"Big Three," Chrysler, Ford and General Motors Join Hands to Present The Motor City Bowl

n an unprecedented sporting event sponsorship, Chrysler, Ford and General Motors have all agreed to share the "presenting sponsorship" of the Motor City Bowl. The big three sponsorship is a four-year agreement through the 2001-02 bowl season.

"The Motor City Bowl enjoys the one bowl location in the country where you have the opportunity for the Big Three to work cooperatively on a singular, high profile sporting event," said Ken Hoffman, MCB Executive Director. "This is the one-and-only Motor City, and that was the original concept a year ago."

The Motor City Bowl will again feature the Mid-American Conference #1 selection against a major "at large" opponent. Tickets are available through Don Lessner, Executive Director of the MHSFCA. Ticket prices are \$32 and \$19.

The game will be played this year on Wednesday, December 23 in the Silver Dome at 8:00 p.m.

"We enjoyed a great first year bowl game between Marshall and Ole' Miss, and with the support of the Big Three we hope to build upon that foundation for an even better bowl this time around" said Ken Hoffman.

MHSAA Playoff Survey Coming

Look for a survey after the end of the season regarding the MHSAA proposal to expand and reorganize the football playoffs (You heard about the plan at the Rules Meetings). The MHSAA hasn't committed details for the changes to writing yet, but the basic plan would be for all schools with six wins or more to be placed into divisions, the largest in the top division, etc. All playoff matchings would be done on "Selection Sunday." With the current plans 256 schools would make the playoffs.



Figures cited at the Summer Board of Directors Meeting (MHSFCA) by Jack Roberts indicated that for the 1997 season 44% of the largest schools would have made it to the playoffs under the new system, whereas only 18% actually made it. 40% of the second division schools would have made it as opposed to the 17% who did, 39% instead of 19% of the next division, and 43% instead of the 38% of the smallest division would make the playoffs.

One of the things the survey will query is whether the new system should go into effect in 1999 or 2000.

What Do They Do?

HSFCA Regional Directors are expected to make a serious commitment to serve the Association.

Directors are expected to attend each of the four scheduled yearly meetings of the association: the Fall meeting held in Clare on the 1st Friday after the football championship games; The Winter meeting on the morning of the 1st day of the Winners' Circle Clinic; The Spring meeting on the Friday before the Hall of Fame Banquet; The Summer meeting on the Thursday and Friday prior to the All Star Game.

In addition to the regularly scheduled meetings of the full Board, Regional Directors are obligated to attend the All Star selection meeting in East Lansing in early January, they are expected to attend and help with the administration of the Hall of Fame Banquet, the Leadership Conference and the All Star Game.

Each Regional Director will also be assigned to one or more of the standing committees of the association. Participation in that/ those committees may involve additional meetings and will always require the Director's talents.

Article X

The Board of Directors

Section 1

The management of the affairs of the association shall be vested in a Board of Directors which shall consist of two (2) directors from each of sixteen (16) regions, the president, two vice-presidents, and Executive Director, an historian, a chaplin, committee chairmen, and past presidents.

Section 2

The sixteen regions shall correspond with regions one (1) through fifteen (15) of the regional organization plan of the Michigan Education Association. Region sixteen (16) will correspond with MEA regions 16 through 18.

Section 3

Election of directors shall be held at the annual state meeting held at the Coaches Clinic each year.

Section 4

- A. The term of office of a regional director shall be two years: Regions 1, 3, 5, 7, 9, 11, 13, and 15 electing on odd years and regions 2, 4, 6, 8, 10, 12, 14, and 16 electing on even years.
- B. Failure of a region to elect directors at the proper time shall leave that region without such representation until the president recommends for Board approval, a person to fill the vacancy.
- C. Should a member of the Board leave the coaching profession or move to a school in another region, the president shall appoint, upon recommendation of the other director, a temporary director from the region for the remainder of the term.
- D. It is recommended to the president that he instruct the members to seek in their selection of directors, those qualities necessary for

- future officers as well as men vitally interested in promoting the interest of the association.
- E. To be a director, interested coaches must send letters to the (First Vice President) asking that their names be placed on their regional ballots. The two coaches receiving the highest number of votes will become regional directors.

Section 5

The Board of Directors shall have complete control and management of the affairs, funds, and property of the association.

The Finance Committee of the Board of Directors shall audit, have audited by an independent firm, the financial records of the association once each year and make a report to the Board.

Section 6

- A. The Board of Directors shall meet at the following times:
 - The spring meeting will be held on the Friday of the weekend of the Hall of Fame Banquet.
 - The summer meeting will be held to coincide with the All Star Game.
 - The fall meeting will be held on the first Friday after the football playoff Final Games in a centrally located city of the state.
 - The winter meeting will be held on the afternoon preceding (or the morning of) the annual clinic.

B. Expenses and/or mileage will be paid when possible.

Section 7

The Board of Directors shall meet by a call of the president or by a call of the majority of the Board of Directors.

Odd numbered MHSFCA Regional Directors will be elected at the Registration/Sign-in for the Winners' Circle Clinic in Battle Creek.



- 3. Check with players to be sure that if selected they will play in the game... before nominating them.
- Do NOT nominate players who are considering the service academies (Army, Air Force, Navy, Coast Guard). The
 academies do not allow cadets to participate in the game.

If you have a player(s) deserving of this honor please take the time to fill out the nomination form (mailed in a separate package) and return it to Larry Rueger before December 1, 1999.

SPECIAL NOTE:

Players selected to play in the All Star Game will be required to submit all materials relative to participation (physicals, program materials, information sheets, etc. by May 1, 1999, or they will be replaced by the first alternate at their position.



Frank Beamer

Coach Beamer's teams have been in five consecutive bowl games. During that period of time his teams have posted a record of 44-16 against some of the best teams in the nation. In 1995 and 1996 his teams posted 10-2 records while winning the Big East Conference Championship. He is a graduate of Virginia Tech and was inducted into their hall of fame in 1997. During his tenure as the head football coach at Murray State, his teams posted a 42-23-2 record.

Cam Cameron

On November 26, 1996, Cam was named the head football coach at the University of Indiana after being an assistant coach at the University of Michigan and with the Washington Redskins. Hired by "Bo" Schembechler, Cam coached at the University of Michigan for ten years. Bobby Knight was instrumental in getting Cam to return to his alma mater as head football coach. The University of Indiana has high expectations and confidence in Cam. He was signed to a seven year contract.

Larry Smith

Larry Smith has 121 wins as a head football coach at Tulane University, The University of Arizona, Southern California and currently at the University of Missouri. He started his college coaching with "Bo" Schembechler at Miami of Ohio and went with "Bo" to the University of Michigan as offensive line coach. He is the only active head coach in college football who has taken four different teams to a bowl game. While at Southern California he won three Pacific 10 Conference championships and his teams posted a school record 19 consecutive wins. He is a real gentleman and Larry is considered one of the best head coaches in the country.

Lloyd Carr

Last year Lloyd was named National Football Coach of the Year. His 1997 team posted a perfect 12-0 record including an impressive Rose Bowl win.
