### Becomes 17th Jim Crowley Award Recipient

**T**he Jim Crowley Award is one of, if not the, most prestigious awards that can be bestowed upon a Michigan high school football coach. The recipient must demonstrate exceptional contributions to football in general, as well as to the M.H.S.F.C.A. It is not, nor should it be determined by the win-loss column, but rather by the values and principles that are taught to the young people whom we all serve.

Our 1997 recipient is, without hesitation, deserving of this recognition by his peers and colleagues. He has been coaching football since 1956. During those 41 years he has influenced in a positive way several thousand young men who are today better and stronger people than they would have been without his leadership. As our society has changed throughout the years, Pete has added new dimensions to his program. For example, he addresses issues with parents as to what they should say and do with their sons when faced with some of life's toughest challenges. He

A third victory was chalked up on December 17, 1996 as the NCAA, after years of deliberation, finally gave approval to the MHSFCA's plans to build a Hall of Fame on the grounds of the University of Michigan.

### Camps Reminder

*from the MHSAA "Blue Book."*

*RE: Summer Football Camps*

Camps limited to students entering grades 9-12 *must be promoted and advertised in public media* to be open to students from more than one high school. Camps sponsored by a high school and limited to students entering grades 9-12 may not extend more than 10 days total.

During the summer prior to the week of August 15... (in football) a maximum of 7 players at one time may engage in organized competition with their school coach present for a maximum of 7 days.

From August 1 to Monday the week of August 15, coaches of... [football are subject to the player limitation of 7] when coaching students of their school district

in grades 7-12 in sport specific activities. There is to be no competition between school teams with their school coaches during this period.

### Playoff Committee

In a conversation with Jerry Cvensgros from the MHSAA, we learned that the following items would be discussed at the football Committee Meeting:

1. The use of a running clock in the second half (35 pt. rule) during playoff games. "This idea passed in a vote of the MHSFCA Board of Directors at their Winter Meeting - 22 yes, 17 no, 5 abstentions.
2. Concern over some schools "adding" far too many players to their rosters for the playoffs.
3. The possibility of equalization of the eight classes in the playoffs.
4. The rule prohibiting video taping of an opponent's scrimmage.

lays out his expectations for the parents as well as the athlete.

Our recipient's tangible awards are limited – limited to induction into the Coaches Hall Of Fame for both football (1985) and baseball (1991) and his selection for the head coach of the East Squad for the 1989 East West All Star game (his squad was victorious); his teams have qualified for and participated in the state football playoffs; in addition, he has served as a director of the M.H.S.F.C.A. for over ten years to help insure the continued improvement in Michigan athletics. The greatest limitation to his acknowledgment as a success is himself. He is a humble individual who feels more comfortable in praising others than heaping recognition upon himself. He does not speak of "his" team, but rather "our team," always crediting his athletes and assistant coaches for their successes.

Pete Coll draws many examples for the young men he works with from his deep faith and from other successful men who have coached over the years. A paraphrase of one of Vince Lombardi's quotations succinctly summarizes his program: "The objective is to win, fairly, squarely, decently, by the rules." Center Line football teams are successful. They are successful in the win column, but more importantly, the young men leave the school equipped to succeed in life.

Coach Coll and his staff provide the leadership, guidance, and the role models for these young people to emulate. They teach and demonstrate the principles of hard work, honesty and team work.

This award is presented in the memory of the late Jim Crowley, who coached for 17 years at Jackson St. John and Jackson Lumen Christi High Schools, winning two state titles along the way, the last one only two short months prior to his tragic death in 1980. Coach Crowley, a great football coach and devoted family man, stressed having fun, playing hard and being totally dedicated to doing one's best.

It appears certain that our 1997 recipient of the Jim Crowley Award and the late Coach Crowley are cut out of a similar mold: a leader of young men, a tremendous example to those he coached and worked with, a man of faith and, most certainly, a dedicated family man (married to Marilyn for 42 years and raising four beautiful and successful children along the way).

We congratulate and thank Coach Pete Coll of Center Line High School for his contribution to Michigan High School Football and recognize him as the 1997 recipient of our most prestigious award, the Jim Crowley Award.

## Emphasizing Turnover Ratio

**A**t Baraga High School we've built our program around the three most important principles in football - blocking, tackling and turnover ratio. To emphasize the importance of the "Big Three" we begin every practice with a circuit involving a variety of blocking, tackling and turnover drills.

Our thoughts on fumbles include:

### Offense (Preventing turnovers)

1. Stress the positive "protect the football" not the negative "don't fumble."
2. Keep a ball in your skill players' hands as often as possible: warm-ups, form running, agilities, sprints, conditioning, etc.
3. Coach ball security relentlessly. We have a Ten Push-up Rule for everyone on our team including coaches. If you're holding a football in your arm and someone knocks it to the ground, you owe that person ten push-ups on the spot. By the end of the year everyone is holding the ball like a vise.
4. Make the offensive unit understand that fumbles will sometimes occur especially in a desperation strip situation. Our linemen perform a second effort drill that requires them to complete their block then hustle downfield to recover a fumble.
5. We assign certain members of the scout team defense to try stripping the ball. If they're successful - we reward the defense and have the entire offensive unit run. Hopefully this will make the ball carrier realize that a fumble hurts everyone.

