Birth of the MHSFCA and Football Playoffs

n early March 1972 I received a call from "Dutch" Schrotenboer. He asked me to go to a meeting with him in East Lansing. He told me that a group of football coaches from around the state were attempting to form a state football coaches association. That meeting took place on Friday, March 24th, at East Lansing High School. The MHSFCA was officially founded and eight objectives were established. I would like to share four of those objectives with you.



- 1. To work for the betterment and growth of football in Michigan.
- 2. To promote the highest possible professional standards in football coaching.
- 3. To promote and protect the best possible conditions for the total development of the young men for whom we as football coaches are responsible.
- 4. To cooperate with the state athletic office for the betterment of football in the State of Michigan.

The top item on the agenda of the new MHSFCA was to work to establish a state football playoff.

In 1972 football was the only sport sponsored by the Michigan High School Athletic Association (MHSAA) that did not have a playoff. When I left that meeting I knew that I wanted to be a part of the MHSFCA and when I took the head football job in Harrison I immediately asked to have my name put on the ballot to be a regional director and I was fortunate to get elected.

In 1972 the new association put together a plan to hold their first annual clinic at Jackson Parkside High School. Their plan was to feature high school coaches as the main speakers rather then college coaches. The Association also presented their first MHSFCA Coach of the Year awards. The first Board of Director's election also took place at that clinic. The Association also kept working on a playoff system. The first president of the MHSFCA was David Driscoll the head football coach at Jackson Park Side High School and he was the only president to serve two terms. I should mention that the first eight clinics were held at high schools because the Association did not have enough money to be able to host it at a hotel.

In 1973 the Board of Directors established Honorary Membership awards and they were presented for the first time at the 1974 clinic. This is one of the most important honors we give because we all have people in our communities that donate their time and talent to our programs and they deserve to be recognized.

The main focus of the Association was a football playoff and that was something the MHSAA was not very interested in. As our Association attempted to convince the MHSAA that a playoff would be well attended and pay for itself the MHSAA still remained reluctant. Finally we convinced the MHSAA to send a representative to one of our Board of Directors meeting so we could present our side of the of the playoff issue. The only answer we got as to why we couldn't have a playoff was that football was special.

The main issue remained playoffs.

In the early years of the Association our Summer meeting was held at the Remington Hunt Club outside of Alpena. One year, just before the meeting was to begin, Curt Smith showed up. I recognized him because he had been a teammate of mine on the Flint Junior College baseball team. I asked him why he was there and he said he was the sports caster at the Alpena television station and that he had heard we were meeting here and that he would like to cover the meeting and report on it on his late sports report. President Driscoll gave him permission so he set up his camera and went to work. During the playoff discussion Dutch Schrotenboer mentioned that while he was in Lansing to discuss a possible playoff with the MHSAA, the hockey coaches were there attempting to get sanctioned as an MHSAA sport and that they had brought a lawyer with them. He said, "I have since heard that hockey is now an MHSAA sport." Jokingly, one of the Directors said maybe we should try litigation to get a playoff. That night when Curt Smith did his sports report in Alpena he said "It looks like theMHSFCA is going to use litigation to get a playoff." That word spread across the state and it was not long until the MHSFCA and the MHSAA were working on a playoff system.

Together the MHSFCA and MHSAA put together a point system to determine what teams would qualify

for the playoffs. Statistics were kept in 1973 to determine who would qualify if a playoff was held and to work out any problems that were found in the system. A meeting was held at the 1974 clinic and the results were announced. Attending that meeting was Coach George Ihler from Saginaw Arthur Hill High School. His 1973 team had just won the Saginaw Valley League championship and the mythical class A state title with a 9 and 0 record. His team had scored 443 points during the season and been un-scored on. He was quite upset when he found out that 9 and 0 East Lansing High School, and not his team, would have qualified for the playoff under the new system. A heated discussion began and finally President Schrotenboer said, "Coach did you ever stop and think that maybe you didn't have the best team." His point being, that is why we need a playoff system.

In 1974 the official paper playoff was held and the first actual playoff took place in 1975. In 1975 the state was divided into four regions and one team in class A, B, C and D were chosen from each region. With only four teams in each class in the playoffs the tournament began with the semi-final round. In 1975 Hudson High School set the national record for consecutive wins when they beat Kalamazoo Hackett High School in the semi-final round. The next week in the first Class C final game, held at Perry Shorts Stadium on the campus of Central Michigan University, Hudson's 72 game winning streak was snapped when they were defeated by Ishpeming. In 1976 Hudson again went 9 and 0 in the regular season but didn't have enough points to qualify for the tournament. Since that time the tournament has been expanded several times and as you know we now have 256 teams in the tournament.


with no thanks needed, to make this an exceptional evening for the inductees, their families and friends. Without them, this evening would not be the outstanding evening that it is.

- If you have a camp and require a certificate of insurance naming an Additional Insured the cost is \$300.00.
