that defeats a double digit team in the same classification. It would appear that a change in procedure would result in splitting the difference in points as in the following:

Playoffs

Class AA	88 points
Class A	80 points
Class BB	72 points
Class B	64 points
Class CC	56 points
Class C	48 points
Class DD	40 points
Class D	32 points



Results of a survey taken at the MHSFCA Battle Creek Clinic were 2 - 1 in favor of this proposal, the playoff committee reported. They will take the proposal to the spring meeting of the Representative Council of the MHSAA. (The survey actually used different numbers than those printed above... the survey started with 88 points for AA and went to 32 points for D. The results are exactly the same, using the lower numbers... 8 points difference for each of the class divisions.)

From the MHSFCA Rules Committee:

Rule Revisions for 1995

- 1-3-2 The home team shall provide at least one legal ball.
- 1-3-2 Following a change of possession touchdown the scoring team may use the ball of its choice for the try.
- 1-5-1d Note Beginning with the 1999 season, the jersey shall be long enough to reach the top of the pants and shall be tucked in if longer.
- 1-5-1d(3) Each number may have a single solid color border, not to exceed 1/2" in width.
- 1-5-2c Gloves must have a securely attached label or stamp indicating compliance with specifications, unless made of unaltered plain cloth.
- 1-5-3k Beginning with jerseys and pants manufactured after January 1, 1996 may have no more than one manufacturer's logo/trade name, whether visible or not, and sizing and other non-logo labels are prohibited on the outside of either item.
- 1-5-3l Jewelry is added to list of illegal items.
- 2-11; 9-4-1 Definition of fighting has been provided with penalty of 15 yards and disqualification. (Definition: An attempt to strike an opponent or engage in combative efforts not germane to football.)
- 2-16-4 Blocking below the waist and/or clipping in free-blocking zone not to continue after the ball has left the zone.
- 3-2-1 State associations may establish time when pregame toss or simulated toss is held on the playing field.
- 6-5-3 Allows new choice to snap or free kick following a fair catch or awarded catch if a dead ball foul occurs before the play or an inadvertent whistle sounds and a replay results.
- 7-5-2d Exp It is legal to conserve time by intentionally throwing the ball forward to the ground if thrown immediately after receiving a direct hand-to-hand snap.
- 7-5-13 Touching forward pass by an ineligible behind the neutral zone is illegal touching instead of an illegal forward pass.
- 9-5 Pen The second unsportsmanlike foul by a player results in disqualification.
- 9-8 Pen The second unsportsmanlike foul by the same non-player results in disqualification.
- 6-man Rule 10 If there is a foul by B during a successful try by run or pass, the penalty enforced at the succeeding spot.

EDITORIAL CHANGES

- 2-30-4 Defined an offensive blocker.
- 2-30-15 Substitute becomes a player when positioned in any offensive or defensive formation.
- 3-5-6 On equipment repair, player must leave field if all time-outs have been used.
- 7-5-9c Pass interference restrictions end for all B players when the first pass has been touched by A or B.
- 9-3-5b Clarified use of hands on opponent above the waist from behind is legal when attempting to reach the runner or catch or recover a loose ball.
- 9-5-1g Unsportsmanlike conduct if player refuses to comply with officials directive.
- 9-5-1a; 9-8-1a Additional examples listed on taunting and baiting on the basis of religion, gender, or national origin.
- 9-7-3 Deleted coverage for batting by an ineligible receiver.
- 9-8-1k Clarified that a substitute may not leave the box whether the fight occurs inbounds or out-of-bounds.

POINTS OF EMPHASIS

1. Roughing the kicker/holder/passers
2. Taunting and baiting
3. Shifts/false starts

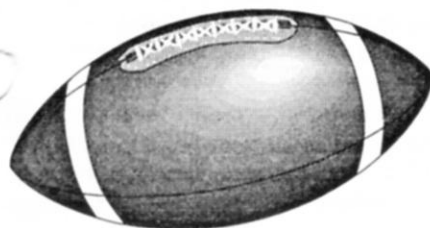

The 15 and 25 year coaching certificates are available from MHSCA/Gatorade.

General Requirements

- Must have distinguished himself/herself with good coaching ethics and promoted good sportsmanship in their coaching
- May use up to ten years coaching outside Michigan
- May use years as an assistant as well as years as a head coach
- May combine sports coached but may not count more than one sport any school year
- May use years at the varsity, junior varsity, or junior high/middle school level
- May apply for certificate in more than one sport if you qualify for 15 or 25 years in each sport

Specific requirements

- To receive a 15 year certificate, must have been a coach in a particular sport for 15 school years
- To receive a 25 year certificate, must have been a coach in a particular sport for 25 school years

Procedure for receiving certificate
