New Policy Changes Mailing

MHSFCA Newsletter To Be Mailed to High School Principals

A fter discussing the efficacy of its Newsletter mailing policy at two consecutive Meetings, the Board of Directors of the MHSFCA decided to change its policy of addressing a copy of the Newsletter to the school superintendent. This and subsequent Newsletters will be addressed to the high school principal with a request to route the Newsletter to the school's superintendent and Athletic Director.

Several Regional Directors have reported the enthusiasm with which their Principals, Superintendents and AD's have read information about their schools reported in the Newsletter, when they passed their copy to those people.

The intention of the new policy is to achieve wider dissemination of news items that provide good public relations for the high school community — at the high school. Several Regional Directors have reported the enthusiasm with which their principals, superintendents and AD's have read information about their schools reported in the Newsletter — when they passed their copy to those people. They also noted that, particularly in larger districts, addressing the Newsletter to the superintendent was not an effective way of getting the information to the high schools within the district.

Membership in the MHSFCA is not limited to football coaches. Membership in the Association conveys several advantages including the right to nominate: All Star Players, Hall of Fame Membership, Academic All State, Assistant Coach of the Year Awards, Honorary Membership, the ability to counsel timely Scholarship Award applications, and special rates on Lions and Tigers tickets.



Finding the "Hidden Talent"

he tendency sometimes is to determine our starters and spend the majority of time concentrating on them. Because the starters need that time we may neglect the untrained or unmotivated players.

We at Waverly are in the same situation many of you are, we compete with much larger schools that have a larger talent pool to draw from. Therefore, we needed to find ways to maximize the productivity of our athletes. We developed a scout team program with which we've had tremendous success in developing non-starters who lacked the skills or motivation to compete at the high level necessary.

Basically what we did was take the non-starters and

develop scout teams. These scout teams not only know our opponents offense, defense and special teams, but also know and execute our plays at a basic level. This sounds like a lot for the scout team to know but with organization and extra effort it becomes possible. The key is that we treat our scout team players like our starters, giving them constant praise, constructive criticism and having an expectation of excellence. It follows that these scout teams develop a tremendous amount of pride and enthusiasm which leads to very intense and productive practices.

The motivation from our scout team players is the result of our coaching staff constantly emphasizing that they can develop their skills and then show the coaches that they have developed their skills enough to be involved with the starting unit. We also make a special presentation each week to recognize a scout player of the week. A special T-shirt, plaque, or gift certificate can be used for this presentation.

This past year three of our scout team players developed and became starters. We also had four other players who had very specific skills which lead them to be roll players on the starting unit sharing time with a starter.

Our players quickly discovered how important they were to the week's preparation. Even if they did not play a down during that week's game they knew they were a very important part of our successes.

This scout team program helped to bring our team together and show that everyone on our team is important and can contribute to our goals.



For his outstanding accomplishment, Bill has been named "National Coach of the Year" by UPI, Kodak/AFCA, Bear Bryant/FWAA, The Sporting News, Dodge/Maxwell Football Club, and CBS/Chevrolet. Since 1985 his teams have won 50 of 71 games. They are definitely a major force in the Big Eight Conference.

Class AA, A schools may nominate three (3) players Class BB, B schools may nominate two (2) players Class CC, C & DD, D schools may nominate one (1) player

As in recent years only one players per school may be selected to play in the All Star Game.

There are three reasons for allowing larger schools more nominations:

- 1. Larger schools usually have larger squads.
- More nominations are made from the East, which has considerably fewer schools but predominantly more large schools.
- The proportion of nominations relative to school population is more nearly balanced. (East and West boundaries were determined by school population, not by the number of schools.)

When nominating players for the All Star Game coaches should consider the following guidelines:

- Only nominate players that you feel have the ability to play with the best in the state.
- A player's character is vitally important. Only nominate players who will reflect positively on your school and on your community.
- Check with players to be sure that if selected they will play in the game... before nominating them.
- 4. DO NOT NOMINATE PLAYERS WHO ARE CONSIDERING ANY OF THE SERVICE ACADEMIES (ARMY, AIR FORCE, NAVY). THEY WILL NOT PERMIT PLAYING IN ANY ALL STAR GAME.

If you have a player deserving of this honor please take the time to fill out the nomination form included with this Newsletter and mail it before the deadline: DECEMBER 1, 1991!

Special Note: Players selected to participate in the 1992 All Star Game will be required to submit all materials relative to participation (physicals, program materials, information sheets, etc.) by May 1, 1992... OR THEY WILL BE REPLACED BY THE 1st ALTERNATE AT THEIR POSITION.
