One for the Record Books!

Win or lose, Clio freshman football coach *Loren Willey* will feel his boys have learned something after tonight's game at Flushing.

That's because his proteges will be on both sides of the field. All of the coaches in the game, from both teams, played high school ball under Willey's guidance. In his 31 year coaching career he has coached at both Clio and Flushing high schools.

"Friday, when we were scouting, some people brought that up," said Willey. "I don't know if it's ever happened before. I know I've never heard of it before. All six of us have that connection."

"It's kind of funny that it would be this game, because both teams are 5-0, too." (Clio won, and went on to a 9-0 record.)

Willey is the head coach for the Clio freshman team, and assistants Bill Hill and Dave Cunninghame were former players. On the Flushing side of the field, Wayne Dinkens played for Willey at Clio, while Mike Bouchard and Ryan Ranger played for Willey at Flushing.

"When you're kind of in the twilight of your career, these are the things that stand out for you," said Willey. "What makes me feel real good is that they've all turned out to be good people."

"I have four sons of former players on the team also. It's been great to see these guys develop, raise families, solve problems and become good people."

Willey said his experiences teaching and coaching have led him to have faith in the future. Despite the bad rap teenagers often get, he said, fortunately they're not all bad.

"I have all the confidence in the world in that generation," said Willey. "There are a lot more good kids out there than there are ones in deep trouble."

When you've coached as long as Willey, you also develop a sense of humor. Willey had to laugh at a joke one of his players made at his expense.

"In our team meeting today one of the kids said to another, 'Is there anyone Coach Will hasn't coached?'" said Willey. "The other kid said, 'Yeah, Moses.'"

Academic All State Players

he Academic All State Committee takes great pride in announcing the tenth MHSFCA Academic All State Football Team and the first Academic All State Football Teams.

Of the 31 students selected to the 1995 team, 18 are ranked first in their class, four are ranked second. Twenty of the 31 had a four point or better grade point average, while the remaining eleven had averages between 3.99 and 3.92. The 31 First Team members also mastered the ACT: one scored a 35, nine scored 33, seven scored 32, two scored 31 and six scored 30. This year's Academic All Staters out-scored our previous *nine years* of award winners in *G.P.A.*, in *class rank* and on the *ACT*. Nice job men, congratulations.
