2010 MHSFCA Scholarships

The MHSFCA sponsors two different scholarships for its members and their students. If you have an athlete or other member of your program who you believe is deserving, please make sure that the proper forms and/or paperwork are completed.

The deadline for scholarship applications is March 1.

Competitive Scholarship

These scholarships are for those outstanding students who are involved in your football programs. There are 10 scholarships awarded statewide. In addition to players this could include managers, statisticians, student trainers, football cheerleaders, or any others that are part of your program. All candidates need to fill out a scholarship form and return it according to the directions. These awards are based on class rank, ACT score, GPA, references, and a student biography. Successful candidates in the past have generally had a GPA of 3.5 or higher and an ACT score of 25 or higher.

If you have such a deserving student please give the application form to them to complete. (*See application form in this Newsletter.*)

Terry Rose Memorial Scholarship

This \$1000 scholarship is available to the children of MHSFCA members. The only requirements are that the son or daughter is planning to attend an institution of higher learning next year and that their parent is a member of the Michigan High School Football Coaches Association. You should send your child's name, your name and address and the name of the high school you are associated with for each child that is eligible. This scholarship is drawn by lottery at the Hall of Fame Banquet in Ann Arbor in the spring.

Duties of Regional Directors

- I. The Board of Directors shalt be responsible for the management of the affairs, funds and property of the association.
- II. Promote membership in his region:
 - A. Secure total membership count for region from the membership Chair at the Spring Meeting, along with the deliquent members' cards.
 - B. Mail letters to delinquent members urging re-enrollment.
- III. Represent the interests of the Association and his region at all Association Meetings in the: Spring, Summer, Fall and Winter.
 - A. At the Spring Meeting, assume the duties relating to the committee assignment(s) made by the President. Be prepared to do whatever is necessary to make the Hall of Fame Banquet a success.
 - B. At the Summer Meetings, continue committee work and bring names of honorary membership for nomination. Be available to help with whatever needs to be done to make the MHSFCA All-Star Game and/or the Leadership Conference successful.
 - C. At the Fall meeting, come prepared with Coach of the Year responsibilities completed.
 - 1. Write a letter of congratulations to any coach from your region receiving a Regional Coach of the Year award
 - 2. Make sure each honored coach is in attendance at the January clinic for his presentation.

- D. Prior to the January meeting, if running for re-election, be sure your name has been properly placed on the ballot. If not seeking re-election, encourage at least two coaches from your region to write to the Executive Director, to have their names placed on the ballot.
- E. At the Winter Meeting, come prepared to assume at least one Clinic responsibility. Bring a gift for a door prize.
- IV. Serve as an active member of whatever committee you were appointed to by the President.
- V. Report to your region all urgent business transacted or discussed as soon as possible. Keep a record of all expenses incurred in such cases of necessary communication and submit to the Executive Director for reimbursement.
- VI. Be ethical in all your football relationships so as to be a model to the coaches in your region.

CBS MaxPreps.com/MHSFCA Community Service Reading Award

he CBS MaxPreps/MHSFCA Community Service Reading Program is a community service project in which high school student athletes are matched-up with elementary teachers and their students. The high school football players sit-in on the elementary classroom one class period per week, at least during the football season and read to the students.

CBS MaxPreps.com has pledged to fund the Community Service Reading Award. The rate of funding to be based on the percentage of Michigan's football programs that regularly participate in the company's free online stats management and communications services. In the 2009 season we exceeded 40% of our teams submitting stats to CBS MaxPreps. This provided us with two \$500 dollar grants for award winning programs. The grants, to the elementary schools that participated in the reading programs are for the purchase of library books.

MHSFCA Scholarship

The Michigan High School Football Coaches Scholarship is intended to reward personal excellence in school and community. Students involved in a football program may apply for this scholarship. The scholarship has a monetary value of \$500. To be considered for this scholarship your head football coach must be a member of the Michigan High School Football Coaches Association. Applicants receive consideration for the scholarship on the basis of: 1. Academic excellence, 2. ACT scores, 3. Demonstrated service to school, community and church, 4. Evidenced leadership ability, 5. Citizenship.

Who is Eligible to Apply?

In order to be considered for a scholarship, a candidate must:

- a. Be a student involved in the football program as a player, cheerleader, manager, trainer or statistician.
- b. Be a student in the graduating class of a high school, who is a citizen of the United States of America and resident of the State of Michigan.
- c. Have outstanding personal character and behavior as a leader in their high school community.
- d. Be a student of outstanding merit, who shows an appreciation of the value of education and is willing to work to achieve success.
- e. Rank in the upper one quarter of their class and have test scores (American College Test, ACT) that indicate academic success.
- f. Have on record a letter of acceptance from an accredited college or university.

What are the Policies of the MHSFCA Scholarship Program?

- a. Must be enrolled as a full time student in an accredited college or university.
- b. Scholarships are for one year only and are not renewable.
- c. The following merit standards will be used:
 - Scholarship and Testing 350 points Leadership & Character 400 points

How Does A Candidate Apply?

- a. Obtain a Standard MHSFCA Scholarship Application Form, available from the MHSFCA Scholarship Chair. In addition to the application form, the following are essential in the order indicated:
 - 1. Statement of not more than 300 words prepared by the candidate summarizing school and out-of-school activities, accomplishments and a statement of the applicant's objective for further education.
 - 2. A transcript of the student's high school educational record from ninth grade through the first semester of their senior year, including class rank, total number of students in their senior class, grade point average, and ACT scores.
 - 3. A comprehensive letter of recommendation covering leadership, character and scholarship from at least three people.

When Must Application be Submitted?

All Applications must be submitted to the MHSFCA Scholarship Committee before March 1 of their senior year.

COD (Change of Direction Training)

When I train my athletes, one of the top things we work on is C.O.D. (change of direction) Training.

Why? Name the sport: football, soccer, hockey, lacrosse - they all rely on explosive change of direction from moment to moment. And training for that change of direction in order to make a great play is critical to success.

Use the set up below with cones 5 yards apart to train your C.O.D. There are 3 different phases that begin at each change of direction. Use the drills below to insert into the set up.

For example: Sprint/sprint/sprint (Sprint from cone A to Cone B, sprint from Cone B to Cone C, and sprint back to Cone A)

Drills:


- sprint/shuffle/backpedal
- shuffle/sprint/shuffle
- sprint/shuffle/sprint
- backpedal/sprint/backpedal
- shuffle/backpedal/sprint
- backpedal/backpedal/sprint

C.O.D. Tips:

- 1. Start from a variety of different stances (2-point, 3-point, square, etc.)
- 2. Keep your arms moving with elbows pumping in and out of turns
- 3. Stay on your power pads (balls of your feet)
- 4. At each change of direction, get your head around and look to the next cone with your eyes
- 5. Add the use of catching, dribbling or throwing a ball when you return to Cone A




