he 2008 Michigan High School Football Coaches Association Hall of Fame Banquet and Induction was held at the Track & Field Building on the University of Michigan Campus on Saturday, April 19th.

The 26th Annual Induction begins the second quarter century of this annual event which, including this year's inductees, has inducted 601 of the finest high school football coaches in the State of Michigan into the Hall of Fame.

The first induction took place in 1982 with the inaugural class being the original Board of Directors. Each induction has a personality all it's own and

Dealing with Parents • A Round Table Discussion

Coach's present: Phil Witkowski, Shelby High School. Dave Groin, Climax-Scotts High School. Tim Moore, Athens High School. Shane Fullerton, Stockbridge High School. Daryl Cummins, Tekonsha High School.

Reason for round table: Coaches have to deal with parents' expectations. Some are good, many can be negative. I have talked to former coaches that have quit coaching because of parent interaction. Our purpose was to draw up an outline that coaches can turn to as a template to use, or change to fit their program and print as a hand-out to parents at a pre-season meeting.

How can you, as a parent, be part of our program?

- 1. Pregame meals. We will have our pregame meals on the night before the game. You are invited to attend. We will need the help of parents and boosters in preparing, and serving the meals. At the meals, we will announce our scout team player of the week. This player will be the 1st in line to eat. We will also have 2-3 other players talk about what our team means to them and whatever they have on their mind. We will make this an exciting night for the boys and our program.
- **2. Tailgate.** Especially on away game nights, to have a sandwich, and drinks for players after the game.
- **3. Film Night.** Attend an open film night during the week, so all can see and enjoy. This will be a fun night, not a night to teach or talk about players.

What can you do to help the program and your son to achieve success?

- 1. Support the coaching staff even if you don't agree with them. The importance of support is so the kids stay positive, and be team players. A negative parent makes a negative player, and hurts player attitude more than helps. A negative attitude can also cause conflict and affect teaching ability between player and coach. You may not agree with everything we do, but it is important that your child not hear you talk negative. Also, many times a child will tell their parents something, because they think that is what their parent wants to hear.
- **2. Don't coach your son.** That is the job of the coaching staff. When a parent teaches their child one thing and the coaching staff another, the player gets confused. The player has to be able to play within the team scheme.
- **3. Remember, your child is still a kid.** Let them be kids first and enjoy the sport as a high school activity. Sports are part of their education. Many lessons are learned, and used the rest of their lives.
- **4. Don't talk about other players in a negative way.** This hurts TEAM moral more than you think. It teaches a kid to judge, not support their teammates. Remember: The team is bigger than the individual player.
- **5. Success is based on improvement** and work put forth. Not on the win/loss record, or individual stats.
- 6. Be courteous to the officials and opposing players.

What can parents expect from us as coaches?

- 1. To treat all athletes with proper respect.
- **2.** To discipline individuals as a team member: We expect players to adhere to team rules, school rules, Michigan High School Athletic Association rules, and the law.
- 3. To give every athlete a fair chance to play.
- 4 To understand that playing time is earned in practice.
- 5. To understand that lack of playing time does not mean we do not like your child. We do!

Communication

We will talk to you at an appropriate time. We are approachable. We are human. We do ask you to use the 24 hour, cooling down rule, after a game.

- **1.** We will not talk before or after a game. These are times that we have too much on our mind.
- **2. Please make an appointment** for before, or after practice.

Proper things to talk about:

- 1. Your son. What can he do to get more playing time? Not: can he play more, or why is he not playing. Many times there is a reason for lack of playing time that your child will not tell you. (late for practice, girl friend was more important, etc.)
- **2. Concerns about behavior**, with the team, or in his class, or at home.
- 3. Grades.
- **4. We will not talk** about other players or other players parents.
- 5. We will not talk about our football scheme and plays.

If we cannot come up with a solution to your problem, we can set up an appointment involving the head coach, athletic director, and yourself.

Expectations of Players

*Parents should understand what we expect from our players

- **1. To be at all practices.** To practice with an upbeat tempo
- **2. To attend class, and to get appropriate grades** (School comes first)
- 3. To treat other teammates with respect
- 4. To treat teachers and other students with respect
- 5. To learn our offense, and our defense
- 6. To be at all team functions

Expectations - Division 1,2,3 or lower?

- 1. You must understand that not all kids can play at the Division 1 level. You must also understand how many openings are available at the Division 1 level, and how players play high school football. If your son is athletic enough to play at a high level, he will be found.
- 2. College coaches are always looking for players. There are certain ways that they will recruit. They will see a player play, they will contact a high school coach, or they will hear about an athlete. One of the major ways they will see your son is at college football summer camps, and they will watch him play if interested.
- **3. Questions recruiters ask the high school coach:** Is he coachable? Does he cause any problems? Has he had any problems with law enforcement? How are his grades? What is his work ethic? Can he play at our level?

NATS is the MHSFCA Skills Camp



The National Athletic Testing System (NATS) is a partnership between the American Football Coaches Association (AFCA) and officially recognized state high school coaches associations **including the MHSFCA**.

The NATS program is in many respects an athletic version of the Scholastic Aptitude Test for high school football players. It is a nationwide standardized athletic performance test that produces results that can be used to track and compare the players' athletic ability and development. NATS is also, however, a means of providing players, parents, coaches and guidance counselors important information and services pertaining to college recruiting, NCAA academic requirements, financial aid and athletic performance analysis and preparation.

Development of NATS began in 2000 when the AFCA organized a task force comprised of college coaches and state high school coaches association representatives to research and develop the NATS program. The task force designed a national athletic testing system and established a standardized athletic test grading formula and player data distribution technology. The task force also developed web-based interactive tracking tools for players (and parents) to help them follow their physical development and academic progress throughout their high school career.

NATS concluded its third and final phase of development in 2004 when six state high school coaches associations conducted the first NATS Tests. Following the success of these

initial NATS Tests, AFCA approved full implementation of the NATS program.

All players, beginning in their freshman year, are invited to participate NATS. NATS results and player profiles are distributed online to every college football program in the country.
