#### Proposal 16 Supported by MHSFCA

#### Woody Thomas is 1998 Jim Crowley Award Recipient

After serving three years in the U.S. Army, Woody began his teaching career at Carver High School in Gadsden, Alabama in 1959 where he served as an assistant coach. His next teaching position was at Jones High School in Lewisburg, Tennessee where he coached football, basketball, and boys' and girls' track; he served as athletic director in Lewisburg from 1963-1965.

Coming to Detroit, Michigan in 1965, our recipient started coaching football and track at Detroit Northern High School. At Northern, he won the first City and State Boys' Track Championship in 1972. He became an assistant football coach at Detroit Central High School in 1973 and served in that capacity until 1980. In 1980, he became head football coach and currently holds that position along with being the boys' track coach.

Woody has been distinguished with several awards. In 1972, he received the Detroit News Coach of the Year Award and the Michigan Chronicle Coach of the Year Award. Since then he has won ten city and 16 Regional Championships and eight Coach of the Year Awards for Track & Field. Along with those awards, he received the MHSCA Coach of the Year Award in 1981, the District Coach of the Year Award, the 1981 WJBK Man of the Year Community Award, the 1995 Superintendent's Outstanding Service Award, the 1995 Board of Education

Award, and the Detroit Coaches Achievement Award for 1996.

Other awards which highlight Coach Thomas' career include the MITCA 30 Year Award in Track and Field, the MHSCA Coaching Service Award for 35 years in football; and in 1996, he was inducted into the Tennessee State Hall of Fame. His career in Athletics has had a tremendous impact on the lives of the students with whom he has come in contact, including former U-M football star Thomas Wilcher, Dr. Shawn Abernathy, and Captain Anthony Berry.

In addition to his involvement in athletics, our recipient is firmly

connected to the community. At Lovejoy Church of God in Christ, he serves as Chairman of the Men's Board. He has also been quite involved with children in the community. For the past five years, he has been in a volunteer summer program for Track and Field in which over 200 children participate.

Somehow through all of this, he has managed to compile an outstanding football record of 147 wins and only 47



### 1998 High School Football Rules Changes Address Safety

afety was the underlying theme of many of the rules changes adopted for the 1998 high school football season by the NFHS Football Rules Committee.

At it's January 3-4 meeting in Marco Island, Florida, the Football Rules Committee, which is composed of one voting member from each NFHS member state high school association, adopted two rules changes and four points of emphasis dealing with safety issues.

"After a great deal of discussion and consideration of several proposed rules changes, some of which would have been a major step away from the rules committee's basic penalty administration philosophy, the committee accepted very few changes," said Rex Jones, associate director of the Nebraska School Activities Association and chair of the NFHS Football Rules Committee. "In this coming year, with very few rules changes, the committee hopes that interpreters will spend more of their time with coaches and officials to make the high school game as safe as possible."

Safety-related rules changes approved by the committee dealt with use of eye shields and use of hands by defensive players.

Rule 1-5-3m now prohibits the use of eye shields with less than 100 percent allowable light transmission. The committee believes that the eye shield must be clear so that officials can readily see the player's eyes in the case of serious injury.

In another safety-related change, the rule stating that a defensive player cannot use his hand(s) to slap a blocker's head has been moved to the section dealing with illegal personal contact, and the penalty for such offense has been increased from 10 to 15 yards.

The committee also identified four points of emphasis dealing with safety concern: Unnecessary and illegal contact against ball carriers, unnecessary contact with players after the play, legal and illegal equipment, and illegal contact below the waist.

"Unsafe acts and techniques cannot be tolerated by those responsible for the game of football," said Jerry Diehl, assistant director of the NFHS and editor of the high school football rules. "Coaches and officials must act decisively to eliminate, to the greatest extent possible, threats to the welfare of football players. Those responsible for the administration of interscholastic football need to exercise leadership and active supervision of the player-safety aspects of the game."

In other changes, the committee approved a clarification for Rule 2-4-1 as follows: "A player making a catch, recovery or interception must first come down inbounds or be prevented from returning to the ground inbounds by being contacted by an opponent in such a manner that the ball will become dead because forward progress has been stopped."

Two changes regarding equipment will take effect in 1998. Numbers on players' uniforms must be legible in addition to being clearly visible, and the committee authorized the use of numbers that are comprised of more than one color.

The NFHS Board of Directors approved a change in the size of a logo/trade name on uniforms that will affect all sports for which the NFHS writes playing rules. Beginning in

1998, a logo/trade name must not exceed 2 1/4 inches square and 2 1/4 inches in any dimension. The previous maximum allowance was 1 1/2 by 11/2 inches square.

One clarification was made with regard to duties of officials. The committee agreed that the officials' jurisdiction for penalty assessment for unsportsmanlike acts begins when the officials assume authority for the contest.

One change was made in the football field diagram, which provides for the optional use of yard numbers and oneyard extensions when marking fields.

In addition to the aforementioned changes in 11-player football, the committee adopted a couple of changes in nineand six-player football. In the nine-player game, state associations may adopt field dimensions of their choice; and, in the six-player game, the committee specified that a direct handoff, in addition to the clear pass, are legal prior to the ball crossing the line of scrimmage.

In terms of participants, football is the most popular high school sport for boys, with 957,507 participants according to the 1996-97 NFHS Athletics Participation Survey. In terms of school sponsorship, football ranks fourth (13,119) behind basketball, outdoor track and field, and baseball.

- Must have distinguished himself/herself with good coaching ethics and promoted good sportsmanship in their coaching
- May use up to ten years coaching outside Michigan
- May use years as an assistant as well as years as a head coach
- May combine sports coached but may not count more than one sport any school year
- May use years at the varsity, junior varsity, or junior high/middle school level
- May apply for certificate in more than one sport if you qualify for 15 or 25 years in each sport

#### Specific requirements

- To receive a 15 year certificate, must have been a coach in a particular sport for 15 school years
- To receive a 25 year certificate, must have been a coach in a particular sport for 25 school years
