## Ford Motor City Bowl

## Mid-American Conference Champion vs A Top Twenty Division I Team

(Preferably from the Big Ten Conference)

he Ford Motor City Bowl will be played at the Pontiac Silverdome on Friday, December 26, 1997, starting at 8:00 p.m. The game will feature the Mid-American Conference champ and a top twenty ranked Division I team, preferably from the Big Ten Conference.

Promoters of the Ford Motor City Bowl have offered the Michigan High School Football Coaches Association financial incentives for our help in the distribution of tickets. For each ticket you sell your football program will be reimbursed \$5. In addition, for each ticket the MHSFCA membership sells the Association will receive \$5 designated for the Hall of Fame building project. This could provide a big boost for our building project as well as helping your program if we participate actively!

In order to take advantage of this opportunity we are suggesting, as a goal, that each M.H.S.F.C.A. member sell a minimum of twelve tickets and that head football coaches sell forty tickets through their booster club. The tickets sell for \$27 and \$22.

We need your help. Support of the sale of tickets will benefit your football program and the Hall of Fame building – plus promote football in the State of Michigan. Please make every effort to sell the twelve/forty tickets, or more. If all M.H.S.F.C.A. members from last year and this year sell twelve tickets, our Association would realize approximately \$200,000 for the Hall of Fame building.

Game Date - Saturday, August 1, 1998

(Nomination forms have been mailed separately)

Class AA, A schools may nominate three (3) players
Class BB, B schools may nominate two (2) players
Class CC, C & DD, D schools may nominate one (1) player
\*Only one player per school may be selected to play in the All Star Game.

When nominating players for the All Star Game coaches should consider the following Guidelines:

- Only nominate players that you feel have the ability to play with the best in the state.
- A player's character is vitally important. Only nominate players who will reflect positively on your school and on your community.
- Check with players to be sure that if selected they will play in the game... before nominating them.
- Do not nominate players who are considering the service academies (Army, Air Force, Navy).
   They will not permit playing in any all star game.

If you have a player deserving of this honor please take the time to fill out the nomination form (mailed in a separate package) and return it before: DECEMBER 1, 1997

Players selected to participate in the All Star Game will be required to submit all materials relative to participation (physicals, program materials, information sheets, etc.) by MAY 1, 1998... OR THEY WILL BE REPLACED BY THE 1st ALTERNATE AT THEIR POSITION.




## State of the Association 1997

he Michigan High School Football Coaches Association has worked diligently since its inception in 1972 to promote high school football in our state. The Association, guided by its 32 Regional Directors, Committee Members and Officers, has been successful in many of its efforts over its twenty-five year history:

- We start each year in Battle Creek with our annual coaches clinic, which draws some 1500 coaches and provides the forum for presenting Coach of the Year, Assistant Coach of the Year, Honorary Memberships, Academic All State, and Jim Crowley awards.
- Each year in March, the MHSFCA inducts approximately 24 Michigan High School football coaches who have attained at least 100 victories or coached for at least 20 years into its Hall of Fame during ceremonies at The University of Michigan. The Hall of Fame Banquet also provides the opportunity to select the recipient of the \$1000 Terry Rose (MHSFCA President in 1986) Memorial Scholarship.
- In July/August the All Star game features 88 of the best high school football players produced in the state. It also showcases the winning squads from the Michigan Cheerleading Coaches Association's competition and an All
  - Star Band composed of 300 +/- high school musicians. The All Star camp provides the setting for our annual Leadership Conference, where up to 300 aspiring team leaders come together to hone their skills. In addition the recipients of the ten annual \$500 MHSFCA Scholarships are presented with their awards at the All Star Game.
- One of the original goals of the MHSFCA was the institution a playoff system in Michigan to determine State Champions. We were successful in this goal in 1975 when the first Michigan High School Football playoffs saw post-season competition between four teams in each of the four classes (A, B, C, D). We have continually pressed for improvements in the system which now includes eight teams competing in each of eight classes for the eight championships.
- The MHSFCA is proud to honor Academic achievement by naming Academic All State Teams in each of the eight classes and awarding 24 individuals to Academic All State 1st Team, 24 individuals to Academic All State 2nd Team and deserving individuals to Special Mention Academic Honors
- The MHSFCA is setting out on its most challenging project in its 25 year history as we prepare to finance and build a permanent building to house our Hall of Fame. The NCAA has given its approval. The building site (just to the right of the tunnel going into Michigan Stadium) is firm. Planning of the actual building, in conjunction with University architects, is under way. What remains is no small task to raise the \$1.3-\$1.6 million dollars to build the structure. One way that you can help us in this challenge is to make sure that your school is a Gold Brick member of the Hall of Fame (Check the list starting on page 13). See also the front page about ticket sales for the Ford Motor City Bowl Game.



The Association has approached NIKE as a potential partner in the building of the MHSFCA Hall of Fame. While NIKE has "never done anything like this" we have the attention of at least some of their executives and hope for a response from them "soon."

## What Do They Do?

HSFCA Regional Directors are expected to make a serious commitment to serve the Association.

Directors are expected to attend each of the four scheduled yearly meetings of the association: the Fall meeting held in Clare on the 1st Friday after the

football championship games; The Winter meeting on the morning of the 1st day of the Winners' Circle Clinic; The Spring meeting on the Friday before the Hall of Fame Banquet; The Summer meeting on the Thursday and Friday prior to the All Star Game.

