


# Albert Fracassa, Brother Rice High School

 ${\mathcal A}$ 

lbert Fracassa graduated cum laude from Detroit Northeastern High School in 1951 as the president of his class; along with his academic success he was an All-City Baseball player and All-City and All-State Football player, which led to an athletic scholarship to Michigan State University as a quarterback. While at MSU from 1951 through

graduation in 1955 Al was a member of the 1952 National Champion Team, as well as the 1954 Rose Bowl team and received the Fred Danziger Award in 1954 in recognition of outstanding contributions to the MSU football team.

Coach Fracassa began his teaching and coaching career in the fall of 1955 as an assistant coach at Flint Mandeville High School, spent 1956-57 in the United States Army, then taught and assisted at Rochester High School in 1958 and 1959. In 1960 he became the head football coach at Royal Oak Shrine, compiling a 44-19-5 record through the 1968 season. In 1969 he became the head football coach at Brother Rice High School and has been there for the past 35 years, compiling a 288-72-2 record along with 10 Detroit Catholic League Championships, 17 playoff appearances, 9 state final appearances and 5 state championships; his 1974 team won a mythical Class "A" state title the year prior to the beginning of the playoff system. With a career record of 332-91-7, Al is the winningest coach in the history of Michigan High School Football.

Coach Fracassa's won-lost record, numerous Catholic League and State Titles, Regional and State Coach of the Year and Hall of Fame selections (both state and nationally), and his experience as a speaker at numerous Coach of the Year Clinics throughout the country has established a résumé of unsurpassed achievement. It is very easy to defend the assertion that he is one of the greatest coaches in the history of Michigan high school football. Simply admiring the achievements mentioned above, however, would do a great disservice to our recipient. The true measure of this man is not a lifetime of gridiron accomplishment, but rather a lifetime of commitment to the virtues of selflessness, sacrifice, dedication and love.

It is these qualities, particularly his love for his players, that make Al Fracassa a remarkable man and so deserving of the Jim Crowley Award. His devotion to the young men who play for him is absolute and everlasting and his players respond to that love with the totality of effort that has become the hallmark of Brother Rice football. Coach Fracassa knows the X's and 0's of football as well as anyone, but his true genius lies in his unmatched ability to elevate the human spirit. He develops superior football teams because his primary

concern is the development of young men of superior character.

Henry Adams once wrote that "A teacher affects eternity; he never knows where his influence will end." Because of him thousands of young men have learned invaluable lessons on the football field that they later used to establish themselves as honorable, productive adults. Because of him there are countless former players of his who are now business owners who understand the importance of integrity, doctors who understand the value of compassion, military officers and government officials who understand the necessity of leadership, and husbands and fathers who understand the power of faith and love.

Coach Al Fracassa's influence has gone far beyond the gridiron and will affect generations of young men and women whom he will never meet. This achievement dwarfs anything his teams have accomplished on the football field; he has brought great credit and distinction to Michigan high school football and to the entire coaching profession.

It is our honor to present the 2004 Jim Crowley Award to Coach Albert Fracassa of Birmingham Brother Rice High School.

# What is The Jim Crowley Award?

im Crowley was, for 17 years, the head coach at Jackson St. John High School and its successor, Jackson Lumen Christi. During those years his teams compiled a record of 127-34-6. That included four unbeaten seasons and Class B State Championships in 1977 and 1979. Coach Crowley served the MHSFCA as Chair of the Public Relations Committee for several years.

Jim Crowley stressed having fun, working hard and being

Jim Crowley stressed having fun, working hard and being dedicated to the young men he coached. He often said, "If you don't have fun playing football, it isn't worth the time and effort you put into it." Coach Crowley's young men took that bit of philosophy to heart and had a great deal of success, not only on the football field, but in life as well.

Coach Crowley was shot and killed in his own driveway just two months after the 1979 state football finals. To this day, no one has been charged with his murder.

Jim Crowley was a football coach, and a very good coach at that. His legacy lives on not only as a fine coach but also as a tremendous leader of young men, an active member of his church, school and community and a loving father and husband.

The Jim Crowley Award is presented to no more than one member of the MHSFCA in any given year. The award is based on contributions a coach has made to football in Michigan as well as contributions the coach has made to the Michigan High School Football Coaches Association. This is the most prestigious award our association gives.

# Hall of Fame Coaches

W

ith the induction in 1982 of its founding Board of Directors, the Michigan High School Football Coaches Association initiated its Hall of Fame. To qualify for the Hall of Fame a coach must have either 20 years of high school football coaching in Michigan or have recorded 100 high school victories in Michigan.

Under the direction of its first and only chair, MHSFCA Past President Tom Fagan, the Hall of Fame Banquet has thrived. The annual awards banquet is one of the most prestigious events of its

kind in Michigan, regularly drawing 600-800 "fans."

# **Bill Hollenbeck Publishes Snap Decisions**

## Snap Decisions: **Unleashing The Power of Audibles**

ill Hollenbeck coached high school football in Michigan for 28 years. He enjoyed outstanding success during his 19 years at Maple City Glen Lake, winning many conference and regional titles, a State Championship in 1994, and the State Runner-Up in 1996. He has received numerous awards, including the Michigan High School Football Coaches Regional Coach of the Year seven times, Coach of the Year in 1994 and 2001, and the Associated Press Coach of the Year in 1989.

While using this system during his last eight years at Glen Lake, Coach Hollenbeck's record was 76-15. He was inducted into the MHFSCA Hall of Fame in 2001.

#### About the Book:

This book was written in an effort to show how to identify faults in defensive alignment, and with the use of audibles, the means to attack those weaknesses instantaneously! Using the veer offense as a basis, it illustrates a simple progression system that any quarterback can follow, and any teammate can understand.

This revolutionary system gives an intelligent advantage to offensive play calling. It offers an offensive scheme that has been cultivated over time and invites cognitive involvement by each team member. When players walk to the line, they approach it with a certain intellectual awareness, and the confidence in knowing that whatever play is called, it will have a great opportunity for success. It gives players ownership, keeps them mentally aware, and most importantly, "it makes the game

How often are good running plays stopped by simple defensive alignment changes? Offensive coaches often fall prey to these

adjustments and can be heard saying "if I knew they were going to do that, I would have called a different play!" What they should probably be saying is "I guessed wrong, again!"

Early in my career I often became frustrated by defensive coaches that stopped our most effective run plays simply by adjusting player alignment. Even though play calling was a result of recognizing defensive tendencies, it was still guesswork and far from a science. After much self-analysis, I realized that my football team was limited by my own inability to consistently determine the most effective play to call.


It was with this in mind that I began to incorporate audibles and, in specific situations, give the quarterback the freedom to call a limited number of plays from the line of scrimmage. The results were very successful and the system has been embellished and given a name.

T-Reads became a simple moniker telling the offense to, within boundaries, "call your own play!"

For years, from the sideline, I would simply point at the quarterback, my signal for telling him it was his call, then step back and wait to see what happened. Our coaches didn't know if the ball was going right, left, straight, or who was going to end up with it. But because of the simplicity of the system, and the confidence we had in our ability to prepare the players, it was now a science, it was measurable, problems identifiable, and simple to adjust week-to-week.

The enthusiasm created was incalculable, every play exciting, and our offensive production increased greatly! In the eight years prior to my departure from Glen Lake our record was 76-15. This system is the single biggest factor attributed to the success of our offense, and the players loved it!

It just can't get any simpler than this!



# MHSCA/Gatorade 15/20/25/30/35/40/45 Year Coaching Service Award Certificates
