

### **Recruiting Fairs and Recruiting Seminars**

Recruiting fairs and seminars offered to student athletes and their parents throughout Michigan are designed to improve the recruiting process for our athletes. The events will allow college coaches to efficiently evaluate more athletes in more schools. In a three-hour night, high school and college coaches can discuss multiple prospects. Each school will be charged \$25.00 (schools are still saving money considering the cost to mail out 40 tapes) to. These events will take place throughout our state in the first week of December in conjunction with the beginning of recruiting.

**Recruiting Fair:** How it works: For \$25 (Covers the cost of printed material, postage and handouts for the seminars and saves you postage for mailing all those materials) each high school coach will be assigned a table. Coaches bring: tapes/DVD's to hand out to each college, prospect bio's on all juniors and seniors, and your calendar. Division 1 coaches need to find junior prospects for the spring recruiting season and the other Division coaches are looking for seniors. College coaches will have the opportunity to visit with each coach, discuss your prospects, and to schedule visits at your school.

**Recruiting Seminar:** This educational seminar will explain that to play in college requires a four-year high school effort and the importance of their high school transcript. Coaches are strongly encouraged to invite their 8th-10th graders. Our athletes and their parents need to understand the first question a college recruiter will ask any prospect is their GPA (See *The 740 Day Club*). Seniors should attend the seminar in order to meet Division III coaches. Juniors will get valuable information about preparing for summer camps and can talk with Allen Trieu of Scout.com.

**When and Where \*HELP!:** Dates and areas have been set to synchronize with the college recruiting schedule. Two fairs are scheuled for each date. We need high schools interested in hosting three of the events. Each host school needs: 1. A location for the recruiting fair (usually a cafeteria), 2. A place for the seminar (usually an auditorium). 3. An area for Division III coaches to set up their recruiting tables.

### Enlist Your Student-Athletes in "The 740 Club"

from Michigan Association of School Administrators Fall Newsletter 2007 Every year a countless number of high school senior athletes wish for another chance to play. These are the players I remember looking back as a college football recruiter. These student-athletes didn't truly understand becoming a college recruit was a four-year process approximately 740 days. Most remember hearing about a "Clearinghouse thing" and hearing their coaches and counselors talking about grades but that's as far as it went. They just felt recruiting was all about their abilities to play the game.

We all know the often short-sighted, invincible attitude of adolescents. The student-athletes are part of what I call the "restart generation." These student-athletes, like their peers, have grown up in the video game era where they can create and control all aspects of the game. If the game is not going like he or she wishes, simply hit the reset and start over again. This "restart" attitude has carried over into every aspect of students' lives and for a large number of them this attitude is hurting their future.

Start Early With Strong Messages: It is critical we educate the student-athletes and the parents in the beginning of their freshmen year. They need to understand becoming a college recruit is a four year process and every 740 days of school will count. The high school transcript is the one piece of paper that will tabulate every one of these days. A transcript is the student-athlete's resume to college athletics. This "resume" can determine if an athlete will be a college recruit. The first question asked by every recruiter is "What is the player's GPA and class rank?" The higher ones GPA and class rank, the greater the number of athletic opportunities will be made available to you. The lower the GPA and class rank, the fewer opportunities will be available.

Use the dream of college athletics along with the NCAA Division I academic standards for all young student-athletes. College recruiting is not just for the D1, blue-chip athlete. These athletes are the elites and the minority of college recruiting. Academic progress starts the first day of every athlete's freshman year. A player's abilities for the different levels of college will not be determined until their junior and senior years. The majority of D3 athletes cannot afford the tuition unless they have the opportunity to earn academic scholarships to help defray the cost of private education. (Remember, most D3 schools are private and all are non-athletic scholarship).

Encourage Dreams, Promote High Standards: We need to educate all educators to all kids to dream of college athletics. In order to achieve their dream, the NCAA Clearinghouse Academic Standards WILL is the motivational tool they need to fulfill their academics. There isn't a negative consequence if a student athlete dreams and prepares to become a college athlete. If they understand how to build a transcript that would afford them numerous opportunities, schools would have an increased number of graduates qualified for college admissions.

The NCAA academic standards can be a motivational tool for all young athletes. Instill these young athletes with the importance of their GPA, explain how the sliding scale works, emphasis how poor school attendance may have a negative impact on any possible recruitment, etc. It is critical to start with freshman and even 8th graders. Waiting until their junior year may be too late for most. Our job as educators is to ensure the student-athlete understands how to qualify for college recruitment every step of the way.

Implementing this approach can be a powerful motivational tool for high school student-athletes. High school is a time and place for our students to dream and dream big. For student-athletes, the dream of college athletics can be the force that pushes 8th, 9th and 10th grades to academic success. College recruiters would hear less about the problems the athletes had in the 9th grade and these athletes wouldn't have to learn there isn't a "reset" button for your high school transcripts. In the end, this approach will simply produce senior student-athletes with a "resume" to become a college student.

### **Duties of Regional Directors**

  - C. At the Fall meeting, come prepared with Coach of the Year responsibilities completed.
    - 1. Write a letter of congratulations to any coach from your region receiving a Regional Coach of the Year award
    - 2. Make sure each honored coach is in attendance at the January clinic for his presentation.

- D. Prior to the January meeting, if running for re-election, be sure your name has been properly placed on the ballot. If not seeking re-election, encourage at least two coaches from your region to write to the Executive Director, to have their names placed on the ballot.
- E. At the Winter Meeting, come prepared to assume at least one Clinic responsibility. Bring a gift for a door prize.
- IV. Serve as an active member of whatever committee you were appointed to by the President.
- V. Report to your region all urgent business transacted or discussed as soon as possible. Keep a record of all expenses incurred in such cases of necessary communication and submit to the Executive Director for reimbursement.
- VI. Be ethical in all your football relationships so as to be a model to the coaches in your region.


