This summer the Drug Awareness Committee completed the final phase of its resource program when the MHSFCA sponsored its first Leadership Workshop directed to all high school students, athletes, and sponsors in Michigan.

The Leadership Workshop presented a program developed by the Drug Awareness Committee to develop student leaders who will influence their peers to lead healthy, responsible lives. The program stressed that a healthy life-style is important and that the use of chemical substances can result in serious problems for all those involved.

around the state. It included coaches, county health department officials and student assistant program directors. The leaders attending received instruction in alcohol/drug awareness, decision-making skills, communication skills, goal setting, coping with peer pressure, developing a positive self-image, and self-destructive behavior. Each participant was addressed in full-group and then small group settings.

The workshop was opened with a welcoming address by MHSFCA Past President, Jeff Smith (East Lansing). Past President Dan Lauer (Benton Harbor) introduced the keynote speaker, Morley Frazer.

Mr. Frazer challenged the workshop participants to accept the responsibilities of leadership and to carry the message of the workshop back to their schools and communities.

The program was under the direction of workshop staff: Mike Marek (former NFL team consultant and therapist), Tim Fagan (Assistant Principal and Head Wrestling Coach at Lake Orion H.S.), Roz Mermell (District Substance Abuse Prevention Coordinator, Lake Orion Community Schools), Al Dicken (Health Ed. Coordinator and Director, Student Service Center, West Bloomfield H.S.), and Dr. Roy Bergman (Physician, 1984 U.S. Olympic Team).

Participants, coaches and the Drug Awareness Committee all acclaimed the two day program a great success. Evaluations included comments such as: "Great," "Good Program," "Should continue," "Enjoyed the friendship," "I want to return next year," etc. A follow-up contact of schools represented at the workshop is planned in order to determine the effectiveness of partici-

pants in implementing their acquired skills.

"We learned a lot from the initial program," said Chuck Salvano, Drug Awareness Committee Chair. "We're hopeful that the MHSFCA will sponsor the program again next year. We are convinced that the more positive experiences we can give our youth, the better our future, which is in their hands, will be."

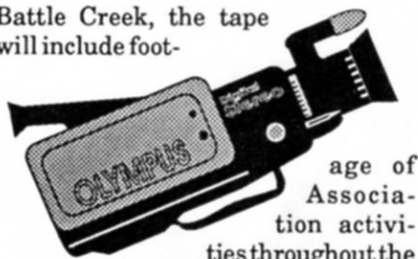

Coach of the Year Clinic Features Johnny Majors

February 22-23, 1991
Grand Rapids Marriott

This year's Toyota Coach of the Year Clinic will be February 22-23, 1991, at the Grand Rapids Marriott Hotel. The featured speaker, University of Tennessee's head coach Johnny Majors, is in his fourteenth year at his alma mater. This coming January, Coach Majors will be President of the American Football Coaches Association. In 1988 Coach Majors was inducted into the National Football Foundation's Hall of Fame.

Coach Major's 1989 Vols were 10-1 and they beat Arkansas in the Cotton Bowl on New Year's Day. Success is nothing new to Johnny Majors, he had been selected conference and national coach of the year at Iowa State and at Pittsburg before coming to Tennessee in 1976. While a senior at Tennessee in 1956, he was named to every All American team; selected as the MVP in the Southeastern Conference, as runner-up to Paul Hornung for the Heisman Trophy, and as the UPI's national back of the year. In high school he scored an unbelievable 565 points while playing for his dad. His record of 150-97-8 as head coach for 22 years ranks him with the best in college football.

In addition to Coach Majors, every attempt will be made to bring the 1990 National Coach of the Year to the Grand Rapids Clinic to join the Nike Coach of the Year. The very best coaches in the nation will be brought to the Grand Rapids Marriott to participate in the nation's best clinic in 1991. You won't want to miss this one! Class "B" schools may nominate two (2) players
Class "C" and "D" schools may nominate 1 player

As in recent years only one player per school may be selected to play in the All Star Game.

There are three reasons for allowing larger schools more nominations

1. Larger schools usually have larger squads.
2. More nominations are made from the East, which has considerably fewer schools but pre dominately more larger schools.
3. The proportion of nominations relative to school population is more balanced. (East and West boundaries were determined by school population, not by number of schools.)

When nominating players for the All Star Game coaches should consider the following guidelines

1. Only nominate players that you feel have the ability to play with the best in the state.
2. A player's character is vitally important. Only nominate players who will reflect positively on your school and on your community.
3. Check with players to be sure that they will play if selected... before nominating them.
4. Do not nominate players who are considering any of the service academies (Army, Air Force, Navy). They will not permit players to play in All Star Games.

If you have a player deserving of this honor please take the time to fill out the nomination form and mail it in before the deadline.
