It was a great night for high school football as over 600 people crowded into Crisler Arena to honor their favorite son. During the course of a fun filled evening 19 of Michigan's finest coaches were inducted into the Hall of Fame, bringing the total number inducted into the hall since 1982 to 418 coaches.

Coach Lloyd Carr coming off another Big Ten Championship season was the keynote speaker for the banquet. Coach Carr recounted his high school coaching days at Nativity High School, Belleville High School and Westland John Glenn High School, where he was head coach three years and won Regional Class A Coach of the Year honors in 1975. Our association and members are very proud to have a high school football coach go on to national prominence as a college football coach. Coach Carr did a great job in honoring the Hall of Famers for their dedication, commitment to excellence and the tremendous influence they have had on their players and communities. He also showed his class as he graciously signed autographs and posed for pictures with all the inductees, their families and friends. Coach Carr is a great representative of Michigan football and college football in general. He was instrumental in making the banquet a memorable event for all in attendance. Thanks, Coach Carr.

The inductees were once again a humble and modest group of coaches. Their remarks to questions used as part of their introductions best describes the character of the inductees and their dedication to their profession.

In response to the question what coaching has meant to each of them, Dan Armstrong of Gobles High School stated, "The experience of the relationship between a coach and a student athlete is above all relationships. Secondly, there is gratification in meeting with and totally enjoying the comradery of staff members and other coaching peers I have had the pleasure of knowing throughout these years. The learning experience and friendship with these special people will never be forgotten.

Lastly, I know that the coaching profession not only teaches the student athlete methods on and off the field, but it may have a positive impact on him that lasts a lifetime."

In answering the question, "Why coach?" Jim DeHorn of Allendale stated, "Coaching touches the lives of the most influential young men of each generation through the unique venue of the only true 'Team Sport,' molding them into strong, courageous, self-sacrificing, moral leaders of tomorrow." Wesley Carlos of Mount Clemens L'Anse Creuse said his biggest thrill in coaching is, "having my grandkids call me 'Coachie'." The humorous incidents related were too many to enumerate, but they kept the 600 people in attendance laughing throughout the evening. Dar Christianson of Davison spoke for all the candidates when he stated, I was deeply humbled by this honor and I shed tears when notified. I wish to thank my wife and five children for their sacrifices and support for making my dreams come true. I am grateful to my players, my assistant coaches, parents and administrators who made my career a success. I also want to thank the Michigan High School Coaches Association for remembering and completing the dream. God Bless."

One Hall of Fame inductee summarized the feeling of all when he stated, "The only word that I can think of to describe the Hall of Fame Banquet is 'fantastic'. Being an inductee this year is one of the highlights of not only my coaching career, but of my entire life. My family and I will never forget it."

Under the direction of its first and only chair, MHSFCA Past President Tom Fagan, the Hall of Fame Banquet has thrived. The annual awards banquet is one of the most prestigious events in the State of Michigan.
