Driscoll's Parkside teams won four conference titles and were one of the top five teams in the state on two occasions. Dave helped develop former Parkside stars Mike Hurd (MSU) and Tony Dungy (Minnesota). Prior to his long tenure at Parkside, he held head coaching jobs at Ypsilanti (1965-67), East Jackson (1962) and St. Mary's of Jackson (1958-61).

Driscoll was selected regional coach of the year in 1969 and 1972 at Parkside and also was a founder and first president of the Michigan High School Football Coaches Association in 1972. Driscoll played under Muddy Waters at Hillsdale College, 1954-57, and also won two letters in baseball there. Born 11-16-35 in Albion, he attended Albion High. He earned a bachelor's degree from Hillsdale and a master's from the University of Detroit. Dave and his wife, Stella, have five children.

Michigan High School Football Hall Of Fame

Since 1972 when our association was founded, we have helped promote high school football in our state. The officers and regional directors have steadily moved our association forward. The annual clinic is the finest one anywhere.

The football playoffs have helped promote football excellence in our state and made us the envy of our neighboring states.

All of the many committees that our directors promote in areas of scholarship, rules, political action, membership, public relations, finance, honorary membership, memorial funds, as well as the enactment of an All Star football game on August 8, 1981, along with the establishment of historian's records, have made it necessary to start a "Hall of Fame" in Michigan.

The M.H.S.F.C.A. Hall of Fame consists of our Charter and By-Laws, Association Seal and Flag, honorary members, yearly officers and directors, football playoff champions Coaches of the Year in all classes, special football achievements by Hudson High School, historian's records, Jim Crowley Award, coaches with 20 years of football coaching and all coaches with 100 or more career victories, and finally the team members of each All Star Team.

This is truly a vast undertaking and we will need the cooperation of all the high school football coaches in Michigan. We are asking you to buy a "Gold Brick" for \$100.00 through your football team, your Varsity Club, or your parents, boosters or Dads Clubs. This "Gold Brick" will help build our funds to secure all of the necessary materials for our "Hall of Fame" and permanently place your school, nickname and year of pledge on the Michigan High School Football Coaches Seal.

Selection Process

In 1988 Jack Carlson, football coach at Holland West Ottawa High School, was appointed Historian of the Michigan High School Football Coaches Association. Jack replaced Harley Pierce of Sturgis High School, Past President and Historian of the M.H.S.F.C.A.

Adopting the format used by Harley Pierce, Jack computerized all of the information from the applications to the Hall of Fame as received from the applicants. Presently, Jack has well over 100 candidates to be inducted at a future date into the Hall of Fame. In 1987 the Hall of Fame Committee, headed by Chairman Tom Fagan, decided to induct approximately 20 candidates a year. With such a large number of potential candidates, it was necessary to set up specific criteria to determine those most worthy of receiving the honor of being inducted.


The initial program indicated only those who had 100 victories and or 20 seasons of coaching high school football in Michigan were eligible for induction. This criteria still remains as the basic plan of the M.H.S.F.C.A.

Additionally, the Hall of Fame Committee has established the following guidelines in determining the new inductees:

- The date the application was received by the committee.
- 2. The age and health of the new applicant.

egotiations with the University of Michigan, relative to the architectural planning of the Hall of Fame building continue... The basic plan and location of the building (just north of the tunnel, on the east side of the stadium) seem to be acceptable. Modifications to the building, however, will almost surely see the removal of the football shape on the roof. The MHSFCA Board of Directors were very much in favor of the distinctive design, but University officials have been adamant about a replacing the football with a, "domed" roof, "more in keeping with the adjacent Crisler Arena roof line."

Financing

Our architect's estimates for the project, between \$1.3 and \$1.6 million, were confirmed as viable at a recent meeting with University officials. These same officials provided very useful (and encouraging) advice about fund raising strategies.

Progress

- In an early April meeting former Michigan Head Coach and AD Bo Schembechler agreed to support our fund raising efforts by attending preliminary negotiations with a potentially major corporate sponsor.
- At the Spring Meeting the Board of

Directors proposed and passed a dues increase of \$10 annually (effective with your 1998-99 membership) five dollars to be "earmarked" which augment the approximately \$100,000 currently invested and available for the project.

- Bill Tucker, Past President, Flint Powers High School, has a commitment for the donation of the excavation for the building.
- There is a possibility that the concrete work necessary for the project will be donated by another firm.
- At least one area builder has also volunteered to help.

Progress is clearly being made, but we're still a long way from ground breaking. We still need your help with ideas for fund raising and sweat donations!

West Head Coach Jim Eurick – Bay City Western

On January 20, 1997 Jim Eurick began a new chapter in his life as he accepted the head coaching position with the Warriors at Bay City Western.



Prior to this latest move, Jim taught and coached at Saginaw Arthur Hill High School in his home town. During his tenure in Saginaw, the Lumberjacks won the Class AA State Football Championship in 1991 and followed this with a State Finalist appearance in 1992. Four Saginaw Valley Championships and five Playoff appearances took place during Coach Eurick's twelve seasons at the "Hill" their overall record was 86-35.

- To receive a 15 year certificate, must have been a coach in a particular sport for 15 school years
- To receive a 25 year certificate, must have been a coach in a particular sport for 25 school years
