Bob's first teaching and coaching position was at Southgate Aquinas High School where he was a varsity assistant from 1969 to 1971. In the fall of 1972, he began his first head coaching position at Battle Creek Pennfield High School. While coaching at Pennfield, he earned his Master of Arts in Guidance and Counseling from Eastern Michigan University in 1973.

In 1976, Bob was in the Upper Peninsula at Houghton as he began a four year-stint as the offensive coordinator at Michigan Technological University. In 1980, he moved back to the Lower Peninsula and became the head coach at Southgate Aquinas High School. He was a counselor and the head coach at Aquinas through the 1984 season.

In 1985, Bob became head coach at South Lyon High School and remained there for nineteen years; he also served South Lyon Community Schools as its Athletic Director for seven years.

Over the past forty years, Bob has coached wrestling, track and basketball. His football teams have qualified eight times for the playoffs, won three regional titles and made one appearance in the state final. They amassed seven league championships and made two Prep Bowl appearances. Individual honors include six Regional Coach of the Year Awards, one Class A Coach of the Year Award, two Oakland County Coach of the Year awards, Oakland County Athletic Director of the Year, East Coach in the MHSFCA All Star Game and MHSFCA Hall of Fame in 1988. He has served the MHSFCA as a director, chaplain, committee chair, and President. Bob revised the MHSFCA structure, proposed the naming of Academic All State Teams and individuals, and led the finance committee to move monies from savings accounts to conservative investments.

Much like Coach Crowley, our recipient stressed working hard, being dedicated, and having fun. He was a role model to the thousands of young men he has coached throughout his career. He also was a role model to the young coaches who sought his advice, always willing to sit down with them to discuss football or to give them one of life's lessons.

Bob's wife of almost forty years, Mary, and children Lynn, Jim and Mike are extremely proud of what their husband and father has given not only to them but to the countless number of young men whose lives have been touched by "Coach Bob."

Lou started working on athletic fund raising for all sports in Coopersville in the late 70's.





The 37th Annual MHSFCA Football Clinic was held at the McCamly Plaza Hotel in Battle Creek on January 15, 16 and 17. The clinic was attended by a near record number of more than 1500 coaches. This year's clinic featured some format changes that appeared to be excellent additions to the clinic's organizational set-up.

The Annual Awards Banquet was held on Friday evening between the afternoon speakers and the evening Keynote Speakers. The Banquet honors the Coaches of the Year, Special Award Winners and the Crowley Award Winner. The Crowley Award is the most prestigious award given by the Michigan High School Football Coaches Association. It honors those who have made a tremendous impact on high school football in Michigan. The 2009 Crowley award winner was Bob Scheloske. Coach Scheloske's emotional speech was the highlight of the evening as a full house of coaches, family and friends cheered enthusiastically for the award winners.


The clinic began on Thursday evening with presentations by the University of Michigan staff and Coach Rich Rodriguez. The Kellogg Arena was filled with exhibitors both Thursday and Friday. Thursday early registration and having the exhibitors was a welcome addition to the clinic experience. Friday's session began with Ron English, the new Head Football Coach from Eastern Michigan University, as the "Kick Off Speaker." After the first speaker, the clinic kicked into high gear with seven rooms of presentations during the afternoon. Head Coaches Butch Jones, Central Michigan University, Bill Cubit, Western Michigan University and Chuck Martin, Grand Valley State University also gave talks with members of their coaching staffs. The afternoon sessions featured a wide variety of Michigan, Indiana and Wisconsin high school coaches. The Michigan State University staff was featured with offense, defense and strength training presentations. Division III powers Albion College, Alma College and MIAA Champion Trine University were also part of the lineup. Chris Peterson, the Head Football Coach from Boise State University (finalist for the Division I National Coach of the Year) spoke about his methods of building and maintaining a successful program.