### Defense (Creating turnovers)

1. Begin by teaching the players how to make a fumble recovery. We tell our players not to dive directly on the ball but rather to surround the ball with as much of their body as possible.
2. As a rule of thumb we simply try to cover any ball fumbled beyond the line of scrimmage (LOS). If the ball is fumbled behind the LOS we will try to scoop and score. Stress bending the knees to get low on the scoop and tuck it away immediately.
3. We incorporate fumbles into our agility drills. On our stepover drills we include fumbles both behind and beyond the LOS.
4. Include some competitive fumble drills (2-3 players).
5. We have planned fumbles as a part of our pursuit drills including a "desperation strip" at the end.

### Special Teams

We try to practice every possible turnover scenario in our special teams preparation. This includes bad snaps by us and our opponents, the difference between a muff and a fumble, a batted ball, etc.

### Conditioning

Well conditioned football teams are always in a position to make the "big" recovery especially in the 4th quarter.

Our emphasis on turnovers has paid huge dividends. In 1995 our turnover ratio of +20 was a key factor in our appearance in the State Finals.

## The Program Frankfort and the Veer

In the last 15 years, Frankfort High School has appeared in the Michigan High School Football playoff picture 11 times – five times at the Pontiac Silverdome, and has won the State Championship twice. Much of this success is due to former Head Coach, Tim Klein, (now Head Coach at Roscommon High School). Since then, Frankfort has appeared in the playoffs two out of the last three years and has averaged 30 points per game.

The Veer Offense is a triple-option read concept attack that can be devastatingly executed against all defensive alignments from a multitude of offensive sets. At Frankfort we believe that the veer is a big-play offense that breeds excitement, is fun to play and coach and helps to produce a motivated, confident, and explosive offensive unit.

Many coaches claim that they cannot run the Veer because they don't have a good enough quarterback. The fact of the matter is that the coach has to devote time to develop a quarterback at an early age. At Frankfort our quarterbacks start running the Veer in Pop-Warner, progressing to the Junior High and finally to the Junior Varsity and Varsity level. However, it is not the early age that guarantees the great Veer

quarterback at the Varsity level; rather it is the system or approach that the coach(es) put forth. Another claim that some coaches make is that they use the Veer once in awhile in their offensive strategies. One needs only to talk to a true Veer coach to realize that, "you don't just run the Veer once in awhile." The Veer is your *Package* and you run other plays off of the Veer. It takes a lot of time to perfect, but time is a variable we can control and will use to perfection through daily repetition. At Frankfort, we will rep the inside and outside Veer almost 20 minutes a day. During the 30 minute period, the coaches will periodically blow the whistle and yell out "Whose play is this?" From which the response is "FRANKFORT's!" thus developing pride and motivation to execute correctly.

The following is a list of reasons why we at Frankfort believe the Veer offense is the greatest offense in football:

1. You can win with less talent.
2. It is effective anywhere on the field.
3. It pressures the opponent to defend the entire field.
4. It is effective against any defense.
5. You don't need superior size, just superior effort.
6. It forces the opponent to play assignment football.
7. You can perfect a minimum of plays while giving the defense a multitude of looks.

## Team's academic honor special for coach

Football coach Jim Galvin held up the ring he was wearing, then pointed to the plaque he was holding after Monday night's Sparta area school board meeting. "This plaque means just as much to me as this ring does," Galvin said.

Galvin earned the ring while at Catholic Central when the Cougars won a state championship in 1987. He was presented the plaque at Monday's meeting, and it honored his Sparta team from last fall that earned Academic All-State honors.

Galvin, who recently stepped down as the Sparta football coach after six seasons, accepted the award in front of 11 of his players and the school board.

"Football is usually associated as a violent game, but this also shows that it's an intelligent game," Galvin said. "It's a lot more than just knocking heads."

"Our team went 0-9 this fall, but this was the most enjoyable team that I have had since I got here. Their intelligence and knowledge helped them come through an 0-9 season. It's about more than wins and losses. It taught them how to use their time and put things in perspective."

Galvin has coached football in the area for the past 31 years, including 21 years at the varsity level. Galvin won 100 games at Hudsonville and Catholic Central combined during

a 15-year span, but victories have been difficult to come by at Sparta. The Spartans have been unable to win more than two games in any one season.

While Galvin has stepped down, he said he hasn't ruled out the possibility of coaching football in the future. He will continue to teach at Sparta High School and coach varsity baseball.

The academic award closed Galvin's football coaching career at Sparta on a high note. This is the second year that the Michigan High School Football Coaches Association began selecting the top academic team in each class and the Spartans earned top honors in Class BB.

In order to be eligible, coaches were required to send in the names of 11 players and their grade point averages, and the players had to receive regular playing time. Galvin submitted a team grade point average of 3.65.

The Spartans were first notified that they earned the award this past winter. Allendale coach, Jim DeHorn, who is a member of the football coaches association, [Region 9 Director] presented the award to Galvin.

"As a representative of the association, we wanted to make sure the people of Sparta know how significant this award is," DeHorn said. "Not only is this a positive reflection of the program, but the whole community."

## MHSCA/Gatorade 15 and 25 Year Coaching Service Award Certificates

- May combine sports coached but may not count more than one sport any school year
- May use years at the varsity, junior varsity, or junior high/middle school level
- May apply for certificate in more than one sport if you qualify for 15 or 25 years in each sport

### Specific requirements

- To receive a 15 year certificate, must have been a coach in a particular sport for 15 school years
- To receive a 25 year certificate, must have been a coach in a particular sport for 25 school years
