Campaign to Renovate Elmer Engel Stadium

from the Bay City Central Athletic Fund, Inc.

The Elmer Engel Stadium is a Bay City landmark that will celebrate its 75th Anniversary in the year 2000. At a cost of \$45,000 to construct in 1925, the stadium is now in need of serious repair after years of minimal maintenance. To bring the stadium to a safe, suitable condition it will cost nearly \$1.5 million. Alumni and community support, corporate participation and foundation funding – combined with the commitment of our board and volunteers – will help turn this formidable fund-raising goal into reality.

The Central High School Athletic Fund will accomplish this first project, and future projects without diverting funds from academics. With today's emphasis on quality education, we have aligned ourselves with educators to provide a well-balanced educational experience for the youth of our community. Research confirms a positive impact on a student's performance in their academic studies by participation in sports and other recreational activities!

The first game played in the stadium was the season's opener on September 26, 1925 between Bay City Central and Detroit Western.

In the early seventies the stadium was renamed Elmer Engel Stadium in honor of legendary coach Elmer Engel.

This project is three-phase structural renovation of Elmer Engel Stadium located at Bay City Central High School.

Phase 1 includes structural renovation of the West Side stands consisting of removal of loosened concrete, railings and seating. A new layer of concrete was poured to resurface the topside, new railings, seating and fencing were added and installed. Loosened concrete was removed from the underside of the stands and patched. The renovated stands were painted. This phase of the project is complete.

Phase 2 of the project will consist of the same structural renovation of the East Side stands. It is anticipated that this phase will begin in the spring of 1998 with an anticipated completion date of August 15, 1998.

Phase 3 will include renovation and restoration of bathroom facilities, repair of locker rooms and updating of pressbox. This project could be done in conjunction with Phase 2 if the funds are available. It is hoped that this project could be completed by the beginning of the 1999 football season.

A Great Night for High School Football

It was a great night for high school football and 30 newly inducted members to the Michigan High School Football Coaches Hall of Fame. The inductees were unanimous in their appreciation stating that the banquet and their induction was one of the greatest thrills of their long coaching careers.

Helping to make it a great night for high school football were short, inspiring talks by National College Coaches of the Year Lloyd Carr and Jim Herrmann of the University of Michigan and Al Fracassa of Birmingham Brother Rice who was selected as National High School Coach of the Year. This was a once in a lifetime event for the MHSFCA as both Coach Carr and Coach Herrmann were former Michigan High School players who received their early coaching and playing experience at such schools as Riverview, Divine Child, Nativity, Belleville, Harper Woods Notre Dame and Orchard Lake St. Mary's. Coach Carr's first head coaching job was at Westland John Glenn where he won Regional Coach of the Year honors from our association. Of course, Al Fracassa of Birmingham Brother Rice, a past member of our Hall of Fame is already a legend in high school football coaching ranks. The MHSFCA is proud to have one of our active members recognized as National High School Coach of the Year. This trio of great coaches helped to make this a memorable experience for the inductees and their loyal admirers.

The inductees, most with over 25 years of coaching high school were lavish in their praise of their families, communities and fellow coaches in making this "mountain top" experience possible. Some insight into the character and dedication of these Hall of Famers can be found in typical comments made by the inductees on what coaching has meant to them and why they coach.

The inductees responded to the question: What football coaching has meant to you: "The opportunity to be a part of a great game, coaching some fine young men, working with some dedicated coaches, coaching against some outstanding coaches and being involved in a school and community that really cared about athletics" and "Seeing 11 young men working together, unselfishly for a common goal is an amazing thing. Developing unity and team pride and pride in one's self is as important as winning a championship.

Typical answers to the question why coach? "Because I love it. The people, the players, the camaraderie, the traditions, the memories that make up the tapestry we call football" also, "it is honorable to work with our youth. It is a satisfaction unparalleled in other experiences. When you see a football player give his all, see him improve and see him achieve at levels he could only dream of before - that's true job satisfaction at it's best."

Another inductee stated that "football is a pure form of

teaching and I am an educator. Coaching allows me to be close to the game I love and to share in the thrills and excitement with players and fellow coaches. Secondly, I enjoy the challenge of competition that coaching brings to my life."

All of the Hall of Famers were very humble, and credited everyone else for their success. The following statement is an example. "I am humbled by my inclusion into this great fraternity of football coaches. When I began this adventure I could never have imagined that one day I too would be included in a group of men - "FOOTBALL COACHES", that I had grown up idolizing. I am truly the lucky one!

WE are truly the lucky ones, to have the opportunity to recognize such an outstanding group of coaches - Hall of Famers in every sense of the word.
