MHSAA Representative Council Approves Video Change for Football

Acting on a recommendation of the Football Committee the Representative Council, at its May Meeting, revised the language of Regulation II, Section 14 (A) to allow schools, in football only, to videotape/film games in which they are not participating. Schools wishing to videotape/film for scouting purposes do not need permission in advance. However it is to be understood that press box space will not be routinely available and camera operators should not interfere with the view of spectators attending the game.

In all other sports Regulation II, Section 14(A) prohibits videotaping of contests of non-participation without permission of the participating teams.

1995 Marks 50th Year of Coaching for Jack Hepinstall

ome men are born to coach. Some men become good coaches as they gain experience. Great coaches like Jack Hepinstall are few and far between. The 1995 football season marks a 50 year milestone in the coaching career of Jack Hepinstall. The White Cloud native graduated from Michigan State

College in 1948. His college career was interrupted from 1942 to 1946 as Coach Hep served as a 1st Lieutenant in the U.S. Army. His theater of service included New Guinea, The Phillipines, and mainland Japan.

Coach Hep's coaching career began in Hart, Michigan where he stayed for 11 years. He then moved to Blissfield, Michigan for another 11 year stint. Jack then left Michigan to coach at Western Illinois Laboratory School in Normal, Illinois. While there, his team was named State Champion in its class. In 1972, Coach Hep returned to Michigan as the head coach of the

Hillsdale Hornets. In that season, Jack coached his son Jeff, John Waters, Scott Resseguie and an outstanding group of young men to the Class B state title.

Jack retired from high school coaching after the 1979 season and spent one year as an assistant at the University of Toledo. Since 1981, Coach Hep has been a fixture on Dick Lowry's staff at Hillsdale College. He has been the inside LB's coach for the past 15 years. Many outstate high school coaches are familiar with Jack through his highly successful recruiting for the Chargers.

Coach Hep is a member of the MHFSCA Hall of Fame and has won several conference championships in addition to the two state titles. When asked about his overall record, Coach Hep smiles and says "I think we won more than we lost."

Jack was married to his wife Phyllis for 34 years before she passed away. His son Jack lives in Hillsdale, Jeff lives in Toledo, Susan lives in Jonesville, Michigan, and Amy lives in Baltimore, Maryland. He is kept busy by seven grandchildren.

1995 MHSFCA Leadership Conference



he 5th Annual M.H.S.F.C.A. Leadership Conference was held Friday, July 28th and Saturday, July 29th at Michigan State University, in conjunction with the 1995 All Star football game. It was a resounding success! Approximately 300 student-:leaders from Michigan high schools enjoyed two days of workshops and fellowship.

The theme of the conference this year was "Planning for Success."

The first meetings were 'kicked off' early Friday afternoon by an inspiring presentation given by Coach Bob Dozier, a M.H.S.F.C.A. "Hall of Famer" and football coach at Detroit Mackenzie high school.

The remainder of Friday afternoon was spent with in-depth workshops. One session was led by Pat Milkovich, creator of the "Winners Circle", a program known throughout Michigan high schools. His topic was "Planning for Life-Long Success." Another afternoon session was presented by Ms. Terri Cassels, President and Director of "Cheer! Michigan". Her subject dealt with "Self-Motivation-Integrity-Ethics." The final session of the day found Carter Stevenson "Bringing It All Together". This segment involved Conflict Resolution.



Harley Pierce, Past President of the MHSFCA and longtime historian of the Association, was one of the many volunteer coaches/teachers utilized to facilitate small group discussions during the Leadership Conference.

Carter has worked with the Detroit Public Schools in this subject area.

Our Friday evening conference ended with an ice cream social and movie enjoyed by all.

The highlight of the Leadership Conference was Saturday morning which found approximately 30 high school football coaches leading small group discussion on problem-solving. Each year this portion of the Conference becomes more popular with the students and more meaningful for all coaches involved. At the end of this morning session, lunch was served and students were dismissed to attend the All Star game.

- Do not nominate players who are considering the service academies (Army, Air Force, Navy). They will not permit playing in any all star game.

Players selected to participate in the All Star Game will be required to submit all materials relative to participation (physicals, program materials, information sheets, etc.) by MAY 1, 1996...





HSFCA Regional Directors are expected to make a serious commitment to serve the Association.

Directors are expected to attend each of the four scheduled yearly meetings

of the association: the Fall meeting held in Clare on the 1st Friday after the football championship games; The Winter meeting on the morning of the 1st day of the Winners' Circle Clinic; The Spring meeting on the Friday before the Hall of Fame Banquet; The Summer meeting on the Thursday and Friday prior to the All Star Game.

In addition to the regularly scheduled meetings of the full Board, Regional Directors are obligated to attend the All Star selection meeting in East Lansing in early January, they are expected to attend and help with the administration of the Hall of Fame Banquet, the Leadership Conference and the All Star Game.

Each Regional Director will also be assigned to one or more of the standing committees of the association. Participation in that/those committees may involve additional meetings and will always require the Director's talents.

Article X

The Board of Directors

Section 1

The management of the affairs of the association shall be vested in a Board of Directors which shall consist of two (2) directors from each of sixteen (16) regions, the president, two vice-presidents, and Executive Director, an historian, a chaplin, committee chairmen, and past presidents.

Section 2

The sixteen regions shall correspond with regions one (1) through fifteen (15) of the regional organization plan of the Michigan Education Association. Region sixteen (16) will correspond with MEA regions 16 through 18.

Section 3

Election of directors shall be held at the annual state meeting held at the Coaches Clinic each year.

Section 4

- A. The term of office of a regional director shall be two years: Regions 1, 3, 5, 7, 9, 11, 13, and 15 electing on odd years and regions 2, 4, 6, 8, 10, 12, 14, and 16 electing on even years.
- B. Failure of a region to elect directors at the proper time shall leave that region without such representation until the president recommends for Board approval, a person to fill the vacancy.
- C. Should a member of the Board leave the coaching profession or move to a school in another region, the president shall appoint, upon recommendation of the other director, a temporary director from the region for the remainder of the term.
- D. It is recommended to the president that he instruct the members to seek in their selection of directors, those qualities necessary for future officers as well as men vitally interested in promoting the interest of the association.
- E. To be a director, interested coaches must send letters to the (First Vice President) asking that their names be placed on their regional ballots. The two coaches receiving the highest number of votes will become regional directors.

Section 5

The Board of Directors shall have complete control and management of the affairs, funds, and property of the association.

The Finance Committee of the Board of Directors shall audit, or have audited by an independent firm, the financial records of the association once each year and make a report to the Board.

Section 6

- A. The Board of Directors shall meet at the following times:
 - The spring meeting will be held on the Friday of the weekend of the Hall of Fame Banquet.
 - The summer meeting will be held to coincide with the All Star Game.
 - The fall meeting will be held on the first Friday after the football playoff Final Games in a centrally located city of the state.
 - The winter meeting will be held on the afternoon preceding (or the morning of) the annual clinic.
- B. Expenses and/or mileage will be paid when possible.

Section 7

The Board of Directors shall meet by a call of the president or by a call of the majority of the Board of Directors.