Friday night in the Kellogg Arena featured our two Keynote Speakers. Kirk Ferentz, the Head Football Coach at the University of Iowa, started the evening. Mark Dantonio, the Head Football Coach at Michigan State University, was our lead Keynote Speaker and finished the night with an inspirational talk covering a variety of football related topics. The popular coaches' social concluded the evening and as always was very well attended.

Saturday morning featured Craig Rundle, Head Football Coach at Albion College, Jim Cole, Head Football Coach at Alma College and Tim Parker from State Champion Muskegon Oakridge High School.

The Clinic continues to grow as the Clinic Committee strives to make this the best teaching and learning football experience in the country.

Rawlings To Provide MHSAA Playoff Footballs

Beginning with the 2009 season, the MHSAA will welcome Rawlings as the official game ball provider for all levels of its Football Playoffs. The agreement capped a process that began with a November 2007 Audit and Finance Committee request and ended with Representative Council approval on Dec. 5, 2008.

Every football-sponsoring MHSAA member high school will be provided with two Rawlings balls of their choice prior to kick off the 2009 season. Subsequently, two balls will be provided to all playoff qualifiers in 2010, and one ball of each school's choice will be provided to playoff qualifiers in 2011, 2012 and 2013.

MHSAA staff was asked in the fall of 2007 to research policies and procedures of other state high school associations -- as well as the interest of manufacturers -- to supply footballs for the MHSAA Football Playoffs. This topic was discussed by the Audit and Finance Committee again in April 2008, with more information requested.

Findings confirmed that all neighboring high school associations and the majority of other states across the country had endorsed a football, most requiring the use of a particular model or models for all levels of their playoff series; and it was discovered that manufacturers' interest in a football endorsement exceeded their interest in any other sport.

Proposals were requested and submitted throughout the summer and early fall, culminating with Representative Council approval of Rawlings as the official supplier for all MHSAA Football Playoff contests at its Dec. 5 meeting. Any model of Rawlings football that meets National Federation rules may be used by participating teams. Rawlings makes the endorsed football of California (three sections), Kentucky, Maine, Missouri, Montana, New York and Vermont.

Rawlings also provides the official ball for the MHSAA Girls and Boys Basketball Tournament, extending to all levels – Districts through Finals – in 2010 through 2014.



It is our understanding that coaches were not surveyed before the MHSAA made their choice of the Rawlings ball nor was the MHSFCA consulted other than having been told that such an action was being considered.

Baden has been the official ball of the MHSFCA for several years contributing a \$500 scholarship annually and balls for use in the All Star Game.

Rawlings (footballs produced in China) has submitted a proposal to the MHSFCA to become our official ball.

Wilson (balls produced in the US) has also expressed a desire to be our official ball, and has presented a draft proposal.

NATS is the MHSFCA Skills Camp



The National Athletic Testing System (*NATS*) *is a program partnership between the American Football Coaches Association* (*AFCA*) *and officially recognized state high school coaches associations.*

National Athletic Testing System "

The NATS program is in many respects an athletic version of the Scholastic Aptitude Test for high school football players. It is a nationwide standardized athletic performance test that produces results that can be used to track and compare the players' athletic ability and development. NATS is also a means of providing players, parents, coaches and guidance counselors important information and services pertaining to college recruiting, NCAA academic requirements, financial aid and athletic performance analysis and preparation.

Development of NATS began in 2000 when the AFCA organized a task force comprised of college coaches and state high school coaches association representatives to research and develop the NATS program. The task force designed a national athletic testing system and established a standardized athletic test grading formula and player data distribution technology. The task force also developed web-based interactive tracking tools for players (and parents) to help them follow their physical development and academic progress throughout their high school career.

NATS concluded its third and final phase of development in 2004 when six, state high school coaches associations conducted the first NATS Tests. Following the success of these initial NATS

Tests, AFCA approved full implementation of the NATS program.

All players, beginning as early as their freshman year, are invited to participate in NATS. NATS results and player profiles are distributed online to every college football program in the country.
