All Star Program Materials Due March 15

Coaches of All Star players, remember that all program materials are due March 15. It is very important that you help your All Star organize to meet the sponsorship goal... \$1000, and get it turned in on time. The increased goal, needed to ensure the game's solvency, will mean an even larger program. More pages means more time to put the program together and more time to get it

printed. Do your part by getting your player to turn in his materials by the deadline! Note: Players are NOT required to sell ANY ads in order to participate in the game, (The ONLY requirement is that they turn in a photograph and biographical sketch.) but community sponsorships... ads, provide the majority of the financing for the game.

Letters**"Cluster Kick"**

The following letter is in response to a letter written December 5, 1998, by Rules Committee Chair, Pete Coll, at the direction of the MHSFCA Board of Directors.

... Although there were no new adoptions on kickoff rules for this year (at the National Football Rules Committee meeting), there will be two items included on the national questionnaire for 1999 and will then be considered for rules changes in January 2000. Michigan proposed the items and will support the changes when proposed next year.

1. For any free kick, there shall be a minimum of four players on either side of the ball until the ball is kicked.
2. For any free kick, a member of K may not block R until he is eligible to touch the ball.

The 1999 Jim Crowley Award is Presented to East Lansing's Jeff Smith

The Jim Crowley Award is presented in the memory of the late Jim Crowley, a great coach and dedicated family man who was tragically killed at the height of his career in 1980 at the age of 45. Coach Crowley stressed having fun, playing hard, and being dedicated to doing your best to the many young men he coached in seventeen seasons at Jackson St. John's and Lumen Christi High Schools.

Our 1999 recipient is a 1958 graduate of Kohler High School in Kohler, Wisconsin, where he captained the football team as a senior and earned a scholarship to the University of Michigan. After playing at Michigan and graduating in 1963 he began his teaching and coaching career at Hale High School as the head basketball coach and football assistant. In 1964 he moved on to Grass Lake High School and was there from 1964 to 1967. From there he went to East Lansing High School in 1967 to teach mathematics and assist in football and track. In 1968, Coach Smith landed his first head coaching job as he became the head football and head track coach of St. John's High School. The fall of 1971 brought Jeff back to East Lansing High School as the head football and assistant track coach. The past 28 years have found him at the helm of the Trojan football program, and since 1989, the track program as well. In all, he has spent 36 years as a math teacher, 36 years as a football coach, and 35 years as a track coach.

Jeff Smith has won many coaching honors including: MHSFCA Regional Coach-of-the-Year, MHSFCA Coach-of-the-Year in Class A (1991), Associated Press Coach-of-the-Year, and Detroit News Coach-of-the-Year. Coach Smith is the only coach to have

won a state football title and track title since the football playoffs began in 1975. His football teams have been conference champions 15 times in his 28 years at East Lansing, Regional champions five times, State Class A runner-up in 1983 and State Champions in 1991. (Who can forget the guard around play he ran for a touchdown in that state title game?)

Jeff has given a great amount of service to the game of football in the State of Michigan. He met with Dave Driscoll of Jackson Parkside High School in 1971 and discussed having a clinic for coaches; what evolved was not only a clinic but the organization to which most of us in this room belong - the MHSFCA. Coach Smith was one of the original directors of the MHSFCA, its first clinic director (for four years), an officer (President in 1978) and, as a Past President, has maintained a very active role in the organization. He was active in getting the MHSAA to approve an all-star football game and was the head coach for the west in the inaugural game in 1981.

His football teams have been conference champions 15 times in his 28 years at East Lansing, Regional champions five times, State Class A runner-up in 1983 and State Champions in 1991. (Who can forget the guard around play he ran for a touchdown in that state title game?)

Our 1999 recipient, much like Coach Crowley, is a players' and a coaches' coach; he is able to take a strength a person has, whether that be a student, player, coach, or staff member, and help him develop that strength to his fullest. He has the confidence and willingness to adopt new ideas and techniques so that his program will continually improve. He is willing to have coaches

over to his home at any time for informal clinics to share his philosophy. (Just like Radio Shack - you have questions, he has answers.) The number of athletes who stay in touch with him by dropping by, calling, or writing is phenomenal. In the fall of 1997 many former players held a reunion with their coach by attending a game, playing a touch football game the next day on their old field, and having a dinner that night at which they lovingly roasted their "coach." In addition, several of his former players have come back to coach for him.

It is with a great deal of pleasure that we present the Jim Crowley Award for 1999 to this fine representative of the game we love, not only for his work within our association, but also for his many contributions to the game of football and to the lives of the countless number of players he has coached during his thirty-six-year career.

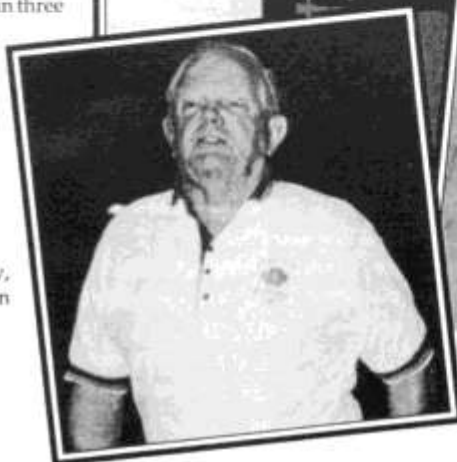