In addition to the regularly scheduled meetings of the full Board, Regional Directors are obligated to attend the All Star selection meeting in East Lansing in early January, they are expected to attend and help with the administration of the Hall of Fame Banquet, the Leadership Conference and the All Star Game.

Each Regional Director will also be assigned to one or more of the standing committees of the association. Participation in that/those committees may involve additional meetings and will always require the Director's talents.

#### Article X

#### The Board of Directors

Section 1

The management of the affairs of the association shall be vested in a Board of Directors which shall consist of two (2) directors from each of sixteen (16) regions, the president, two vice-presidents, and Executive Director, an historian, a chaplin, committee chairmen, and past presidents.

#### Section 2

The sixteen regions shall correspond with regions one (1) through fifteen (15) of the regional organization plan of the Michigan Education Association. Region sixteen (16) will correspond with MEA regions 16 through 18.

#### Section 3

Election of directors shall be held at the annual state meeting held at the Coaches Clinic each year.

#### Section 4

- A. The term of office of a regional director shall be two years: Regions 1, 3, 5, 7, 9, 11, 13, and 15 electing on odd years and regions 2, 4, 6, 8, 10, 12, 14, and 16 electing on even years.
- B. Failure of a region to elect directors at the proper time shall leave that region without such representation until the president recommends for Board approval, a person to fill the vacancy.
- C. Should a member of the Board leave the coaching profession or move to a school in another region, the president shall appoint, upon recommendation of the other director, a temporary director from the region for the remainder of the term.
- D. It is recommended to the president that he instruct the members to seek in their selection of directors, those qualities necessary for future officers as well as men vitally interested in promoting the interest of the association.
- E. To be a director, interested coaches must send letters to the (First Vice President) asking that their names be placed on their regional ballots. The two coaches receiving the highest number of votes will become regional directors.

#### Section 5

The Board of Directors shall have complete control and management of the affairs, funds, and property of the association.

The Finance Committee of the Board of Directors shall audit, or have audited by an independent firm, the financial records of the association once each year and make a report to the Board.

#### Section 6

- A. The Board of Directors shall meet at the following times:
  - The spring meeting will be held on the Friday of the weekend of the Hall of Fame Banquet.

- The summer meeting will be held to coincide with the All Star Game.
- The fall meeting will be held on the first Friday after the football playoff Final Games in a centrally located city of the state.
- The winter meeting will be held on the afternoon preceding (or the morning of) the annual clinic.
- B. Expenses and/or mileage will be paid when possible.
  Section 7

The Board of Directors shall meet by a call of the president or by a call of the majority of the Board of Directors.

he MHSFCA 26th Annual Clinic will be held January 23-24 at McCamly Place in Battle Creek. The Clinic fee is \$50 if you pre-register and \$60 at the door. Our format will remain the same as it has been in recent years. The clinic will be divided into three segments:

I. Friday afternoon mini-sessions with Michigan small college and high school staffs.

II. Friday evening sessions with successful coaches from other states and a main line Division I college coach.

III. Saturday morning "Road to the Dome" session with State Champion coaches from the 1997 season.



Registration will open at 10:00 a.m. on Friday with the first sessions beginning at noon. Some adjustments have been made in the registration procedures which should make the process much more efficient.

## The Hits keep Comin'

n spring a college football coach's fancy turns to hitting. That's because spring practice is the time to sharpen players' blocking and tackling skills.

Full-contact drills are less feasible during the fall, when teams have to be fresh for a game each week.

"There is a lot of teaching to do in the spring," says New Mexico coach Dennis Franchione. "And as a result there is a little more contact."

Just how much more there should be is a matter of contention. According to NCAA statistics, injuries occur at a higher rate in spring football than in any of the 15 other sports studied-including fall football. In spring practice there are 9.8 injuries per 1,000 athlete exposures. (An athlete exposure is defined by the NCAA as "one athlete participating in one practice or game where he or she is exposed to the possibility of athletic injury.") The fall football figure is 6.5. Says Dennis Wilson, director of Auburn's Department of Health and Human Performance and head of the NCAA's competitive safeguard committee: "Our feeling is that you ought to be able to run your off-season program as safely as your in-season program."

With that goal in mind, the NCAA in 1991 reduced the number of spring practice days for Division I-A programs from 20 to 15. Contact practices, in which players block and from Scorecard, May 12, 1997 the safeguard committee proposed cutting contact back further, to five days out of the 15.

The football coaches weren't happy with that proposal, and it was eventually withdrawn at the request of the NCAA council and the conference commissioners, who were loath to force a face-off between the medical and the coaching factions. The safe guard committee plans to come back to the coaches in June with a recommendation to limit the first three days of spring practice to non-contact workouts without helmets or pads. And, while the committee is willing to retain 10 contact days, it likely will seek to abolish the all-but-tackling scrimmages that occur now on the noncontact days. "We fear that football sees us as trying to ruin their sport," says Wilson, "but we're trying not to get out too far ahead of the coaches. We're trying to find common ground."

- All D & DD school is one division (89 schools), then seven divisions of equal numbers of schools.




