he Michigan High School Football Coaches Association is celebrating 32 years of steady growth. Our membership has been around the 2500 mark for the last several years as the members enjoy more and more benefits and opportunities. The officers and board of directors, past and present, have leveloped this association over time into a true model for other coaches associations across the state. The primary stated goal of the MHSFCA is to promote high school football in the state of Michigan. Some of the highlights of a typical year in this association include:



- 1. The Winner's Circle Football Clinic at Battle Creek. The last weekend in January is filled with outstanding high school and college speakers climaxing with our "Road to the Dome" series on Saturday morning. Enthusiastic attendance by our members makes this one of the best-attended high school clinics in the nation. Following the clinic, the annual awards luncheon recognizes our state and regional coaches-of-the-year, the Jim Crowley Memorial Award recipient, the Steve Spicer Team Leadership Award winners, and the Honorary Membership recipients for their contributions to high school football.
- The Hall of Fame induction and banquet in Ann Arbor. In the spring the association inducts 24 long time Michigan high school coaches who have

coached a minimum of 20 years or reached 100 victories. These men have compiled a tremendous record of developing the young people of this state into responsible adults through the game of football.

- 3. All-Star weekend in East Lansing. This is probably the busiest time of the year for the MHSFCA. The football teams are composed of 88 of the best players in the state who play in a premier contest at an outstanding facility. In addition, the game is an opportunity to showcase the winning squads from the Michigan Cheerleading Coaches Association competition and an All-Star Band composed of high school musicians from around the state. This weekend also provides a golf scramble outing as a fundraiser for the Fraser Program, which provides books for underprivileged elementary school children across the state. Before the game, the morning is devoted to our annual Leadership Conference that brings several hundred team leaders together to learn techniques to take back to their schools for the season. At halftime the winners of the MHSFCA competitive scholarships and the Terry Rose Memorial Scholarship are presented with their awards.
- 4. The season. While the fall is filled with game plans, practice sessions and, of course, the games, the MHSFCA board of directors is busy with their duties. Coach-of-the-year balloting, choosing Academic All State Teams and individuals, and All-Star team selections are all chores that are completed during the fall. It is amazing to observe the achievements of these top student-athletes year after year. The MHSFCA was also instrumental in the establishment

and expansion of the statewide playoff system, which has become a highlight of excellence for football players and fans in Michigan.

The association is currently working toward the establishment of a permanent Hall of Fame building as a long-term project. Many hours of work and effort have gone into this project, but many hurdles still need to be cleared. One problem is raising the money necessary for the project. You can help by making sure your school is a "Gold Brick" member of the Hall of Fame. If you are willing and able to help with this project, please contact an officer or director today.

We also are trying to expand into the youth football field. By providing a positive experience for the young players we believe that we will make high school football in the state stronger. If you have any type of youth football program please send the names and addresses of the coaches to our executive director Don Lessner. We have several clinics planned around the state between now and next season and would love to have your program participate.

This gives you an overview of what the Michigan High School Football Coaches Association does. If you are a member, I congratulate and thank you. 2004 Terry Rose Scholarship Winner

The \$1000 Terry Rose Memorial Scholarship is chosen by lottery at the Hall of Fame banquet in Ann Arbor. All children of MHSFCA members are eligible for the drawing in nemory of Past President and former Clinic Chair, Terry Rose. Members need only to submit names of their children who are continuing or will continue their education beyond high school (in the same year as submitted).

This year's winner, Jacqueline Goosen, is a student at Wright State University, Dayton, Ohio, where she is working on a degree in teacher education. Her plans include teaching and coaching.

Shall the MHSFCA Re-District? How?

t the Clinic in Battle Creek a committee of the MHSFCA met to discuss the possibility of re-aligning the association's regions. The MHSFCA has always used the regional organization of the MEA (with the Upper Peninsula grouped into one region, 16). The primary motivation for re-organization is to establish better communications between members and their representatives on the MHSFCA board of directors.

The proposal below attempts to group conferences in contiguous geographic areas to create regions of approximately equal numbers of schools. Independants are grouped geographically. The premis is that coaches know other coaches in their league better than they know coaches in their MEA Region and will be better able to select a representative that

understands their positions. Equal numbers, of course, mean equal representation.

This is a draft proposal. Introduced at the spring meeting of the board of directors, many improvements were suggested. There are several difficulties including huge leagues with many divisions such as the OK, and conferences that stretch across large distances. The numbers aren't equal as the proposal stands right now (The number in parentheses after the Region number is the number of schools we think would be in that region.).

Any change in our regions will require a change in our By-Laws which means a vote of the general membership. This could occur next January at the Battle Creek General Membership Meeting.

Is your conference included? Is it in a logical region? Is there a better place for you? If you are independant, are you listed?

2004 Hall of Fame Banquet

A Great Night for High School Football

he MHSFCA 2004 Hall of Fame Banquet was held at the indoor Track Building at the University of Michigan on Saturday, March 27. Twenty-two outstanding coaches were inducted into the Hall of Fame before a crowd of over 500 faithful family, friends and enthusiastic supporters of high school football.

Our current President, Mike Wojda of Alpena, welcomed the inductees stating that, "Our association takes great pleasure in recognizing the inductees for their accomplishments both on and off the field."

Don Lessner, our Executive Director, gave a history of the Hall of Fame and shared information about our future plans. Coach Carr had addressed our Board of Directors meeting on Friday and mentioned that he travels throughout the country and comes into contact with a lot of high school football associations and ours is one of the best and most active. Don Lessner's great leadership has been a major factor in our success.

Our guest speaker and host gave a moving and emotional tribute to the coaches being inducted. Coach Carr again deserves our thanks, not only for providing a forum, for our banquet, but also for being so gracious and accomodating to our Hall of Famers and their families. He is always one of the last to leave the banquet hall after having a photo taken with each Hall of Famer and their families.

The following illustrate the character of the inductees: In answer to the question, "Why coach?" Geof Stewart of Big Rapids said, "Winning is the greatest emotion in sports. Losing is the second greatest emotion. Not having the chance to do either is the worst emotion." Mike Rea of Kingston stated that everyday a football coach steps on the field he has an opportunity to be an educator as well as a coach. A coach's true value and that of the sport is ultimately measured by what was learned rather than what was won. Happiness is not doing what you like, but liking what you do."

Jack Runchey of Rochester Adams in answering the question, "Why coach?" said, "A teacher, one
of the four greatest professions, is what I do, but coaching,
especially football, is one of the most involved, influential and
passionate ingreadients of the educational process. I love being
a football coach." Ted Manning of Schoolcraft added, "You just
can't get those incredulous highs and lows on such a regular
basis in normal life."

Bill Kohn of Adrian summed it all up when he said, "coaching football is one of the best ways to help young men get ready to tackle life. It may be the best taught subject in American schools because we haven't made it easy."

Joe Groh of Decatur spoke for all the coaches when he said, "Coaching has allowed me the pleasure of combining my passion, football, with my profession."

Ed Schroeder of Reeths-Puffer summed up the feelings of coaches, "Through the game of football, I have developed relationships with many of the most cherished people in my
